UNANIMOUS CONSENT AGREEMENT

H.J. RES. 20 (ORDER NO. 18)

Ordered, That at 2:15 p.m. on Tuesday, February 13, 2007, the Senate resume consideration of H.J. Res. 20, an Act making further continuing appropriations for fiscal year 2007, and for other purposes, and that the time until 2:30 p.m., be equally divided and controlled by the two Leaders or their designees.

Ordered further, That at 2:30 p.m., the Senate proceed to a vote on the motion to invoke cloture on the measure.

Ordered, That Senators have until 2:30 p.m. on Monday, February 12, 2007, to file first degree amendments and until 12 noon on Tuesday, February 13, 2007, to file second degree amendments.

Ordered further, That relative to the cloture motion filed on the resolution, the mandatory quorum required under Rule XXII be waived. (*Feb. 7, 12, 2007.*)
