



# clinical

va schedules program supports health care acquisitions community

Delegated to the Department of Veterans Affairs by the General Services Administration over 30 years ago, the VA's Federal Supply Schedule Service is responsible for establishing, soliciting, awarding, and administering the VA's Federal Supply Schedule Program. In addition to four newly developed Schedules, the service manages nine active schedules encompassing such products as pharmaceuticals; medical equipment and supplies; dental supplies; X-ray equipment and supplies (including medical and dental X-ray film); patient mobility devices (including wheelchairs, scooters, walkers, etc.); antiseptic skin cleansers, detergents and soaps; in-vitro diagnostics, reagents, test kits and sets; and cost-per-test clinical and laboratory analyzers and medical laboratory testing and analysis.

## **Expanding Horizons**

In response to the growing need for affordable and flexible medical services among agencies such as the Veterans Healthcare Administration (VHA), DoD, Indian Health Services, and the Federal Prisons Bureau, the National Acquisition Center of the Department of Veterans Affairs, located in Hines, Illinois, is currently broadening the offering for clinical services and professional medical health care. The establishment of Federal Supply Schedule 621 I, Professional Medical Healthcare Services, has paved the way for these new contracting initiatives.

### Medical Laboratory Testing and Analysis - Services Schedule 621 II

A newly developed program known as "reference labs." This program is listed in GSA e-Library, and will soon have a published open solicitation available for customers to utilize vendors offering these services.

#### Home Infusion Therapy Services - Schedule 621 III

Home infusion therapy involves the administration of medications using intravenous, subcutaneous, and epidural routes (into the bloodstream, under the skin, and into the membranes surrounding the spinal cord). New service contract awards are planned for November 2004.

Forthcoming solicitations include Drug Returns/Reverse Distribution (Schedule 621 IV) and Tele-Radiology (Schedule 621 V).

# Drug Returns/Reverse Distribution

The purpose of Pharmaceutical Drug Returns/Reverse Distribution is to alleviate pharmacies from the often laborious regulatory compliance requirements associated with the handling and processing of expired pharmaceutical items while recouping a portion of previously expended dollars. The advantage of having these services procured by the National Acquisition Center is the expertise and experience the staff has with healthcare vendors and industry.


#### Tele-radiology


Tele-radiology, covered under Schedule 621 IV, is a natural expansion for the VA National Acquisition Center's offerings. The Department of Veterans Affairs, as well as other government agencies, are required to perform interpretation of radiology studies. There are numerous private industry suppliers who are either currently providing these services or could potentially provide them to government agencies. This type of service offered on Schedule allows Federal X-ray laboratory directors a choice of vendors as well as the flexibility to take advantage of each provider's strengths, using a vehicle where prices have already been determined to be fair and reasonable.

There are a total of over 1,400 contracts in place for the various commodity groups managed under the VA's Federal Supply Schedule Service. Annual sales against these contracts exceed \$6 billion. All Federal Supply Schedule contracts are multiple award, indefinite delivery-indefinite quantity type, and are national in scope, with performance periods established up to five years in length. These contracts are available for use by all government agencies including but not limited to VA Medical Centers, Department of Defense, Bureau of Prisons, Indian Health Services, Public Health Services, and some State Veterans Homes.

# gsa multiple award schedule contracts... making it easy to stay in compliance

here are plenty of good reasons why Federal agencies choose to use the GSA Multiple Award Schedules (MAS) program. Flexibility, choice, and best value are just a few. Most of all, however, the MAS program is built around requirements of the Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) to help you ensure your procurement complies with Federal laws and regulations.

The MAS program provides you the contract vehicle to purchase a vast array of products and services directly from commercial vendors while leveraging the buying power of the Federal government. Procurement professionals from agencies around the world use the MAS program to help them accomplish their mission. Here are a few reasons why they choose the MAS program.

# 1. When you use Multiple Award Schedules, you comply with Federal regulations.

When orders are placed against a GSA Multiple Award Schedule (MAS) contract, using the procedures under Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 8.4, they are considered to be issued using full and open competition (see FAR 6.102(d)(3)). Ordering offices need not seek further competition, synopsize the requirement, make a separate determination of fair and reasonable pricing, or consider small business programs. By placing an order against a GSA Schedule contract using the procedures in this section, the ordering office has concluded that the order represents the best value and results in the lowest overall cost alternative (considering price, special features, administrative costs, etc.) to meet the government's needs.

MAS users are asked to pay special attention to the ordering procedures for services requiring a statement of work and how they differ from the ordering procedures for products and services that do not require a statement of work (see FAR 8.404(b)). Both sets of procedures are designed to simplify the acquisition process.

- · For orders of services and/or products up to the micropurchase threshold: Place the order with any Schedule contractor.
- For orders above the micro-purchase threshold but below the maximum order threshold: Services Requiring a Statement of Work: Prepare a request for quotes that includes the statement of work; transmit the request to at least three Schedule contractors; evaluate responses; and make a best value selection.

Products and Services That Do Not Require a Statement of Work: Review the GSAAdvantage!® online shopping service or at least three Schedule contractors' pricelists; evaluate; and make a best value selection.

For orders above the maximum order threshold: Services Requiring a Statement of Work: Follow the same procedures for orders above the micro-purchase threshold, except transmit the request for quotes to additional Schedule contractors; seek price reductions; evaluate responses; and make a best value selection.

Products and Services That Do Not Require a Statement of Work: Follow the same procedures for orders above the micropurchase threshold, except review additional Schedule contractors' pricelists or use the GSAAdvantage!® online shopping service; seek price reductions; evaluate; and make a best value selection.

Note: For orders of services exceeding \$100,000 using *Department of Defense (DoD) funds*, the Defense Federal Acquisition Regulation Supplement (DFARS) has been amended in Section 208.404 to implement Section 803 of the National Defense Authorization Act for Fiscal Year 2002 (Public Law 107-107). DoD offices and non-DoD activities placing orders on behalf of DoD should refer to DFARS 208.404 and 208.404-70 for additional information regarding ordering procedures and documentation requirements.

# 2. GSA contracts help you meet socioeconomic goals.

In November 1997, agencies for the first time could include orders placed against Federal Supply Schedules in their annual small business goals and accomplishments. Beginning June 2000, agencies also can include orders placed with 8(a) MAS contractors toward their small business program procurement goals as awards made pursuant to the provisions of section 8(a) of the Small Business Act. Contractors' small business status and 8(a) status will be identified in the Schedules e-Library and GSAAdvantage.

# 3. GSA Multiple Award Schedules help you get the best price for the government.

GSA's goal is to be the best value supplier of choice.

Multiple Award Schedule (MAS) contracts offer "most favored customer" pricing/discounts. Quantity discounts may also be available. With the elimination of maximum order limitations, and the implementation of maximum order thresholds, contractors may now accept "any size" orders. In accordance with Federal Acquisition Regulation (FAR) 8.404(b)(3), the maximum order threshold represents the point where it is advantageous for customers to seek price reductions. In fact, for orders exceeding this threshold, after a customer reviews additional Schedule contractors' pricelists or GSAAdvantage!®, the FAR, as well as the Ordering Procedures for Services (Requiring a Statement of Work), instructs the customer to generally seek price reductions from Schedule contractor(s) appearing to provide the best value (considering price and other factors).

For orders for services, GSA has determined that the prices for services contained in the contractor's pricelist applicable to this Schedule are considered fair and reasonable. However, the ordering office using this contract is responsible for considering the level of effort and mix of labor proposed to perform a specific task being ordered to make a determination that the total firm-fixed or ceiling price is fair and reasonable.

Agencies are encouraged and empowered to seek price reductions, not only for orders over the maximum order threshold, but also when circumstances warrant, for orders below this amount in order to ensure that when using the MAS contract, they receive the best value at the lowest overall cost.

# 4. You can order Multiple Award Schedule items electronically by using GSA*Advantage!*®

The GSAAdvantage!® online shopping and ordering system includes services and products under all of the GSA Multiple Award Schedules. With nearly 3.2 million services and products currently available, electronic ordering through GSAAdvantage!® allows a customer to send an order directly to the Schedule contractor, creating a direct customer-contractor relationship. For services that require a statement of work, simply create the order through your agency's internal system, and then consider GSA's electronic quote system, e-Buy, to fulfill the requirement.

# GSA Multiple Award Schedule contractors accept governmentwide commercial purchase card for payment.

Acceptance of the governmentwide commercial purchase card is a strongly encouraged payment method. Schedule contractors are required to accept the purchase card for payments equal to or less than the micro-purchase threshold. Schedule contractors are also encouraged to accept the card for dollar amounts above this threshold.

# 6. GSA provides free training on the use of its contracts.

GSA provides free online and one-to-one training. The FSS Center for Acquisition Excellence is available free of charge 24 hours a day, 7 days a week, and provides customers with online training and the latest GSA Schedules information. Several self-paced courses are available to help you learn how to gain access to vendors, reduce the acquisition cycle time, and purchase quality services and products at the best possible prices.
