In a unanimous decision the Fatality Review Committee has determined that the death of should not be charged to the mining industry. The deceased, a 19 year old trespasser, was found dead 800 ft. underground in a mine atmosphere of less than 5% oxygen. It appears that and his 41 year old father dug a hole through an earth seal at an abandoned and sealed mine for purposes of theft and were overcome by the irrespirable atmosphere. The members of committee felt that this death should not be chargeable since the deceased was a trespasser involved in illegal activity at an abandoned and sealed property at the time of this incident.
