The autopsy report states that died of diabetic ketoacidosis occurring in the context of methamphetamine intoxication. The report also states that the manner of death was accident, noting that: "This drug (methamphetamine) would have induced a stress response in the decedent that would have greatly exacerbated hyperglycemia and increased the likelihood of fatality."

Based on the Autopsy Report and the results of MSHA's investigation, the committee members concluded that died from a drug overdose unrelated to his employment and his death should not be charged to the mining industry.
