A National Dialogue

The Governor of Alabama, and the U.S. Departments of Defense, Labor and Veterans Affairs, in response to the need for increased national collaboration among assistance networks, are hosting a national dialogue to highlight the issues, programs, and best practices employed at federal, state and community levels to assure the recovery and return to success of transitioning wounded, injured and disabled service members **and their families.**

Closing the gaps

In 2004, the U.S. Department of Labor formally established a gateway program for employment and transition assistance called the Recovery & Employment Assistance Lifelines (REALifelines) program. The first state partnership initiative (Operation Grateful Heart) was launched that same year by the State of Alabama. In 2005, the Department of Defense established an operational center for these and other efforts at the Military Severely Injured Center.

These collaborative efforts and model programs are but a small part of a surge of national initiatives and organizations seeking to assure the success of returning service members and their families. This Summit is the beginning of a national dialogue to close the gaps between federal, state, local and private initiatives, to capture best practices, and to improve the lives and opportunities for our nation's returning heroes.
