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## Characteristics of the Low-Income Population: 1970

This report presents social and economic statistics for the population of the United States below the low-income level<sup>1</sup> in 1970, based on the March 1971 Current Population Survey. The detailed tables include data on geographic distribution; race and ethnic origin, family status, size of family, education, employment status, work experience, occupation, income (including type and source), and income deficit. Where available, data are presented for whites and Negroes separately. Though the majority of the detailed tables pertain to families and unrelated individuals, selected tables are also presented for persons. A description of the low-income population in 1970 and some analysis of changes in the composition of the low-income population over the past year and since 1959 are included.

This is the third Census Bureau report to present detailed data based on the poverty definition adopted as the official government standard in 1969 (see Definitions and Explanations, page 19, for a detailed description of this definition). The tables presented in this report are similar to those found in Current Population Reports, Series P-60, No. 76, "24 MILLION AMERICANS--Poverty in the United States: 1969," though several new items such as data on ethnic origin and labor union membership have been added. The tables found in the first report presenting detailed data for the low-income population, Current Population Reports, Series P-60, No. 68, "Poverty in the United States: 1959 to 1968," are less comprehensive than those found in this report or in P-60, No. 76, since they were presented for a 10-year period. The table on page III provides a comparison between the tables contained in this report and corresponding data for previous years presented in the two reports mentioned above.

In 1970, there were about 25.5 million persons below the low-income level, comprising approximately 13 percent of the United States population (table A). Between 1959 and 1970, the low-income

<sup>1</sup>Families and unrelated individuals are classified as being above or below the low-income level, using the poverty index adopted by a Federal Inter-agency Committee in 1969. This index is based on a sliding scale of income, adjusted for such factors as family size, sex and age of the family head, the number of children, and farm-nonfarm residence. In order to keep the poverty standard constant over time, the thresholds are updated annually based on changes in the Consumer Price Index. The low-income threshold for a nonfarm family of four was \$3,968 in 1970, \$3,743 in 1969, and \$2,973 in 1959. See page 19 for a detailed description of the poverty definition used in this report. In the text of this report, the terms "poverty" and "low-income" are used interchangeably.

population decreased by about 14 million, or 35 percent. While there were several annual periods with no significant change in the number of poor persons during the early 1960's (table 1), the increase in the poverty population of 1.2 million, or about 5.1 percent, between 1969 and 1970 represented the only statistically significant annual increase since 1959, the earliest year for which comparable data are available.

About 5 million families and 5 million unrelated individuals (i.e., persons not living with relatives) were below the low-income level in 1970. The number of low-income unrelated individuals did not change significantly between either 1959 and 1969 or 1969 and 1970. Families below the low-income level decreased by 3.4 million between 1959 and 1969, but increased by about 260,000 over the past year.

The sex of the family head continues to be an important factor in the composition of the low-income population. Families headed by women comprised about 37 percent of all low-income families in 1970 as compared with 23 percent in 1959. The proportionate increase in families headed by women is largely due to a 3.1 million decrease in the number of low-income families headed by men during this period, in conjunction with no change in the number of low-income families headed by women.<sup>2</sup> While the number of persons in low-income households with a female head increased by about 740,000 between 1969 and 1970, there was no significant change in the number of poor persons who were either members of families with a male head or male unrelated individuals. In 1970, 46 percent of all poor children under 18 years were in families with a woman as head, as contrasted with 24 percent in 1959. Among low-income unrelated individuals about seven out of 10 were women in both 1959 and 1970.

One out of 10 families and about one of three unrelated individuals had incomes below the low-income level in 1970. The poverty rate for families headed by women was about 33 percent compared to 7 percent for families headed by men.

<sup>2</sup>The proportionate increases within the poverty population of certain subgroups, including families with a female head, may be to some extent attributable to the low-income definition itself. This definition is based on a fixed standard, updated annually based on changes in the Consumer Price Index. Because real money income has risen in the past at a faster rate than the Consumer Price Index, subgroups dependent on fixed incomes or in jobs which provide limited upward mobility have become proportionately larger segments of the poverty population.

For unrelated individuals, the corresponding figures were about 38 percent for women and 24 percent for men.

Although white persons continued to make up over two-thirds of all poor persons, Negroes remained overrepresented in the poverty ranks. Thirty percent of low-income persons were Negroes in 1970, compared to about 9 percent of persons above the low-income level (table B). Negroes represented a larger proportion of the low-income population in 1970 than in 1959. Since 1959 the number of poor whites has decreased by about 39 percent as compared to a 27 percent decrease for Negroes. There is some statistical evidence that the number of whites below the low-

income level increased from 16.7 million to 17.5 million between 1969 and 1970. However, the apparent increase in the number of Negroes between 1969 and 1970 (from 7.2 million to 7.6 million) was not statistically significant.

Data on ethnic origin by low-income status first became available from the March 1971 Current Population Survey. Persons who identified themselves as of Spanish origin represented about 9 percent of the low-income population, but only 4 percent of those persons above the low-income level in 1970. About one of four persons of Spanish origin was below the low-income level in 1970, as compared to one out of 10 whites and one of three Negroes. The poverty rates for both

whites and Negroes have declined substantially since 1959, when over one-half of all Negroes and close to one-fifth of white persons were poor.

**Age composition.** Children<sup>3</sup> and the aged represented larger proportions of persons below than above the low-income level in 1970 (table C). Children under 14 years comprised about one-third and aged persons (i.e., 65 years and over) approximately one-fifth of the low-income population. The majority (58 percent) of the aged

poor were unrelated persons and another 25 percent were family heads.

The age composition of family heads and unrelated individuals varied considerably by sex and low-income status in 1970. About 29 percent of male family heads below the low-income level were aged, compared to about 12 percent of those above the low-income level. Conversely, the aged represented about one in ten low-income female heads but one in five female heads above the low-income level. Among male family heads, the poverty rate was highest for the aged (about 16 percent); for female family heads, the poverty rate was highest for those under 25 years (about 60 percent).



About two-fifths of the male and three-fifths of the female unrelated individuals below the low-income level in 1970 were aged. The poverty rates for these groups were relatively high (about 39 percent for males and 50 percent for females). Those under 25 years of age comprised a larger proportion of low-income male than female unrelated individuals (26 percent compared to 11 percent, respectively).

**Geographic distribution.** Between 1959 and 1970, the proportion of poor families living in metropolitan areas has increased while the proportion of nonpoor families living in such areas has decreased slightly. However, low-income families in 1970 were still not as heavily concentrated in metropolitan areas as were families above the low-income level. In 1959, about 42 percent of all low-income families lived in metropolitan areas, increasing to 51 percent in 1970 (table D). For families above the low-income level, the proportion living in such areas decreased from about 68 percent in 1959 to 66 percent in 1970. Similarly, the proportion of low-income families living in the central cities of metropolitan areas increased during the same period from 25 percent to 30 percent, while the proportion for families above the low-income level decreased from 34 percent to 28 percent.

In 1959, 18 percent of families below the low-income level lived on farms, as compared to about 5 percent of families above the low-income level. By 1970, these figures had decreased to 8 percent for poor families and 4 percent for nonpoor families. The poverty rate for farm families was considerably larger than that for nonfarm families in 1970 (19 percent compared to 10 percent).

Low-income families in 1959 were about equally distributed between the South and the remainder of the country--but by 1970, 54 percent lived in the North and West. About 71 percent of nonpoor families lived in the North and West in 1970, compared to 75 percent in 1959. Slightly less than two-thirds of low-income families in the North and West lived in metropolitan areas in 1970, while in the South about 36 percent lived in such areas. Unrelated individuals below the low-income level in 1970 were more concentrated in metropolitan areas and outside the South than were low-income families. About 64 percent of all low-income individuals lived in metropolitan areas in 1970 and 40 percent in central cities.

**Family size and composition.** The average size of family was about the same (3.9 persons) for low-income families headed by either a man or woman in 1970. The average size of family for those above the low-income level was smaller than that for comparable families below

the low-income level for families with either a male or female head. For low-income white families, the average size was 3.6 persons compared with 4.7 for Negroes (table E).

The proportion of poor families composed of only two persons did not differ greatly from the comparable proportion for nonpoor families (37 percent and 35 percent, respectively). However, about 48 percent of the two-person families below the low-income level were headed by an aged person, compared to 29 percent of such families above the low-income level. A larger proportion of low-income families headed by men than those headed by women had two persons. Similarly, a larger proportion of white than Negro families below the low-income level were composed of two persons. About 41 percent of low-income families headed by men and 31 percent of those headed by women were of this size. For whites, 43 percent of the families below the low-income level were composed of only two persons, as compared with 25 percent of low-income Negro families. White families made up about 81 percent of low-income families of this size.

About 14 percent of all poor families had seven or more persons as compared to 5 percent of nonpoor families. Large families comprised about 11 percent of low-income white families but 21 percent of Negro families below the low-income level. The poverty rates for these large families were 18 percent for those headed by men and 65 percent for those headed by women. In contrast, the corresponding poverty rates for two-person families were 9 percent and 22 percent, respectively.

Two of every five children below the low income level were in families with seven persons or more, compared with one of every five children in families above the low-income level in 1970. The distribution of low-income children by family size varied considerably by the sex and race of the family head. For example, about 63 percent of the children in Negro families with a man as head were in families with seven persons or more, compared with 35 percent of the children in those families headed by women. For children in low-income white families, the comparable figures were 45 percent and 19 percent, respectively.

**Educational attainment.** In contrast to their counterparts above the low-income level, the distribution in 1970 of low-income family heads and unrelated individuals by years of school completed leaned towards low educational attainment (table F). About one-half of the low-income family heads had completed less than 1 year of high school, and almost three-fourths (73 percent) did not finish high school. The comparable figures for family heads above the low-income level were about 23 percent and 40 percent, respectively.

The picture was much the same for unrelated individuals, with about 74 percent of those below the low-income level not completing high school, as compared to 42 percent of the unrelated individuals above the low-income level.

Family heads with 4 or more years of college represented about 3 percent of those below the low-income level, but 15 percent of those above the low-income level. For unrelated individuals the comparable figures were about 5 percent and 18 percent, respectively.

For both family heads and unrelated individuals, the percent below the low-income level tended to vary inversely with years of school completed. For example, about one-fourth of family heads with less than 8 years of school were below the low-income level in 1970, compared to only about 2 percent of those with 4 or more years of college. For unrelated indi-

viduals, the comparable rates were much higher (about 57 percent and 12 percent, respectively), but the same relationship between poverty rate and educational attainment existed.

**Employment status of family heads.** During the past decade there has been a decline in the proportion of male family heads below the low-income level who were in the labor market, while the proportion for female family heads has remained constant. In March 1971, about 57 percent of low-income male heads were in the civilian labor force, compared to 69 percent in March 1960 (table G). For low-income female heads of families, about one-third were in the labor force in both years.

The poverty rate for unemployed family heads was considerably higher than that for employed heads. About 12 percent of unemployed male heads were below the low-income level in 1970,

compared to 5 percent of employed heads of families. For female heads, the comparable figures were much higher, 47 percent and 19 percent, respectively.

**Work experience of family heads.** Approximately 62 percent of low-income male family heads and 43 percent of poor female heads worked at some time during 1970 (table G). This difference between the sexes primarily reflects the inability of female heads to leave their family responsibilities to find work. Sixty-eight percent of low-income female heads who did not work in 1970 gave family and home responsibilities as their main reason for not working.

About 1.1 million families, comprising one-fifth of all families below the low-income level in 1970, were headed by year-round full-time workers. Year-round full-time workers represented about 37 percent of the low-income family heads who worked. The comparable figure for low-income male heads was about 45 percent and 18 percent for females.

Of the low-income male heads who did not work in 1970, about 61 percent were aged, and another 26 percent were ill or disabled. For female family heads below the low-income level, those who did not work because of family respon-

sibilities, illness, or disability comprised about 91 percent of all those who did not work.

**Occupation of family heads.** The jobs of poor family heads who worked in 1970 were heavily concentrated in those occupational groups which are low-skilled or low-paying. About 22 percent of low-income male family heads were employed as service workers or nonfarm laborers (table G). One out of four low-income male heads who worked in 1970 was employed as a farm worker. Although the poverty rate for farm workers has decreased considerably since 1959 when it was about 53 percent, it was still the highest of any male occupational group in 1970. About 14 percent of the low-income male heads of families worked as craftsmen as compared to 22 percent of male family heads above the low-income level. Operatives comprised about the same proportion (18 percent) of male heads below and above the low-income level.

The proportion of low-income male family heads who were managers or proprietors increased from about 7 percent in 1959 to 12 percent in 1970, while the proportion who were farm workers decreased from about 36 percent in 1959 to 25 percent in 1970. These changes, along with a slight increase in the proportion of poor professionals, were the only significant shifts in the occupational distribution for poor male heads during the past decade.

About one-half of low-income female family heads who worked in 1970 were employed as service workers, compared to about 23 percent of those above the low-income level. These proportions were about the same in 1959 as in 1970 for female family heads both below and above the low-income level. About 56 percent of the female heads who worked as private household workers and 34 percent of those in other service work had incomes below the low-income level in 1970. White collar workers comprised about 57 percent of

female heads above but only 22 percent of those below the low-income level. There has been little significant change between 1959 and 1970 in the occupational distribution of female family heads below the low-income level.

**Type of Income.** About two-thirds of the families below the low-income level in 1970 had some income from earnings (table H). However, earnings accounted for only about one-half of the

aggregate incomes of poor families.<sup>4</sup> In contrast, about 94 percent of families above the low-income level had income from earnings, accounting for about 89 percent of their total aggregate income.

While about two-thirds of families, both above and below the low-income level, had income other than earnings, there were significant differences

in the type of other income received. The largest categories of other income for low-income families were Social Security payments and public assistance. Social Security income was received by about 30 percent of all poor families. About the same proportion of all poor families received income from public assistance. These sources, combined, comprised about 40 percent of the aggregate income of low-income families. The largest single source of other income for families above the low-income level was dividends, interest, and rental income. About 45 percent of the families above, but only 13 percent of those below the low-income level received income of this type in 1970.

Low-income families with a male head received about 59 percent of their income from earnings, compared to about 32 percent of poor families headed by a woman. The largest single source of other income for low-income families headed by men was Social Security benefits. For poor families headed by women, public assistance income made up not only the majority (64 percent) of their total unearned income, but about 43 percent of their total aggregate income.

Poor families represented about 10 percent of all families in 1970, but received only about 2 percent of the aggregate income for families (table I). Low-income families with farm self-employment income comprised 16 percent of all families with such income, but earned a fraction of 1 percent of the total aggregate of farm self-

employment income. About one-half of all families with public assistance income did not receive sufficient amounts to raise their total incomes above the low-income level.

**Income deficit.** The low-income definition used in this report is based on total money income received during the calendar year. The difference between the low-income threshold and the amount of income received by low-income families and unrelated individuals is thus the amount which would be required to raise their incomes above the poverty line.

The average income deficit for all poor families in 1970 was \$1,420 (table J). About 15 percent of poor families with a man as head and 9 percent of those with a woman as head required

less than \$250 additional income to raise their total incomes in 1970 above the low-income level. About one-fourth of families below the low-income level had a deficit of \$2,000 or more. The proportion of poor families with income deficits of \$2,000 or more was larger for families headed by women than for those headed by men (32 percent and 23 percent, respectively). While the average income deficit was greater for Negro families than for whites (\$1,620 and \$1,340, respectively), the deficit per family member was about the same for families of both racial groups. This is in part accounted for by differences in family size between white and Negro families.

For unrelated individuals, the average deficit in 1970 was about \$810. About 17 percent of these persons required less than \$250 to raise their

incomes above the low-income level. The average deficit for Negro unrelated individuals was about \$110 greater than that for whites.

It would have taken about 11.4 billion dollars to raise the incomes in 1970 of all poor families and unrelated individuals above the low-income level (table K). In terms of 1970 dollars, this figure represents about a 7 percent increase in the aggregate income deficit since 1969, but a decrease of about 37 percent since 1959. White persons accounted for about 71 percent of the total deficit in 1970. Families with a female head accounted for about 20 percent of the income deficit for white persons and 46 percent of the deficit for persons of Negro and other races. Unrelated individuals represented about one-fifth of all poor persons in 1970, but accounted for

about 35 percent of the total income deficit of the low-income population. About two-fifths of the deficit for whites and one-fourth of the deficit for persons of Negro and other races was attributable to unrelated individuals in 1970.

Persons between 100 and 125 percent of the low-income level. In 1970, there were 2.2 million families and 1.3 million unrelated individuals, comprising a total of 10.2 million persons, with incomes which fell between 100 percent and 125 percent of their respective low-income thresholds (table L). Households with incomes slightly above the low-income level (near-poor) are of particular interest because a slight reduction in their incomes, unemployment, illness, change in family size, or some other factor, could drop these households below the low-income level.

The near-poor represented about four percent of all families and eight percent of all unrelated individuals in 1970. Adding their numbers to the low-income population would raise the number of low-income persons to 35.8 million, a 40 percent increase, and would raise the poverty rate for persons to about 18 percent.

The characteristics of near-poor families, with regard to sex and race of head, were intermediate between those of low-income families and families with incomes above 125 percent of the low-income level. For example, in 1970 about 20 percent of near-poor families were headed by women, compared to 37 percent of low-income families and 8 percent of families above 125 percent of the low-income level. Families of Negro and other races represented about 20 percent of the near-poor, but 29 percent of the poor and 8 percent of families above 125 percent of the low-income level. There was, however, a higher incidence of aged family heads among near-poor families than among either low-income families or families above 125 percent of the low-income level. About 27 percent of the near-poor families had an aged head in 1970, compared to about 22 percent for low-income families and 12 percent of families above 125 percent of the low-income level.

The number of near-poor persons decreased by about one-third overall between 1959 and 1970. However, the number of near-poor persons of Negro and other races did not change significantly during this period, and the number of near-poor persons who were in families with a female head or were female unrelated individuals increased by about 80 percent.

## Definitions and Explanations

Population coverage. This report excludes inmates of institutions and unrelated individuals under 14 years old. It includes only those members of the Armed Forces living off post or with their families on post.

Farm-nonfarm residence. The farm population refers to rural residents living on farms. The method of determining farm-nonfarm residence in the present survey is the same as that used in the 1960 and 1970 censuses and in the Current Population Surveys since 1960, but differs from that used in earlier surveys and censuses. According to the current definitions, the farm population consists of all persons living in rural territory on places of less than 10 acres yielding agricultural products which sold for \$250 or more in the previous year, or on places of 10 acres or more yielding agricultural products which sold for \$50 or more in the previous year. Rural persons in institutions, motels, and tourist camps, and those living on rented places where no land is used for farming are not classified as farm population. The nonfarm population, as the term is used here, comprises persons living in urban areas and rural persons not on farms.

Metropolitan-nonmetropolitan residence. The population residing in standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) constitutes the metropolitan population. Except in New England, an SMSA is a county or group of contiguous counties which contains at least one city of 50,000 inhabitants or more, or "twin cities" with a combined population of at least 50,000. In addition to the county or counties containing such a city or cities, contiguous counties are included in an SMSA if, according to certain criteria, they are essentially metropolitan in character and are socially and economically integrated with the central city. In New England, SMSA's consist of towns and cities, rather than counties. The metropolitan population in this report is based on SMSA's as defined in the 1960 census and does not include any subsequent additions or changes.

Central cities. The population inside SMSA's is further classified as "inside central cities" and "outside central cities." With a few exceptions, central cities are determined according to the following criteria:

1. The largest city in an SMSA is always a central city.
2. One or two additional cities may be secondary central cities on the basis and in the order of the following criteria:
  - a. The additional city or cities have at least 250,000 inhabitants.

- b. The additional city or cities have a population of one-third or more of that of the largest city and a minimum population of 25,000.

Geographic regions. The four major regions of the United States for which data are presented in this report represent groups of States, as follows:

Northeast: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont.

North Central: Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, Wisconsin.

South: Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia.

West: Arizona, Colorado, California, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming, Alaska, and Hawaii.

North and West: Northeast, North Central, and West regions combined.

Income. For each person 14 years old and over in the sample, questions were asked on the amount of money income received in the preceding calendar year from each of the following sources: (1) Money wages or salary; (2) net income from nonfarm self-employment; (3) net income from farm self-employment; (4) Social Security; (5) dividends, interest (on savings or bonds), income from estates or trusts or net rental income; (6) public assistance or welfare payments; (7) unemployment compensation, government employee pensions, or veterans' payments; (8) private pensions, annuities, alimony, regular contributions from persons not living in this household, net royalties, and other periodic income.

The amounts received represent income before deductions for personal taxes, Social Security, bonds, etc. When an indefinite amount was reported by the respondent, a specific value was assigned during processing wherever possible. If the indefinite amount was reported in terms of a range, the midpoint of the range was assigned, e.g., \$10,000 to \$15,000 was coded as \$12,500. Open-ended amounts were converted to designated specific amounts, e.g., over \$10,000 was coded as \$16,000.

It should be noted that although the income statistics refer to receipts during the preceding year the characteristics of the person, such as age, labor force status, etc., and the composition of

families refer to the time of the survey. The income of the family does not include amounts received by persons who were members of the family during all or part of the income year if these persons no longer resided with the family at the time of enumeration. On the other hand, family income includes amounts reported by related persons who did not reside with the family during the income year but who were members of the family at the time of enumeration.

Data on consumer income collected by the Bureau of the Census cover money income (exclusive of certain money receipts such as capital gains) prior to deductions for taxes. The fact that many farm families receive part of their income in the form of rent-free housing and goods produced and consumed on the farm, rather than in money, should be taken into consideration in comparing the income of farm and nonfarm residents. It should be noted that nonmoney incomes are also received by some nonfarm residents. They often take the form of business expense accounts, use of business transportation and facilities, full or partial compensation by business for medical and educational expenses, etc. In analyzing size distributions of income, it should be recognized that capital gains tend to be concentrated among higher income units.

Money wages or salary is total money earnings received for work performed as an employee during the income year. It includes wages, salary, Armed Forces pay, commissions, tips, piece-rate payments, and cash bonuses earned, before deductions were made for taxes, bonds, pensions, union dues, etc.

Net income from nonfarm self-employment is net money income (gross receipts minus expenses) from one's own business, professional enterprise, or partnership. Gross receipts include the value of all goods sold and services rendered. Expenses include costs of goods purchased, rent, heat, light, power, depreciation charges, wages and salaries paid, business taxes (not personal income taxes), etc. The value of salable merchandise consumed by the proprietors of retail stores is not included as part of net income.

Net income from farm self-employment is net money income (gross receipts minus operating expenses) from the operation of a farm by a person on his own account, as an owner, renter, or sharecropper. Gross receipts include the value of all products sold, government crop loans, money received from the rental of farm equipment to others, and incidental receipts from the sale of wood, sand, gravel, etc. Operating expenses in-

clude cost of feed, fertilizer, seed, and other farming supplies, cash wages paid to farmhands, depreciation charges, cash rent, interest on farm mortgages, farm building repairs, farm taxes (not State and Federal income taxes), etc. The value of fuel, food, or other farm products used for family living is not included as part of net income. In general, inventory changes were not considered in determining net income; however, replies based on income tax returns of other official records do reflect inventory changes.

Social Security includes Social Security pensions and survivors' benefits, and permanent disability insurance payments made by the Social Security Administration prior to deductions for medical insurance and railroad retirement insurance checks from the U.S. Government.

Dividends, interest (on savings or bonds), income from estates or trusts, net rental income or net royalties include dividends from stockholdings or membership in associations, interest on savings or bonds, periodic receipts from estates or trust funds, net income from rental of a house, store, or other property to others, and receipts from boarders or lodgers, and net royalties.

Public assistance or welfare payments include public assistance payments such as old-age assistance, aid to families with dependent children, and aid to the blind or totally disabled. Separate payments received for hospital or other medical care (vendor payments) are excluded from this item.

Unemployment compensation, government employee pensions, or veterans' payments include: (1) Unemployment compensation received from government unemployment insurance agencies or private companies during periods of unemployment and any strike benefits received from union funds; (2) government employee pensions received from retirement pensions paid by Federal, State, county, or other governmental agencies to former employees (including members of the Armed Forces) or their survivors; (3) money paid periodically by the Veterans' Administration to disabled members of the Armed Forces or to survivors of deceased veterans, subsistence allowances paid to veterans for education and on-the-job training, as well as so-called "refunds" paid to ex-servicemen as GI insurance premiums; also includes (4) workmen's compensation received periodically from public or private insurance companies for injuries incurred at work. The cost of this insurance must have been paid by the employer and not by the person.

Private pensions, annuities, alimony, regular contributions from persons not living in the household, and other periodic income include the following types of income: (1) Private pensions or retirement benefits paid to a retired person or his survivors by a former employer or by a union, either directly or through an insurance company; (2) periodic receipts from annuities or insurance; (3) alimony and child support; (4) contributions received periodically from persons not living in the household; and (5) other periodic income such as military family allotments, net gambling winnings, and other kinds of periodic income other than earnings.

Receipts not counted as income. Receipts from the following sources were not included as income: (1) Money received from the sale of property, such as stocks, bonds, a house, or a car (unless the person was engaged in the business of selling such property, in which case the net proceeds would be counted as income from self-employment); (2) withdrawals of bank deposits; (3) money borrowed; (4) tax refunds; (5) gifts; and (6) lump sum inheritances or insurance payments.

All sources of income may be combined into two major types:

Total money earnings--the algebraic sum of money wages or salary and net income from farm and nonfarm self-employment; and

Income other than earnings--the algebraic sum of all sources of money income except wages and salaries and income from self-employment.

Total money income. The algebraic sum of money wages and salaries, net income from self-employment, and income other than earnings represents total money income. The total income of a family is the algebraic sum of the amounts received by all income recipients in the family.

The income tables for families and unrelated individuals include in the lowest income group (under \$1,000) those that were classified as having no income in the income year and those reporting a loss in net income from farm and nonfarm self-employment or in rental income. Many of these were living on income "in kind," savings, or gifts; or were newly constituted families, unrelated individuals who had recently left families, or families in which the sole breadwinner had recently died or had left the household. However, many of the families and unrelated individuals who reported no income probably had some money income which was not recorded in the survey.

Median income. The median income is the amount which divides the distribution into two

equal groups, one having incomes above the median, and the other having incomes below the median.

Mean income. The mean income is the amount obtained by dividing the total income of a group by the number of families or unrelated individuals (as appropriate) in that group.

Income per family member. The income per family member is the average amount of income available to every man, woman, and child in a family. Income per family member is derived by dividing the total family income of a group by the number of family members in the same group.

Comparability of Current Population Survey income data with data from Office of Business Economics personal income series. The income data presented in this report are not directly comparable with estimates of aggregate personal income prepared by the Office of Business Economics of the Department of Commerce (OBE). The lack of correspondence stems from the following differences in definition and coverage:

Income definition. The personal income series includes, among other items, the following types of nonmoney income which are not included in the census definition: Wages received in kind, the value of food and fuel produced and consumed on farms, the net rental value of owner-occupied homes, the property income received by mutual life insurance companies, and the value of the services to persons without the assessment of specific charges. These items of income in kind account for about 4 percent of total personal income. The Census Bureau definition of income, on the other hand, includes such items as regular contributions for support received from persons who do not reside in the same living quarters, and income received from roomers and boarders residing in households, which are not included in the personal income series. These items, however, represent a much smaller income total than the nonmoney items included in personal income.

Source of data. The personal income series is estimated largely on the basis of data derived from business and governmental sources. These sources include the industrial and population censuses, employers' wage reports under the Social Security programs, and records of disbursements to individuals by governmental agencies. The income data presented in the census reports, on the other hand, are based directly on field surveys of households. As discussed in the section "Source and reliability of the estimates," income data obtained in household interviews are subject to various types of reporting errors which tend to produce an understatement of income. It is estimated that the

income surveys conducted by the Bureau of the Census during the past few years have obtained about 89 percent of the comparable aggregate total money income, 97 percent of the comparable aggregate money wage or salary income, 82 percent of the comparable aggregate money Social Security income and 75 percent of the comparable aggregate money public assistance income included in the personal income series prepared by the OBE. Comparable estimates are not available for the low-income population.

**Low-income (Poverty) Definition.** Low-income statistics presented in this report are based on a definition developed by the Social Security Administration in 1964 and revised by a Federal Interagency Committee in 1969.

Statistics presented in Census Bureau reports prior to publication of *Current Population Reports*, Series P-60, No. 68, "Poverty in the United States, 1959 to 1968," were based on the poverty index developed by the Social Security Administration (SSA) in 1964. This index provided a range of income cutoffs adjusted by such factors as family size, sex of the family head, number of children under 18 years old, and farm-nonfarm residence. At the core of this definition of poverty was a nutritionally adequate food plan ("economy" plan) designed by the Department of Agriculture for "emergency or temporary use when funds are low." The SSA poverty cutoffs also took into account differences in the cost of living between farm and nonfarm families. Annual revisions of these cutoffs were based on price changes of the items in the economy food budget.

As a result of deliberations of a Federal Interagency Committee in 1969, the following two modifications to the original SSA definition of poverty were recommended: (1) that the SSA thresholds for nonfarm families be retained for the base year 1963, but that annual adjustments in the levels be based on changes in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) rather than on changes in the cost of food included in the economy food plan; and (2) that the farm thresholds be raised from 70 to 85 percent of the corresponding nonfarm levels. The combined impact of these two modifications resulted in an increase of 360,000 poor families and 1.6 million poor persons in 1967. The reasons for making these changes are outlined below.

**Change in cost of living adjustment.** Annual revisions of the SSA poverty thresholds were based only on the average per capita cost of the foods in the economy food budget. This method of updating these cutoffs did not fully reflect increases in the overall cost of living during the 1960's. The pace at which the general cost of living

advanced in recent years was not uniformly matched by increases in the price of goods in the economy food plan. Thus, general price changes since 1959 were not paralleled by comparable changes in the poverty thresholds.

The differences between changes in the cost of the economy food budget and the overall cost of living led to the adoption of the CPI as the basis for annual revisions in the income cutoffs. Although the CPI is not designed to measure the changing market conditions faced solely by low-income families, it does reflect the fact that prices of food and nonfood commodities do not always advance at the same rate. Employing the CPI to adjust the low-income thresholds annually has another advantage over the earlier adjustment technique. Although the economy food plan is repriced annually, the data are not published regularly but are available only on request. The CPI, on the other hand, is regularly published and is a generally accepted measure of changes in the "cost of living." Table M shows the changes in the CPI between 1959 and 1970 and the corresponding average thresholds for a nonfarm family of four.

**Change in the farm-nonfarm relationship.** Under the old definition, the poverty thresholds for farm families were adjusted for the average value of food consumed by these families which they had grown themselves. Based on a 1961 study of household consumption which indicated that the value of food produced by farm families for home use amounted to about 30 percent of their total food budget, the poverty cutoffs for farm families were established at 70 percent of the nonfarm levels.

Up to the present time, no entirely satisfactory means of determining the income



required for equivalent levels of living for farm and nonfarm families has been provided by studies on this subject. Further research is needed to analyze the differences in the costs between farm and nonfarm families. Although it is not yet possible to quantify exactly all the factors contributing to cost of living differences between farm and nonfarm families, research already completed suggests that the differences are not as great as provided for by the 70 percent differential. After weighing the available evidence, the Review Committee agreed that narrowing the farm-nonfarm differential to 85 percent more nearly reflects the overall cost of living differences between farm and nonfarm families than the previously used differential.

**Alternate levels.** Because the low-income level currently in use by the Federal Government does not meet all the needs of the analysts of the data, two variations of the poverty definition were introduced at the same time that modifications were made to the SSA poverty index--one is set at 75 percent of the official government standard and the other at 125 percent of this standard. The alternate cutoffs are obtained by multiplying the income cutoffs at the low-income level by 0.75 and 1.25. Thus, the income cutoffs for a nonfarm family of four at 75 percent and 125 percent of the low-income level are \$2,976 and \$4,960, respectively. Table 2 of this report presents selected data on persons below 125 percent of the low-income level. Also, all the data presented in detailed tables 3, 13-15, 17-23, and 30 of this report have been tabulated for these additional levels and are available upon request for the years 1959 through 1970. Requests for these unpublished data, giving a specific description of the figures desired, may be made

in writing to the Chief, Population Division, Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C. 20233.

**Weighted average thresholds at the low-income level.** The low-income cutoffs used by the Bureau of the Census to determine the low-income status of families and unrelated individuals consist of a set of 124 thresholds arranged in a four-dimensional matrix consisting of family size (from one person to seven or more persons) cross-classified by presence and number of family members under 18 years old (from no children present to six or more children present), sex of head, and farm-nonfarm residence. The one- and two-person families are further differentiated by age of head (under 65 years and 65 years and over). The total family income of each family in the sample is tested against the appropriate dollar threshold to determine the low-income status of that family. If the family's total income is less than its corresponding cutoff, the family is classified as below the low-income level. The average thresholds shown in table N were weighted by the presence and number of children. For example, for a given size of family, sex of head, and residence category, the weighted average threshold for that group is obtained by multiplying the threshold for each presence and number of children category within the given family size by the number of families in that category. These products are then aggregated across the entire range of presence and number of children categories, and the total aggregate is divided by the total number of families in the group to yield the weighted average threshold at the low-income level for that size of family.

Because family composition varies by farm-nonfarm residence, the weighted average thresholds at the low-income level for farm families

as shown in table N, will not be exactly 85 percent of the nonfarm levels. Moreover, since family composition does not remain constant from year to year, the weighted average thresholds for 1970 will not reflect, identically, the change in the CPI between 1970 and earlier years.

Since the basic thresholds used to determine the low-income status of families and unrelated individuals are applied to all families and unrelated individuals, the weighted low-income thresholds are derived using all families and unrelated individuals rather than just those families and unrelated individuals classified as below the low-income level. To obtain the weighted low-income thresholds for families and unrelated individuals below 75 percent and below 125 percent of the low-income level, the weighted thresholds shown in table N may be multiplied directly by 0.75 and 1.25, respectively.

Income deficit. Income deficit is the difference between the total income of families and unrelated individuals below the low-income level, and their respective income thresholds. In computing the income deficit, families reporting a net income loss are assigned zero dollars and for such cases the deficit is equal to the low-income threshold. This measure provides an estimate of the amount which would be required to raise the incomes of all low-income families and unrelated individuals to their respective low-income thresholds. The income deficit is thus a measure of the degree of impoverishment of a family or unrelated individual. However, caution must be exercised in comparing the average deficit of families of different racial groups. Since the low-income thresholds used in this report are based on family size and composition, apparent differences in the average income deficits of racial groups may, to some extent, be a function of the differences in these characteristics. It must also be remembered that the thresholds in this report vary according to the sex of the family head. Thus, differences in the average deficit between families with a male or female head may be in part attributable to both differences in thresholds and to differences in family size and composition.

Median income deficit. The median income deficit is the amount which divides the distribution into two equal groups, one having an income deficit above the median and the other having an income deficit below the median.

Mean income deficit. The mean income deficit is the amount obtained by dividing the total income deficit of a group below the low-income level by the number of families or unrelated individuals (as appropriate) in that group.

Deficit per family member. The deficit per family member is the average amount of money necessary to raise every man, woman, and child in a family out of poverty. The deficit per family member is derived by dividing the total family income deficit of a group by the number of family members in the same group.

Family. The term "family," as used in this report, refers to a group of two or more persons related by blood, marriage, or adoption and residing together; all such persons are considered as members of the same family. Thus, if the son of the head of the household and the son's wife are in the household, they are treated as part of the head's family. On the other hand, a lodger and his wife not related to the head of the household or an unrelated servant and his wife are considered as additional families, and not a part of the household head's family.

Head of family. One person in each family was designated as the head. The head of a family is usually the person regarded as the head by members of the family. Women are not classified as heads if their husbands are resident members of the family at the time of the survey. Married couples related to the head of a family are included in the head's family and are not classified as separate families.

Size of family. The term "size of family" refers to the number of persons who are living together and are related to each other by blood, marriage, or adoption.

Unrelated individual. The term "unrelated individuals," as used in this report, refers to persons 14 years old and over (other than inmates of institutions) who are not living with any relatives. An unrelated individual may constitute a one-person household by himself, or he may be part of a household including one or more other families or unrelated individuals, or he may reside in group quarters such as a rooming house. Thus, a widow living by herself or with one or more other persons not related to her, a lodger not related to the head of the household or to anyone else in the household, and a servant living in an employer's household with no relatives are examples of unrelated individuals.

Own children and related children. "Own" children in a family are sons and daughters, including stepchildren and adopted children, of the family head. "Related" children in a family include own children and all other children in the household who are related to the family head by blood, marriage, or adoption.

Number of earners. This number includes all persons in the family with \$1 or more in wages and

salaries, or \$1 or more or a loss in net income from farm or nonfarm self-employment.

Age. The age classification is based on the age of the person at his last birthday.

Race. The population is divided into three groups on the basis of race: white, Negro, and "other races." The last category includes Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and any other race except white and Negro. "Other races" are usually shown in combination with the Negro population.

Origin or descent. Data on ethnic origin or descent were derived from responses to the question, "What is (this person's) origin or descent?" No attempt was made to define the terms but a flashcard was shown or a list was read, illustrative of types of ethnic origin. Some respondents having a diverse ethnic background or having several generations of residence in the United States may have reported the ethnic association they felt most strongly.

Years of school completed. Data on years of school completed in this report were derived from the combination of answers to questions concerning the highest grade of school attended by the person and whether or not that grade was finished. The questions on educational attainment apply only to progress in "regular" schools. Such schools include graded public, private, and parochial elementary and high schools (both junior and senior high), colleges, universities, and professional schools, whether day schools or night schools. Thus, regular schooling is that which may advance a person toward an elementary school certificate or a high school diploma, or a college, university, or professional school degree. Schooling in other than regular schools was counted only if the credits obtained were regarded as transferable to a school in the regular school system.

The median years of school completed is defined as the value which divides the distribution into two equal groups, one having completed more schooling and one having completed less schooling than the median. These medians are expressed in terms of a continuous series of numbers representing years of school completed. For example, a median of 9.0 represents the completion of the first year of high school and a median of 13.0 means completion of the first year of college.

Labor force and employment status. The definitions of labor force and employment status in this report relate to family heads and unrelated individuals 14 years old and over.

Employed. Employed persons comprise (1) all civilians who, during the specified week, did

any work at all as paid employees or in their own business or profession, or on their own farm, or who worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers on a farm or in a business operated by a member of the family, and (2) all those who were not working but who had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent because of illness, bad weather, vacation, or labor-management dispute, or because they were taking time off for personal reasons, whether or not they were paid by their employers for time off, and whether or not they were seeking other jobs. Excluded from the employed group are persons whose only activity consisted of work around the house (such as own home housework, painting or repairing own home, etc.) or volunteer work for religious, charitable, and similar organizations.

Unemployed. Unemployed persons are those civilians who, during the survey week, had no employment but were available for work and (1) had engaged in any specific jobseeking activity within the past 4 weeks, such as registering at a public or private employment office, meeting with prospective employers, checking with friends or relatives, placing or answering advertisements, writing letters of application, or being on a union or professional register; (2) were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off; or (3) were waiting to report to a new wage or salary job within 30 days.

Labor force. Persons are classified as in the labor force if they were employed as civilians, unemployed, or in the Armed Forces during the survey week. The "civilian labor force" is comprised of all civilians classified as employed or unemployed.

Not in the labor force. All civilians 14 years old and over who are not classified as employed or unemployed are defined as "not in the labor force." This group who are neither employed nor seeking work includes persons engaged only in own home housework, attending school, or unable to work because of long-term physical or mental illness; persons who are retired or too old to work; seasonal workers for whom the survey week fell in an off season; and the voluntarily idle. Persons doing only unpaid family work (less than 15 hours) are also classified as not in the labor force.

Occupation of longest job. Persons are classified according to the civilian job held longest during the year. Persons who held two jobs or more were reported in the job at which they worked the greatest number of weeks.

The occupational groupings included in this report were based essentially on the classification system used in the 1970 Census of Population. In the major groupings there is relatively little

difference in comparability between the systems used in the 1960 and 1970 Censuses of Population. For further information, see the article by John E. Bregger entitled "Revisions in Occupational Classifications for 1971," in Employment and Earnings, Volume 17, No. 8, February 1971, page 5, published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States Department of Labor. For a discussion of the 1970 Census of Population Occupation and Industry Classification Systems, see "The 1970 Census of Population Occupation Classification System," by Stanley Greene, John Priebe, and Richard Morrison, and "The 1970 Census of Population Industry Classification System," by Stanley Greene, included in the Statistical Reporter, Volume No. 70-6, December 1969, page 77 and Volume No. 69-10, April 1969, page 153, respectively.

Labor union membership. A private wage and salary worker or government worker who reported working during 1970 and who identified himself as a labor union member is so classified. Persons who did not work at any time during 1970 and persons who were self-employed are not included as labor union members.

The figures on labor union membership presented in this report are not entirely comparable with data from other sources due to differences in concepts, classification, and coverage. Data on labor union membership published by the Department of Labor in its Directory of National and International Labor Unions in the United States are obtained from the union rolls of dues paying members. These figures include some persons who did not work during the calendar year and some union members residing outside of the United States. All of the above groups are excluded from the labor union figures in this report.

Work experience. A person with work experience is one who, during the preceding calendar year, did any civilian work for pay or profit or worked without pay on a family-operated farm or business at any time during the year, on a part-time or full-time basis.

Weeks worked in the income year. Persons are classified according to the number of different weeks during the preceding calendar year in which they did any civilian work for pay or profit (including paid vacations and sick leave) or worked without pay on a family-operated farm or business.

Part-time or full-time jobs. A person is classified as having worked at part-time jobs during the preceding calendar year if he worked at civilian jobs which provided less than 35 hours of work per week in a majority of the weeks in

which he worked during the year. He is classified as having worked at full-time jobs if he worked 35 hours or more per week during a majority of the weeks in which he worked.

Year-round full-time worker. A year-round full-time worker is one who worked primarily at full-time civilian jobs (35 hours or more per week) for 50 weeks or more during the preceding calendar year.

Nonworker. A nonworker is one who did not do any civilian work in the calendar year preceding the survey.

Main reason for working part year. For persons who worked 1 to 49 weeks during the year, the main reason for working part year is based on the response to the question "What were you doing most of the remaining weeks?"

Main reason for not working. For persons who reported that they did not work at a civilian job for pay or profit or on a family-operated farm or business during the year, the main reason for not working is derived from the response to the question "What were you doing most of last year?"

Rounding. Percentages are rounded to the nearest tenth of a percent; therefore, the percentages in a distribution do not always add to exactly 100.0 percent. The totals, however, are always shown as 100.0.

Base figures. An estimate of the size of the base (number of persons, number of families, etc.) of each percent is shown in most of the tables in this report. The base figures shown in this report were prepared by inflating weighted sample results to agree with independent estimates of the population based on statistics updated from the 1960 census.

#### Nonresponses and Allocations

In the March 1971 CPS, no information was recorded for approximately 5 percent of the 50,000 households because no interview could be obtained during the week in which the enumeration was conducted. In order to account for these households, the weights assigned to other sample households of similar characteristics residing in the same sample areas were increased accordingly. In addition, complete income information was not reported for about 15 percent of all families and 12 percent of unrelated individuals 14 years old or over. Overall, about 11 percent of all persons 14 years old and over in households that were interviewed did not report complete income information.

In order that the maximum amount of information can be utilized, missing income items are imputed or allocated by values which are obtained from active respondents with similar economic and demographic characteristics. Beginning with the March 1962 survey, when a respondent did not answer one or more of the income items, all of his income data were imputed.

Beginning with the March 1966 survey, however, in the event a respondent did not answer one or more of the income questions, the missing income data for this person were imputed for only those income items which were not answered. Each of the earnings items was handled individually, whereas income items other than earnings were handled as a group. Characteristics used in this imputation are age, family status, race, residence, weeks worked, and major occupation group. The income amount assigned to a nonrespondent is that observed for another person with similar demographic and economic characteristics who did respond and who has been selected systematically in the order in which individual records are processed.

In the tabulation of income from surveys prior to 1962, the distributions by income levels had been based only on those cases which reported complete income information. The assumption implicit in this method was that persons who do not provide income information have the same income distribution as those who do provide such information. Using income data for 1958, a comparison was made of the income distributions obtained before and after the assignment of income to nonrespondents on the basis of known demographic and economic characteristics. This comparison indicated that the procedure for making individual assignments of income to nonrespondents resulted in slightly higher estimates of the proportion of families and individuals in the upper income classes than those obtained from the distributions based solely on those reporting on income. (See Current Population Reports, Series P-60, No. 33, tables F and G.)

Beginning with the 1967 CPS, the Bureau of the Census introduced improved income edit and allocation procedures. The main feature of the new procedures is a more refined method for imputing missing income data which expands the use of information already known about that person. Among the major improvements made affecting the income data are the following: (1) an expanded set of social and economic characteristics within which the imputations are made; in addition to age, race, occupation, and weeks worked, the new procedures include sex and type of family member as major variables within which the missing income items are imputed; (2) the elimination of inconsistent reporting which

resulted in having workers with no earnings and earners with no weeks worked; and (3) the new imputation procedure assigns missing earnings entries first and then utilizes the earnings information to assign missing sources of income other than earnings.

However, because of coding errors in the processing of the 1968 CPS data, in that year alone it was not possible to apply all the aforementioned improvements to the editing and allocation procedures. Since these errors produced an underestimate of income, they had the effect of overstating the number of poor.

In addition, it was discovered that the computer procedures for editing certain incorrect income codes caused an upward bias in the income data for some respondents and therefore would tend to produce an underestimate of the number of poor. It is estimated that the net impact of these errors had the effect of overestimating the number of poor families by about 120 thousand. Due to these errors affecting the income data for 1967, data for that year are not strictly comparable with those shown for 1966, and 1968 to 1970.

Comparison of 1966 poverty data according to original and revised editing and allocation procedures. In order to evaluate the impact of the new procedures, the poverty data from the March 1967 CPS were rerun, thus providing a bridge for the 1966 income year showing the results of both the earlier and the new procedures. Both series of data are shown in table 1. The general impact of the new allocation procedure was to shift the income distribution slightly upward, thus decreasing by 416,000 the number of poor families. A more detailed description of the new computer editing and allocation procedures may be found in Current Population Reports, Series P-60, No. 59, "Income in 1967 of Families in the United States," pages 17 to 19.

Modifications in collecting income data in the March-April 1969 CPS. Several modifications were introduced in the collection of income data in the March and April CPS supplements. These include (1) extension of the interview period of the six rotation groups for which income questions were asked in March and the use of followup forms in these six groups to accommodate household respondents who needed more time to obtain the required income information (it is estimated that some members of approximately 4,400 households, or 9 percent of the total relevant households, made use of these followup forms); (2) modification of the design and content of the questionnaire to allow for more detailed questioning of certain income items; thus, boxes for gross receipts, business expense, and net income have been added to the self-employment income questions to help

the interviewer and respondent determine net income, and "yes-no" circles were added to the questions on income other than earnings in order to ascertain whether the respondent received or did not receive income; (3) field office editing procedures were extended to a 100 percent income edit of the CPS schedules; (4) training instructions were strengthened by including more detailed explanations and more examples; and (5) the interview group training session was shifted from February to March.

Modifications in collecting income data in the March 1970 Current Population Survey. The Bureau introduced modifications in the collection of income data for the March 1970 CPS supplement. These were: (1) An advance letter informing households about the collection of income data was mailed to all households except those in the first and fifth months. The latter households received special letters which explained the need for collecting both CPS and census data; (2) information on work experience and income was collected simultaneously for the full sample (in previous years, work experience information was collected separately from income data); (3) the interview period was extended one week for three-fourths of the sample (using followup calls and separate questionnaires). In addition, modified procedures which were incorporated in the March 1969 CPS supplement were also implemented in the March 1970 CPS. Overall, data indicate that the use of these procedures has resulted in some improvement in the collection of income data. The family income nonresponse rate has not only dropped by 5 percentage points (from 19 to 14 percent) but also it appears that the proportion of aggregate income amounts collected in the March 1970 CPS relative to benchmark totals has increased slightly in the March 1970 CPS supplement as compared with the proportion collected in the March 1969 CPS supplement.

Modifications in collecting income data in the March 1971 Current Population Survey. The Bureau continued to use the improved procedures which were incorporated in the March 1970 CPS. Procedural changes that were instituted in the March 1971 CPS, among others, were:

- (1) The interview period was extended one week for all households in the sample (using follow-up calls and separate questionnaires). In the previous year's survey, the interview period was extended for only three-fourths of the sample.
- (2) Income from net royalties was included in the question covering estates, trusts, or dividends, interest on savings accounts or bonds, and net rental

income. In previous surveys, income from net royalties was included in the question covering private pensions, annuities, alimony, regular contributions from persons not living in this household, and anything else.

- (3) An additional regional office follow-up was made by telephone to obtain income amounts for all follow-up cases containing one or more persons who were not interviewed during the original follow-up period, except for refusal.

Overall, the family income nonresponse rate was 14.6 percent, about the same as for March 1970. Moreover, the proportion of aggregate income amounts collected in the March 1971 CPS relative to benchmark totals was about the same as for the March 1970 CPS.

Although nonresponse rates for families by low-income status are not available, it is known that families in the lower income intervals tend to have lower nonresponse rates than those in the middle and upper income intervals.<sup>5</sup> This is due in part to the fact that lower income families have less complicated financial arrangements than those in other income groups. There is also some evidence that the information on income and work experience is more consistent than previous information. Detailed results will be published at a later date.

#### Source and Reliability of the Estimates

Source of data. The estimates for 1969 and 1970 are based on data obtained in March 1970 and March 1971, respectively, in the Current Population Survey (CPS) of the Bureau of the Census. The sample was spread over 449 areas comprising 863 counties and independent cities, with coverage in each of the 50 states and the District of Columbia. Approximately 50,000 households are eligible for interview. Of this number, 2,250 occupied units, on the average, are visited but interviews are not obtained because the occupants are not found at home after repeated calls or are unavailable for some other reason. In addition to the 50,000, there are also about 8,500 sample units in an average month which are visited but are found to be vacant or otherwise not to be interviewed. For data collected in years prior to 1967, the sample was

spread over fewer areas with fewer interviewed households. Prior to the March 1966 survey, income data were collected from only 75 percent of the households included in the CPS. See Current Population Reports, Series P-23, No. 22, "Concepts and Methods Used in Manpower Statistics from the Current Population Survey," June 1967, pp. 7-10, for more information about the sample design.

The estimation procedure used in this survey involved the inflation of the weighted sample results to independent estimates of the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States by age, race, and sex. These independent estimates were based on statistics from the 1960 Census of Population; statistics of births, deaths, immigration and emigration; and statistics on the strength of the Armed Forces. To these totals were added the population in the Armed Forces living off post or with their families on post.

To show comparable poverty data for 1970 and 1959 by detailed type of residence, it was necessary to use data from the 1960 census rather than from the 1960 CPS. In the text, tables based on 1960 census data are identified as such; other tables for 1959 are based on 1960 CPS data. The type of residence classification used in the 1960 CPS was based on data from the 1950 census. Therefore, to achieve comparability with March 1971 CPS data, special tabulations of poverty data from the 53,000 households in the 1-in-1,000 sample of 1960 census data were prepared. These tabulations were designed to eliminate conceptual differences between 1960 census data and the 1971 CPS data.

Reliability of the estimates. Since the estimates in this report are based on a sample, they differ somewhat from the figure that would have been obtained from a complete census, using the same schedules, instructions, and enumerators. Particular care should be exercised in the interpretation of figures based on a relatively small number of cases as well as small differences between figures. As in any survey work, the results are subject to errors of response and nonreporting as well as being subject to sampling variability.

In most cases, the schedule entries for income are based on memory rather than on records, and, in the majority of cases, on the memory or knowledge of one person, usually the wife of the family head. The memory factor in data derived from field surveys of income produces underestimates because the tendency is to forget minor or irregular sources of income. These errors of reporting are due to misrepresentation or to misunderstanding as to the scope of the income concept.

The standard error is primarily a measure of sampling variability; that is, of the variations that occur by chance because a sample rather than the whole of the population is surveyed. The chances are about 68 out of 100 that an estimate from the survey differs from a complete census figure by less than the standard error. The chances are about 90 out of 100 that this difference would be less than 1.6 times the standard error, and the chances are about 95 out of 100 that the difference would be less than twice the standard error.

All statements of comparison appearing in the text are significant at a 1.6 standard-error level or better, and most are significant at a level of more than 2.0 standard errors. This means that for most differences cited in the text, the estimated difference is greater than twice the standard error of the difference. Statements of comparison qualified in some way (e.g., by the use of the phrase "some evidence") have a level of significance between 1.6 and 2.0 standard errors.

The figures presented in tables O, P, Q, and R are approximations to the standard errors of various estimates shown in this report. In order to derive standard errors that would be applicable to a wide variety of items and could be prepared at a moderate cost, a number of approximations were required. As a result, the tables of standard errors provided are an indication of the order of magnitude rather than the precise standard error for any specific item. As calculated for this report, the standard error also partially measures the effect of response and interviewer errors but does not measure any systematic biases in the data.

Table O contains the standard errors of estimates of the number of persons for the years 1966-1970. Table P contains the standard errors of estimates of the number of families for

the years 1966-1970. Table P should also be used for items which can typically appear only once in a given family, as for example, "Number of male heads of families."

The reliability of an estimated percentage, computed by using sample data for both numerator and denominator, depends upon both the size of the percentage and the size of the total upon which the percentage is based. Estimated percentages are relatively more reliable than the corresponding absolute estimates of the numerator of the percentage, particularly if the percent is 50 percent or more.

Table Q shows the standard errors of estimated percentages of persons for the years 1966-1970. Table P shows the standard error of estimated percentages of families for the years 1966-1970. The guidelines used to decide whether table O or table P is appropriate for a particular item should also be used for deciding between the use of tables Q and R.

It should be noted that the data obtained from CPS and from the decennial censuses are still not totally comparable due, in large part, to differences in interviewer experience and in the training of interviewers, and accounts for an additional component of error which is not reflected in the standard error tables.

Illustration of the use of tables of standard error. Table E of this report shows that there were 3,280,000 families with a male head below the low-income level. Table P shows the standard error on an estimate of this size to be approximately 83,000. The chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimate would have shown a figure differing from a complete census figure by less than 83,000. The chances are 95 out of 100 that the estimate would have shown a figure differing from a complete census figure by less than 166,000 (twice the standard error). Of these 3,280,000 families, 1,360,000 or 41.5 percent were two-person families. Table R shows the standard error of 41.5 percent on a base of 3,280,000 to be approximately 1.2 percent. Consequently, chances are 68 out of 100 that the 41.5 percent would be within 1.2 percentage points of a complete census figure, and chances are 95 out of 100 that the estimate would be within 2.4 percentage points of a complete census figure, i.e., this 95 percent confidence interval would be from 39.1 to 43.9 percent.
