The deceased was a 56-year old customer truck driver. arrived at the mine loading area at

6:25 am. At 6:40 am, two mine employees found lying beside his truck,

unresponsive. The North Carolina Certificate of Death lists the cause of death as "cardiac arrest." Based on the Death Certificate, the committee members concluded that died of natural causes and his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
