DES MOINES, IOWA - In recognition of the renaming of the Des Moines Federal Building to the Neal Smith Federal Building, the U.S. General Services Administration and the Iowa Congressional Delegation is hosting a ceremony at the building on Saturday, May 24, at 2:30 p.m.

The Des Moines Federal Building was constructed in 1967 and first dedicated in 1968. A dominant fixture on the downtown Des Moines skyline, the building makes a strong statement as a symbol of our federal government in Iowa.

The building has now been officially renamed the Neal Smith Federal Building (FMR Bulletin PBS-2008-B5). Former Congressman Smith was a member of the U.S. House of Representatives from 1959 until 1995.
