
YES, It's Hazmat!

Whether you ship hazardous materials once or twice a year, or every day, the hazards of that material are the same. Whether you carry a hazmat load down the street or across the country, regulations apply. Whether you are shipping a barely regulated amount, or a container-load, the Hazardous Materials Regulations, found in Title 49 of the Code of Federal Regulations (49 CFR, Parts 171-180), can not be ignored.

Every employee who may affect the safety of hazardous materials in transportation is a hazmat employee, and must be trained. Classification, packaging, marking, labeling, and placarding requirements may be in force even for what seem like "small" or "minor" shipments. Before you ship or carry hazmat, make sure your operations are in compliance with the hazardous materials regulations.


