### **“Signs, Signs, Everywhere There's Signs”**

**Signs are a part of the American culture and especially within the mining industry. The mining industry utilizes signs to communicate various health hazards from noise to chemical hazards. The main purpose of a sign is to communicate but due to their abundance they can be ignored or overlooked.**

#### **Best Practices:**

- Signs should say what they mean and mean what they say
- Containers should be properly labeled with the appropriate information
- Signs should be visible to the user both night and day
- Signs should be maintained, concise, and removed when not needed
- A sign's language should be appropriate for the users
- Signs and labels should be legible
- Be careful not to saturate a mine site with too many signs
