- Conduct examinations
- Issue, deny, or defer certificates

Examinations conducted – 442,498



Designation Requirements

- Read, write, speak, and understand English
- Unrestricted license to practice medicine
 MD's and DO's
- Engaged in practice of medicine



Conditions of Designation

- Competent to perform examinations
- Knowledgeable of FAA rules
- Personally conduct examinations
- Comply with training
- Electronically transmit examinations



Training Requirements

- Initial 5-day seminar
- Every 3 years following designation
 - 3-day seminar
 - Computer-based training



Termination of Designation

- Failure to perform examinations
- Disregard of rules
- Failure to comply with training
- Unprofessional office



Termination of Designation

- Violation of law
- Loss of licensure
- Failure to transmit examinations
- Careless reporting
