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
## Overview

- Metro West CERT was established in September of 2003 through a Board initiated project.
- In September & October of 2003 56 citizens were trained.
- The main focus for the implementation of CERT was to:
  - Increase our communities level of preparedness
  - Provide a way for residents to become more involved in a pre and post disaster environment.

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#### Fire / Rescue and EMS But that is not all...

- We are a large suburban Fire Protection District that needs our citizens to help when the catastrophic incident impacts us.
- No agency can take care of everything alone.
- The Organization asked, "what can citizen volunteers do to help us". The answers have proven to be innumerable and extremely beneficial.



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## New problems, New tactics

- 9/11 made emergency officials think about how we were involving our communities in their preparedness.
- Metro West Board Members realized that it is our responsibility to provide a method for citizens to become better prepared.
- To achieve this CERT training was implemented as the main adult preparedness program in the Metro West Fire District jurisdiction.



#### Empowering Employees both Paid and Volunteer

- The Board of Directors feel that it is critical to empower those responsible for Citizen Corps Council Activities with access to training, funding and necessary resources with limited restrictions.
- Volunteers with power can accomplish great things for the Citizen Corps initiative.

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
# Local Program

- Metro West CERT
  - Outstanding response with simple marketing in 2003-2005
  - As simple marketing started to become more challenging we moved to faith based groups for captured larger audiences.
- Volunteers from 2003 courses were appointed to new leadership positions.

## Success brings friends...

- Neighboring emergency service agencies became interested as their citizens discussed this training with friends and colleagues.
- The Citizen Corps Council concept was implemented for our area.
  - We now have nine jurisdictions for a majority of St.
    Louis County covered by the Meramec Valley
    Citizens Corps Council.



#### How do we fund these programs?

- Grant Funding Success
  - State CERT and Citizen Corps Council Grants were obtained for Metro West and it's Citizen Corps Council Partners
  - Private clubs such as Rotary, JC's and others began to donate to make the program a success.
  - <u>Urban Area Security Initiative and Federal Homeland</u> Security funding has overtaken this initiative for our area.



#### Volunteers Making the Difference

- Over 700 volunteers make each of the upcoming courses successful.
- Leadership volunteers are responsible for more than just stuff you don't want to do.
- There energy for helping is tremendous.
- They have skills that are sometimes hard to find in the emergency services field.



# Making a Regional Impact

- As Councils were established it was determined that to create consistency we should volunteer to create a working group to:
  - Make sure that continuing education training was available to every graduate
  - Help with large scale refresher exercises
  - Continue to assist startup councils and programs



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## Another Layer in the System

- The Gateway Citizen Corps Coalition was established to address these issues.
  - The Coalition is made up of volunteer program managers from each of the geographical areas covered by our UASI Region.
  - They have been responsible for the funneling of \$275k in the 2006 UASI funding and have proposed \$900k for 2007.



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# Making the System Work

- Trust them when you give them the responsibility.
- Clearly define their role, responsibility and authority.
- Provide them with the tools necessary to accomplish your goals.
- Reap the rewards.

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# Bringing it together when seconds count...

- Information gatherers
  - Accurate, reliable & timely
- Integrate volunteers during disaster response will make the difference. You choose the outcome.
- 110 Paramedic / Firefighters, 5 stations, 57 ½ square miles 140,000 residents...trained and prepared residents are critical.



#### Experiences

- Hurricane Katrina, National and Local Responses
  - Volunteers Deployed to Gulf Coast.
  - Thousands of Volunteers prepared three mass intake and housing shelters for displaced residents.
  - Thousands of Spontaneous Unaffiliated Volunteers wanted to help.
  - Phone bank for sudden influx of calls related to assistance.
- July 2006 Storms / Power Failures
- January 2007 Ice Storms / Power Failures



## Summary

- Volunteers are critical to the stabilization of a disaster response.
- Volunteers WILL show up. Citizen Corps Councils and CERT provide you with knowledge about them and them about how they can become prepared to help with the time comes.
- Trained Volunteers have been used successfully to help maintain, grow and manage Councils and CERT Teams.
