DEPARTMENT OF COMMERCE REPORT ON ACTIONS TAKEN **PURSUANT TO**SECTION 906(a)(l) OF THE **TRADE** SANCTIONS REFORM AND EXPORT ENHANCEMENT ACT **OF** 2000

Section 906(b) of the Trade Sanctions Reform and Export Enhancement Act of 2000 (TSRA) (Title IX of Pub. L. 106-387), enacted on October 28, 2000, requires that the appropriate federal government agency submit a quarterly report to the Congress on any activities undertaken pursuant to Section 906(a)(l) during the most recent calendar quarter. The Department of Commerce's Bureau of Industry and Security (BIS) is submitting this report covering the Bureau's licensing activity relating to exports of agricultural commodities to Cuba for the most recent calendar quarter, April-June 2002.

For the reporting period, BIS received 49 notifications under License Exception Agricultural Commodities (AGR), which were processed in an average of 12 business days and all of which were approved. In addition, BIS processed 11 export license applications to Cuba during the reporting period. These applications were processed in an average of 25 business days.
