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Characteristics of the Low-Income Population: 1972

This report presents social and economic statistics for the population of the United States below the low-income level¹ in 1972, based on the March 1973 Current Population Survey (CPS). Included are data on selected characteristics of the population below the low-income level in 1972, such as geographic distribution, residence in low-income areas, race and ethnic origin, family status, size of family, education, employment status, work experience, occupation, income (including type and source), and income deficit. Several historical tables detailing a picture of the changing composition of the population below and above the low-income level since 1959, the first year for which low-income data are available, are also presented. A description of the population below the low-income level in 1972 and some analysis of changes in the composition of this population over the past year and since 1959 are included. In this text, the terms "low-income", "poverty", and "poor" are used interchangeably.

In 1972, there were 24.5 million persons below the low-income level, comprising 12 percent of the United States population (Table 1). The number of low-income persons declined by 4 percent between 1971 and 1972 and by 38 percent between 1959 and 1972. The decrease of 1.1 million persons over the past year represented the first statistically significant decrease since the 1968-69 period. The number of low-income white persons declined by about 9 percent between 1971 and 1972, and there was some evidence of an increase in the number of low-income blacks. Over the same period, there was a 13 percent decrease in the number of low-income persons 65 years old and over and no significant change for those under 65 years. While the number of low-income families declined at about the same rate as the number of low-income persons over the past year and between 1959 and 1972, the number of low-income unrelated individuals (persons living alone or with non-relatives) was lower in 1972 than in 1971, but the sampling error was too large to measure


¹Families and unrelated individuals are classified as being above or below the low-income or poverty level, using the poverty index adopted by a Federal Interagency Committee in 1969. This index is based on the Department of Agriculture's 1961 Economy Food Plan and reflects the different consumption requirements of families based on their size and composition, sex and age of the family head, and farm-nonfarm residence. In order to keep the poverty index constant over time, the thresholds are updated annually based on changes in the Consumer Price Index. The low-income threshold for a nonfarm family of four was \$4,275 in 1972, \$4,137 in 1971, and \$2,973 in 1959. See page 141 for a detailed explanation of the low-income definition.

whether there was any change since 1959. There were 5.1 million families and 4.9 million unrelated individuals below the low-income level in 1972. For a more detailed discussion of changes over time, see page 10.

Composition and Characteristics of the Low-Income Population in 1972

In 1972, as in previous years, families with a female head comprised a larger proportion of low-income families than of nonpoor families (43 percent compared to 9 percent). This difference prevailed for both white and black families (Figure 1). However, regardless of poverty status, families headed by women accounted for a greater proportion of the black population than of the white population. One-third of low-income white families were headed by a female compared to 8 percent of those above the low-income level; families headed by women comprised the majority of black families below the low-income level (64 percent) and about 23 percent of black families above the low-income level.

Figure 1. Female Heads Comprise a Larger Proportion of Families Below the Low-Income Level Than of Those Above the Low-Income Level




Persons of Spanish origin² and blacks were also overrepresented in the poverty ranks. About 10 percent of the low-income population was comprised of Spanish persons compared to about 4 percent of the population above the low-income level.


For blacks, the difference was more pronounced; about 32 percent of the population below the low-income level was black compared to 9 percent of those above that level (Figure 2).

proportion of the white population than of the black population whereas the reverse relationship was true for children (Table A).

Other differences in socioeconomic characteristics between the poor and nonpoor populations are outlined below:

Geographic distribution and residence in low-income areas. In 1972, about 59 percent of low-income persons compared to 70 percent of non-

poor persons lived in metropolitan areas defined as of the 1970 census (Table B). Low-income blacks were more likely to live in metropolitan areas than their white counterparts. Low-income whites living in metropolitan areas were distributed equally between the central cities and suburban rings while for blacks the residency ratio of central cities to suburban rings was 5 to 1.

Low-income areas in metropolitan areas are defined in terms of census tracts and in non-metropolitan areas in terms of minor civil divisions (townships, districts, etc.) in which 20 percent or more of the population was below the low-income level in 1969. In 1972, about one-fifth of all persons in the United States lived in low-income areas. Almost one-half (46 percent) of the


poor resided in these areas compared to 17 percent of the nonpoor. Residents of nonmetropolitan areas were more likely to live in poverty areas than residents of metropolitan areas regardless of poverty status (Table B).

Within metropolitan areas, regardless of poverty status, blacks were more likely to live in low-income areas than whites. About 47 percent of blacks above the poverty level compared to 6 percent of whites above the poverty level lived in these areas (Figure 4). The comparable proportions for poor persons were 66 percent and 23 percent, respectively. This difference was evident for both the central cities and the suburbs, although in the suburbs the majority of blacks lived outside of the low-income areas regardless of poverty status.

In metropolitan areas, about half of the low-income residents of poverty areas were children compared to 38 percent for low-income residents outside of poverty areas (Table 10). In contrast, the proportion of children among the nonpoor population was about one-third in both poverty and nonpoverty areas.

Type of income. Families below the low-income level were less likely to have some income from earnings than those above the low-income level (63 percent compared to 93 percent). Income from earnings accounted for 47 percent of the aggregate income of the poor compared to 88 percent for the nonpoor (Table C).

While the majority of families both above and below the low-income level received some income from sources other than earnings, there were significant differences in the type of other income received. For families below the low-income level public assistance and Social Security

payments were the largest categories of unearned income, while for families above the low-income level income from sources other than government programs (for example, dividends, interest, rent, and private pensions) was the largest category. About one-half of the nonpoor received income from sources other than government programs, compared to one-fifth for those below the low-income level. About 36 percent of the low-income families received income from public assistance. For about two-fifths of these families, it was their only source of income. One-fourth of all low-income families received income from Social Security, and for about one-fourth of them, it accounted for their total income. For each type of income, families below the low-income level have a higher percent with that type of income only than do families above the low-income level.

Work status. The low-income population, as well as the total population, can be subdivided into several groups with regard to the work force. Children under 14 years old primarily depend on the earning capacity of their parents or other adults; and the great majority of the aged depend on the income set aside when they were working. In 1972, these two groups accounted for 48 percent of the low-income population as compared to 33 percent of the population above the low-income level. The remaining portion of the population are of working age (14 to 64 years old). In 1972, there were 12.7 million low-income persons in this age group (Table D).

About 47 percent of low-income persons 14 to 64 years old compared to 73 percent of those above the low-income level worked at some time during 1972. Of those who worked, about one-fourth of the poor and three-fifths of the nonpoor worked year-round full time. The figures for the poor did not vary by race; however, among the nonpoor, there was some evidence that blacks were more likely to have worked year-round full time than whites (Table D). A greater proportion of nonpoor mothers (wives and female heads of families and subfamilies with own children) than of poor mothers worked at some time during 1972. Of those mothers who worked, 16 percent of the poor and 39 percent of the nonpoor worked year-round full time (Table 34). These proportions were higher for blacks than for whites regardless of poverty status.

Reasons for not working also varied by poverty status. Low-income persons who did not work were more likely to be ill or disabled than those above the low-income level. Persons above the low-income level were more likely not to work because of family responsibilities than their counterparts below the low-income level.

Educational attainment. The low-income status of family heads 25 years old and over tended to vary inversely with years of school completed. For example, about 22 percent of family heads who had completed less than 8 years of school were below the low-income level in 1972, while only about 3 percent of those with at least one year of

college were poor (Table E). Although this relation held for both races, black family heads were more likely to be below the low-income level regardless of their educational attainment. About 37 percent of black family heads who had completed less than 8 years of school were below the low-income level compared to 19 percent for white family heads. About 12 percent of black family heads with some college education were poor compared to 2 percent for whites.

About 46 percent of low-income family heads had completed less than one year of high school compared to 22 percent for family heads above the low-income level. The proportion of low-income family heads who did not finish high school was 69 percent compared to 37 percent for family heads above the low-income level. Black family heads were less likely to have finished high school regardless of poverty status than white family heads. About 76 percent of low-income blacks did not finish high school compared to 67 percent of low-income whites. The figures for family heads above the low-income level were 56 percent and 36 percent, respectively. Family heads with one year or more of college represented about 9 percent of those below the low-income level, but about 28 percent of those above the low-income level in 1972.

Characteristics of selected groups overrepresented among the low-income population are outlined below:

Families headed by females. In 1972, families with a female head were more than five times

as likely to have incomes below the low-income level as those headed by a male; the poverty rates were 33 percent and 6 percent, respectively (Table F). Female heads of both white and black families were more likely to be poor than their male counterparts; however black family heads of both sexes had higher poverty rates than whites. Among female headed families, the poverty rate for blacks was 53 percent compared to 24 percent for whites (Figure 5). In contrast, among male headed families, the poverty rates were 16 percent and 5 percent, respectively.

The presence of children appears to be an important factor in determining the poverty status of families headed by a woman, while it hardly affects the poverty status of those headed by a man. The poverty rate for families with a female head without children present was 10 percent, as compared to 45 percent for similar families with children. This sizeable difference in poverty rates was observed for both blacks and whites (Table F). For families with a male head, the comparable rates, regardless of the presence of children, were about 6 percent. Low-income families headed by females were more likely to have children than those with a male head. About 89 percent of low-income families with a woman as a head had children under 18 years present compared to 58 percent of low-income families headed by a man.

The different roles children play in the poverty status of male and female headed families can



be explained by the fact that presence of children does not affect a man's work status. About 45 percent of all low-income female heads 14 to 64 years old did not work because of family responsibilities (Table G). The number of men who do not work because of family responsibilities is insignificant.

This is not to say that low-income female heads of families with children do not work. Of all low-income female heads of families and subfamilies with own children, about 42 percent worked at some time during 1972; the proportion was higher for whites than for blacks (Table 34). Separate data for female heads of families excluding subfamilies are not currently available. The poverty rate for working mothers who were heads of families and subfamilies was considerably lower than that for those who did not work (28 percent compared to 66 percent). Black mothers were more likely to have incomes below the low-income level than white mothers regardless of whether they worked. Obtaining work does not necessarily eliminate the high poverty rate of black female heads since these persons frequently obtain low-paying jobs. Even in such families in which the head worked year-round full time, the poverty rate was 17 percent compared to 7 percent for comparable white families.

In general, low-income female heads of families (regardless of presence of children)

between 14 and 64 years old were less likely to have worked than low-income male heads of the same age group. Of the women who headed low-income families, about 41 percent worked at some time in 1972 (Table G). Although there is some evidence that the proportion of low-income white female heads who worked was higher than that for similar blacks, a greater proportion of blacks than whites worked year-round full time in 1972 (22 percent compared to 14 percent). In contrast, about 78 percent of poor male family heads, regardless of race, worked at some time during 1972 and 47 percent of these worked all year at a full-time job.

Female heads also differ from male heads in the type of income received. About 72 percent of low-income families headed by a male had some income from earnings compared to 51 percent of low-income families headed by a female (Table H). Social Security was the largest category of income other than earnings for low-income families headed by a man, while public assistance was the largest category for low-income families

headed by a woman. This relation did not hold for low-income families headed by black males. The proportion of such families receiving Social Security was not statistically significantly different from that receiving public assistance (28 percent compared to 25 percent). The receipt of public assistance for low-income families headed by a female varied by race. The proportion was 50 percent for whites and 71 percent for blacks.

Low-income female heads of families tended to be younger on the average than low-income male heads. In 1972, female heads under 35 years accounted for about 50 percent of all low-income female heads compared to 28 percent for low-income male heads (Table 24). Conversely, 23 percent of all male heads and 9 percent of all female heads below the low-income level were 65 years old and over. Among male family heads the poverty rate was highest for the aged (11 percent); while among female family heads the poverty rate was highest for the young (54 percent).

The aged. In 1972, the poverty rate for persons 65 years and over was 19 percent compared to 11 percent for those under 65 years (Table I). Aged persons living in families were less likely to be poor than those who lived alone or with nonrelatives (i.e., unrelated individuals) and depended on their own incomes. About 10 percent of the aged persons living in families were below the low-income level compared to 37 percent of the aged unrelated individuals. Aged female unrelated individuals were more likely to be poor than comparable aged males (40 percent compared to 26 percent). However, the poverty rate for elderly persons living in families was about the same (one-tenth) regardless of their sex.

Unrelated individuals comprised about three-fifths of all low-income aged persons compared to only one-eighth of those under 65 years. The family status of low-income aged persons varied by sex. Aged females below the low-income level were more likely to be living alone or with nonrelatives than aged males. About 73 percent of aged females below the low-income level were unrelated individuals compared to 34 percent for aged males.

About 17 percent of aged men below the low-income level in 1972 worked at some time during the year compared to 36 percent of the elderly males above the low-income level. For women, the comparable figures were 7 percent and 15 percent, respectively. A greater proportion of the aged poor than the nonpoor, regardless of sex, reported illness or disability as their main reason for not working.

Income Deficit. The low-income definition used in this report is based on total money income reported for the calendar year. The income deficit is the difference between the low-income threshold and the amount of income received by low-income families or unrelated individuals and is thus the amount which would be required to raise their incomes to the poverty line. The mean income deficit for all low-income families was about \$1,500 in 1972 (Table J). The mean income deficit for black families was \$1,650 compared to \$1,430 for white families. Because the income cutoffs used to define low-income families vary by size of family and sex of head, such factors must be taken into consideration when comparing the average deficits of families by race of head. Generally, the mean income deficit did not differ by race for each family size group. These relationships are illustrated more fully in Table J.

Changing Composition of the Low-Income Population: 1959 to 1972

Since 1959, the number of low-income white persons has decreased at a faster rate than the number of low-income blacks. Thus, black persons comprise an increasing proportion of the declining low-income population (26 percent in 1959, 29 percent in 1971, and 32 percent in 1972), and they also represent a slightly larger proportion of all persons. Overall, the low-income population declined from 39.5 million in 1959 to 24.5 million in 1972.

Since 1959, low-income persons in families with a male head declined sharply regardless of whether they were white or black (Table K). In contrast, the number of low-income black persons in families with a female head rose by 71 percent and comparable low-income white persons increased by 11 percent between 1959 and 1972. Although the poverty rates for both whites and blacks have declined considerably since 1959, black persons were still much more likely to be below the low-income level than whites. In 1959, the poverty rate for black persons was 55 percent, while it was 18 percent for whites. By 1972, the rates had declined to 33 percent for blacks and 9 percent for whites.

Between 1971 and 1972, the number of low-income white persons declined by 9 percent while there was some evidence of an increase in the number of low-income blacks (Table K). It is likely that most of the decrease in low-income white persons took place among those in families with a male head while the increase in low-income black persons was concentrated among those in families with a female head. In contrast, there was some evidence of a decrease in the number of low-income black persons in families with a male head.

The same pattern of rate of change noted above for low-income black persons in families can be observed when families are considered as units of comparison. The number of low-income black families with a female head as well as the total number of such families increased between 1971 and 1972. About one-half of black families with a female head were below the low-income level in both years.

The increase in the number of low-income black families with a female head over the past year was concentrated among those families with related children under 18 years old. As discussed in the section entitled "Families headed by females," the presence of children affects the poverty status of a female-headed family more than a family with a male head. The role that many such women have as non-earners because of their family responsibilities must be considered when comparing the poverty status of families by sex of head.

In general, low-income families with a female head comprise an increasing proportion of the low-income population (23 percent in 1959, 40 percent in 1971, and 43 percent in 1972) due to a rapid decline in the number of poor families with a male head between 1959 and 1972 and an increase in the number of comparable families with a female head over the same period (Table 4). In contrast, the proportion of female headed families in the total population has not increased as sharply (10 percent in 1959 and about 12 percent in 1971 and 1972) as the proportion of low-income female heads.

Changes among the aged poor-- In 1972, there were 3.7 million persons 65 years and over who were below the low-income level, a decrease of 535,000 (or 13 percent) from 1971 (Table L). This represents a continuation of the decrease in the number of low-income aged persons noted in the 1970-71 period and appears related to increases in Social Security payments of about one-fourth between December 1969 and

March 1971 and by another one-fifth in 1972.³ As the number of low-income aged persons decreased by about 1.1 million between 1970 and 1972, the proportion of the low-income population who were aged also decreased from 19 percent to about 15 percent. This latter proportion was not statistically significantly different from the proportion of the poor who were aged in 1959 (14 percent). The proportion of aged persons in the total population has

increased slightly (from 9 percent in 1959 to 10 percent in 1972).

Since 1959, the likelihood of an aged person having an income below the low-income level has decreased. In 1959, one out of every three aged persons was below the low-income level; by 1972, the ratio had fallen to about one in five (Table L).

Between 1971 and 1972, the number of low-income white persons 65 years and over decreased by 15 percent; the sampling error was too large to measure whether there was any change in the number of aged low-income blacks. Among non-aged poor persons, the number of whites decreased by 7 percent while there was some evidence of an increase in the number of comparable black persons.

Changes in farm-nonfarm residence. Although the number of all low-income families declined between 1971 and 1972, there was no statistically significant change in the number of nonfarm families below the low-income level (Table 3). The poverty rate for nonfarm families declined slightly from about 10 percent in 1971 to 9 percent in 1972, while the low-income rate for farm families decreased from 17 percent to 13 percent over the same period. Low-income families living on farms accounted for only 6 percent of all low-income families in 1972 compared to 9 percent in 1971.

Changes in employment status. Between 1959 and 1972, there was a decline in the proportion of male family heads below the low-income level who were in the civilian labor force (from 69 percent to 61 percent), while the proportion for female family heads has remained almost constant (about 34 percent). Although the proportion of low-income female heads in the labor force has remained unchanged since 1959, their unemployment rate has risen--from about 11 percent in 1959 to 18 percent in 1972. For male family heads, the percent unemployed decreased from about 11 percent in 1959 to 8 percent in 1972 (Table 4).

tribution of families and persons, by income levels, appear in the other P-60 reports, the latest of which is P-60, No. 90, "Money Income in 1972 of Families and Persons in the United States".

Advance data on the low-income population in 1972 cross-classified by selected characteristics appear in Current Population Reports, Series P-60, No. 88, "Characteristics of the Low-Income Population: 1972"

The low-income concept has been developed as a tool for measuring the overall economic well-being of the population at the lower end of the income scale. It is an attempt to specify, in dollar terms, a minimum level of income adequacy for families of different types in keeping with American consumption patterns. Based on an analysis of the percent of income devoted to food expenditures by United States families, an estimate was developed of the minimum cost at which an American family, making average choices, can be provided with a diet meeting recommended nutritional goals. As such then, it is an overall statistical yardstick which reflects the different consumption requirements of families of different size by taking into account the number of adults and the number of children, and whether or not they live on a farm. Insofar as individual circumstances or consumption patterns differ, the dollar value of the low-income threshold for a given family size may not represent the money income required by an individual family to maintain a level of economic well-being equivalent to other families with similar incomes. A more detailed discussion concerning the development of the concept appears in the aforementioned articles by Mollie Orshansky in Social Security Bulletins of January and July of 1965.

Decennial census. Low-income data collected in the 1970 Census of Population appear in a number of published reports. Selected characteristics of low-income persons, families, and unrelated individuals, for the United States, each of the States, counties, standard metropolitan statistical areas, urbanized areas, and urban places are presented in 1970 Census of Population, Vol. I, Characteristics of the Population, chapter C, "General Social and Economic Characteristics." Statistics on low-income status in 1969 of persons and families by detailed characteristics, including cross-classifications by race, age, weeks worked, education, type of family, etc., are presented in 1970 Census of Population, Vol. I, Characteristics of the Population, chapter D, "Detailed Characteristics," for some or all of the following areas: United States, each of the States, and standard metropolitan statistical areas of 250,000 inhabitants or more. Further information is contained in Data Access Description No. 29, Collection, Evaluation, and Processing Series CEP-7, "Low-Income Data from the 1970 Census."

Cross-classifications of low-income status in 1969 for persons and families by detailed social, economic, and housing characteristics are presented in 1970 Census of Population, Volume II Report PC(2)-9A, "Low-Income Population." Tables are generally for the United States, although some are repeated for regions and metropolitan-nonmetropolitan residence. Data on the social, economic, and housing characteristics of the low-income population residing in poverty areas in the 50 largest cities can be found in 1970 Census of Population, Volume II Report PC(2)-9B, "Low-Income Areas in Large Cities," and Supplementary Report PC(S1)-56, "Selected Characteristics of the Population in Low-Income Areas of Large Cities."

Statistics on income in 1969 collected in the Current Population Survey of March 1970 differ from data for that year from the 1970 census despite the fact that the same basic concept was used in both instances. In the first place, the survey data exclude the institutional population and most members of the Armed Forces living on post. These two groups were included in the census. Secondly, college students are generally enumerated at their own homes in the Current Population Survey and classified as family members, but were enumerated at their college residence in the census, usually as secondary individuals. Thirdly, the small group of Current Population Survey enumerators was more experienced and had more intensive training and supervision than the large number of temporary census enumerators and may have more often obtained more accurate answers from respondents. Furthermore, approximately 60 percent of the households were self-enumerated in the 1970 census. Moreover, income data in the Current Population Survey are based on responses to separate questions on eight types of income, as well as responses to additional yes-no circles within 3 of these questions, whereas in the census only six questions were used.

In general, the number of persons and families below the low-income level reported in the Census is higher than that reported in the Current Population Survey. The number of poor persons in the 1970 census was 27.1 million compared to 24.1 million derived from the March 1970 Current Population Survey. The comparable figures for low-income families were 5.5 million and 5.0 million, respectively.

APPENDIX

Definitions and Explanations

Population coverage. This report excludes inmates of institutions and unrelated individuals under 14 years old. It includes only those approximately 1.0 million members of the Armed Forces living off post or with their families on post.

Farm-nonfarm residence. The farm population refers to rural residents living on farms. The method of determining farm-nonfarm residence in the present survey is the same as that used in the 1960 and 1970 censuses and in the Current Population Surveys since 1960, but differs from that used in earlier surveys and censuses. According to the current definitions, the farm population consists of all persons living in rural territory on places of less than 10 acres yielding agricultural products which sold for \$250 or more in the previous year, or on places of 10 acres or more yielding agricultural products which sold for \$50 or more in the previous year. Rural persons in institutions, motels, and tourist camps, and those living on rented places where no land is used for farming are not classified as farm population.

The nonfarm population, as the term is used here, comprises persons living in urban areas and rural persons not on farms.

Metropolitan-nonmetropolitan residence. The population residing in standard metropolitan statistical areas (SMSA's) constitutes the metropolitan population. Except in New England, an SMSA is a county or group of contiguous counties which contains at least one city of 50,000 inhabitants or more, or "twin cities" with a combined population of at least 50,000. In addition to the county or counties containing such a city or cities, contiguous counties are included in an SMSA if, according to certain criteria, they are essentially metropolitan in character and are socially and economically integrated with the central city. In New England, SMSA's consist of towns and cities, rather than counties.

The 1972 and the revised 1969 and 1971 figures shown in this report for SMSA's are based on the SMSA's as defined on the basis of the 1970 census; those shown for earlier years refer to SMSA's defined on the basis of the 1960 census. As a result of these changes, the proportion of low-income families in 1969 living in metropolitan

areas increased from about 49 percent to 52 percent. The comparable figures for families above the low-income level were 66 percent and 70 percent, respectively.

Central cities. The population inside SMSA's is further classified as "inside central cities" and "outside central cities." With a few exceptions, central cities are determined according to the following criteria:

1. The largest city in an SMSA is always a central city.
2. One or two additional cities may be secondary central cities on the basis and in the order of the following criteria:
 - a. The additional city or cities have at least 250,000 inhabitants.
 - b. The additional city or cities have a population of one-third or more of that of the largest city and a minimum population of 25,000.

Low-Income Areas. For this report low-income areas in metropolitan areas are defined in terms of census tracts and in nonmetropolitan areas in terms of minor civil divisions (townships, districts, etc.) in which 20 percent or more of the population was below the low-income level in 1969. This method of defining low-income areas differs from the definitions used in past Current Population Reports.

The 1970 census definition was developed in order to provide a statistical index based on income only and to utilize the small area data on poverty status which were available in 1970 for the first time in a decennial census. Research was conducted by the Bureau's staff to find a definition that would delineate low-income areas for a given year which would be similar in size and location to those delineated by the 1960 low-income area definition, which consisted of an unweighted combination of five poverty-related socioeconomic characteristics. For this purpose, the Bureau utilized a special tabulation of 1960 census data for census tracts in a sample of large metropolitan areas. Low-income areas defined by the 1960 low-income area definition were compared to those defined by aggregating all census tracts with poverty rates above selected cutoff values. Based on this research, it was determined that areas consisting of census tracts with poverty

rates of 20 percent or more most closely approximated those defined by the 1960 method. For further details, see 1970 Census of Population Report PC(2)-9B, "Low-Income Areas in Large Cities."

Geographic regions. The four major regions of the United States for which data are presented in this report represent groups of States, as follows:

Northeast: Connecticut, Maine, Massachusetts, New Hampshire, New Jersey, New York, Pennsylvania, Rhode Island, Vermont.

North Central: Illinois, Indiana, Iowa, Kansas, Michigan, Minnesota, Missouri, Nebraska, North Dakota, Ohio, South Dakota, Wisconsin.

South: Alabama, Arkansas, Delaware, District of Columbia, Florida, Georgia, Kentucky, Louisiana, Maryland, Mississippi, North Carolina, Oklahoma, South Carolina, Tennessee, Texas, Virginia, West Virginia.

West: Alaska, Arizona, California, Colorado, Hawaii, Idaho, Montana, Nevada, New Mexico, Oregon, Utah, Washington, Wyoming.

North and West: Northeast, North Central, and West regions combined.

Mobility status. The population of the United States has been classified according to mobility status on the basis of a comparison between the place of residence of each person at the survey date and the place of residence 3 years earlier.

1. Nonmovers. This group consists of persons who were living in the same house at the end of the period as at the beginning of the period.

2. Movers. This group consists of all persons who were living in a different house in the United States at the end of the period than at the beginning of the period.

3. Persons abroad. This group consists of persons, either citizens or aliens, whose place of residence was outside the United States at the beginning of the period, that is, in an outlying area under the jurisdiction of the United States or in a foreign country.

Income. For each person 14 years old and over in the sample, questions were asked on the amount of money income received in the preceding calendar year from each of the following sources: (1) Money wages or salary; (2) net income from nonfarm self-employment; (3) net income from

farm self-employment; (4) Social Security; (5) dividends, interest (on savings or bonds), income from estates or trusts or net rental income; (6) public assistance or welfare payments; (7) unemployment and workman's compensation, government employee pensions, or veterans' payments; (8) private pensions, annuities, alimony, regular contributions from persons not living in this household, net royalties, and other periodic income.

When an indefinite amount was reported by the respondent, a specific value was assigned during processing wherever possible. If the indefinite amount was reported in terms of a range, the midpoint of the range was assigned, e.g., \$10,000 to \$15,000 was coded as \$12,500. Open-ended amounts were converted to designated specific amounts, e.g., over \$10,000 was coded as \$15,000.

It should be noted that although the income statistics refer to receipts during the preceding year the characteristics of the person, such as age, labor force status, etc., and the composition of families refer to the time of the survey. The income of the family does not include amounts received by persons who were members of the family during all or part of the income year if these persons no longer resided with the family at the time of enumeration. On the other hand, family income includes amounts reported by related persons who did not reside with the family during the income year but who were members of the family at the time of enumeration.

Data on income collected in the CPS are limited to money income received before payments for personal income taxes, Social Security, union dues, Medicare deductions, etc. Money income is the sum of the amounts received from earnings; Social Security and public assistance payments; dividends, interest, and rent; unemployment and workmen's compensation; government and private employee pensions; and other periodic income. (Certain money receipts such as capital gains are not included.) Therefore, money income does not reflect the fact that many families receive part of their income in the form of nonmoney transfers such as food stamps, health benefits, and subsidized housing; that many farm families receive nonmoney income in the form of rent-free housing and goods produced and consumed on the farm; or that nonmoney incomes are also received by some nonfarm residents which often take the form of the use of business transportation and facilities, full or partial payments by business for retirement programs, medical and

educational expenses, etc.¹ These elements should be considered when comparing income levels. Moreover, readers should be aware that for many different reasons there is a tendency in household surveys for respondents to underreport their income. Overall aggregate income compiled in the CPS was about 90 percent of benchmark estimates in 1972. From an analysis of independently derived income estimates, it has been determined that wages and salaries tend to be much better reported than such income types as public assistance, Social Security, and net income from interest, dividends, rentals, etc.

Money wages or salary is total money earnings received for work performed as an employee during the income year. It includes wages, salary, Armed Forces pay, commissions, tips, piece-rate payments, and cash bonuses earned, before deductions were made for taxes, bonds, pensions, union dues, etc.

Net income from nonfarm self-employment is net money income (gross receipts minus expenses) from one's own business, professional enterprise, or partnership. Gross receipts include the value of all goods sold and services rendered. Expenses include costs of goods purchased, rent, heat, light, power, depreciation charges, wages and salaries paid, business taxes (not personal income taxes), etc. The value of salable merchandise consumed by the proprietors of retail stores is not included as part of net income.

Net income from farm self-employment is net money income (gross receipts minus operating expenses) from the operation of a farm by a person on his own account, as an owner, renter, or sharecropper. Gross receipts include the value of all products sold, government crop loans, money received from the rental of farm equipment to others, and incidental receipts from the sale of wood, sand, gravel, etc. Operating expenses include cost of feed, fertilizer, seed, and other farming supplies, cash wages paid to farmhands, depreciation charges, cash rent, interest on farm

mortgages, farm building repairs, farm taxes (not State and Federal income taxes), etc. The value of fuel, food, or other farm products used for family living is not included as part of net income. In general, inventory changes were not considered in determining net income; however, replies based on income tax returns or other official records do reflect inventory changes.

Social Security includes Social Security pensions and survivors' benefits, and permanent disability insurance payments made by the Social Security Administration prior to deductions for medical insurance and railroad retirement insurance checks from the U.S. Government. "Medicare" reimbursements are not included.

Dividends, interest (on savings or bonds), income from estates or trusts, net rental income or net royalties include dividends from stockholdings or membership in associations, interest on savings or bonds, periodic receipts from estates or trust funds, net income from rental of a house, store, or other property to others, receipts from boarders or lodgers, and net royalties.

Public assistance or welfare payments include public assistance payments such as old-age assistance, aid to families with dependent children, and aid to the blind or totally disabled. Separate payments received for hospital or other medical care (vendor payments) are excluded from this item.

Unemployment compensation, government employee pensions, or veterans' payments include: (1) Unemployment compensation received from government unemployment insurance agencies or private companies during periods of unemployment and any strike benefits received from union funds; (2) government employee pensions received from retirement pensions paid by Federal, State, county, or other governmental agencies to former employees (including members of the Armed Forces) or their survivors; (3) money paid periodically by the Veterans' Administration to disabled members of the Armed Forces or to survivors of deceased veterans, subsistence allowances paid to veterans for education and on-the-job training, as well as so-called "refunds" paid to ex-servicemen as GI insurance premiums; also includes (4) workers' compensation received periodically from public or private insurance companies for injuries incurred at work. The cost of this insurance must have been paid by the employer and not by the person.

¹Estimates of non-money transfer income benefiting persons below the low-income-level funded programs are published in the Statistical Abstract, 1973, table 558, "Federal Outlays Benefiting Low-Income Persons: 1967 to 1972." It should be noted that federal outlays for in-kind benefits, which in table 558 include "Medicaid" and "Medicare" in addition to "Income security in kind", cannot be equated to increases in consumer income because they do not necessarily release equivalent amounts of funds for either consumption or savings.

Private pensions, annuities, alimony, regular contributions from persons not living in the household, and other periodic income include the following types of income: (1) Private pensions or retirement benefits paid to a retired person or his survivors by a former employer or by a union, either directly or through an insurance company; (2) periodic receipts from annuities or insurance; (3) alimony and child support; (4) contributions received periodically from persons not living in the household; and (5) other periodic income such as military family allotments, net gambling winnings, and other kinds of periodic income other than earnings.

Receipts not counted as income. Receipts from the following sources were not included as income: (1) Money received from the sale of property, such as stocks, bonds, a house, or a car (unless the person was engaged in the business of selling such property, in which case the net proceeds would be counted as income from self-employment); (2) withdrawals of bank deposits; (3) money borrowed; (4) tax refunds; (5) gifts; and (6) lump sum inheritances or insurance payments.

All sources of income may be combined into two major types:

Total money earnings--the algebraic sum of money wages or salary and net income from farm and nonfarm self-employment; and

Income other than earnings--the algebraic sum of all sources of money income except wages and salaries and income from self-employment.

Total money income. The algebraic sum of money wages and salaries, net income from self-employment, and income other than earnings represents total money income. The total income of a family is the algebraic sum of the amounts received by all income recipients in the family.

The income tables for families and unrelated individuals include in the lowest income group (under \$1,000) those that were classified as having no income in the income year and those reporting a loss in net income from farm and nonfarm self-employment or in rental income. Many of these were living on income "in kind," savings, or gifts; or were newly constituted families, unrelated individuals who had recently left families, or families in which the sole breadwinner had recently died or had left the household. However, many of the families and unrelated individuals who reported no income probably had some money income which was not recorded in the survey.

Median income. The median income is the amount which divides the distribution into two

equal groups, one having incomes above the median, and the other having incomes below the median.

Mean income. The mean income is the amount obtained by dividing the total income of a group by the number of families or unrelated individuals (as appropriate) in that group.

Income per family member. The income per family member is the average amount of income available to every man, woman, and child in a family. Income per family member is derived by dividing the total family income of a group by the number of family members in the same group.

Comparability of Current Population Survey income data with other data from Bureau of Economic Analysis (BEA) personal income series. The income data presented in this report are not directly comparable with estimates of aggregate personal income prepared by the Bureau of Economic Analysis (formerly the Office of Business Economics) of the Department of Commerce. The lack of correspondence stems from the following differences in definition and coverage:

Income definition. The personal income series includes, among other items, the following types of nonmoney income which are not included in the census definition: Wages received in kind, the value of food and fuel produced and consumed on farms, the net rental value of owner-occupied homes, the property income received by mutual life insurance companies, and the value of the services of banks and other financial intermediaries rendered to persons without the assessment of specific charges. These items of income in kind account for about 4 percent of total personal income. The Census Bureau definition of income, on the other hand, includes such items as regular contributions for support received from persons who do not reside in the same living quarters, income received from roomers and boarders residing in households, and employee contributions for social insurance which are not included in the personal income series. These items, however, represent a much smaller income total than the nonmoney items included in personal income.

Source of data. The personal income series is estimated largely on the basis of data derived from business and governmental sources. These sources include the industrial and population censuses, employers' wage reports under the Social Security programs, and records of disbursements to individuals by governmental agencies. The income data presented in the census reports, on the other hand, are based directly

on field surveys of households. As discussed in the section "Source and reliability of the estimates," income data obtained in household interviews are subject to various types of reporting errors which tend to produce an understatement of income. It is estimated that the income surveys conducted by the Bureau of the Census during the past few years have obtained about 89 percent of the comparable aggregate total money income, 97 percent of the comparable aggregate money wage or salary income, 84 percent of the comparable aggregate money Social Security income, and 73 percent of the comparable aggregate money public assistance income included in the personal income series prepared by the BEA. Comparable estimates are not available for the low-income population.

Low-Income (Poverty) Definition. Low-income statistics presented in this report are based on a definition developed by the Social Security Administration in 1964 and revised by a Federal Interagency Committee in 1969.

Statistics presented in Census Bureau reports prior to publication of *Current Population Reports*, Series P-60, No. 68, "Poverty in the United States, 1959 to 1968," were based on the poverty index developed by the Social Security Administration (SSA) in 1964. This index provided a range of income cutoffs adjusted by such factors as family size, sex of the family head, number of children under 18 years old, and farm-nonfarm residence. At the core of this definition of poverty was a nutritionally adequate food plan ("economy" plan) designed by the Department of Agriculture for "emergency or temporary use when funds are low." The SSA poverty cutoffs also took into account differences in the cost of living between farm and nonfarm families. Annual revisions of these cutoffs were based on price changes of the items in the economy food budget.

As a result of deliberations of a Federal Interagency Committee in 1969, the following two modifications to the original SSA definition of poverty were recommended: (1) that the SSA thresholds for nonfarm families be retained for the base year 1963, but that annual adjustments in the levels be based on changes in the Consumer Price Index (CPI) rather than on changes in the cost of food included in the economy food plan; and (2) that the farm thresholds be raised from 70 to 85 percent of the corresponding nonfarm levels. The combined impact of these two modifications resulted in an increase of 360,000 poor families and 1.6 million poor persons in 1967. The reasons for making these changes are outlined below.

Change in cost of living adjustment. Annual revisions of the SSA poverty thresholds were based only on the average per capita cost of the foods in the economy food budget. This method of updating these cutoffs did not fully reflect increases in the overall cost of living during the 1960's. The pace at which the general cost of living advanced in recent years was not uniformly matched by increases in the price of goods in the economy food plan. Thus, general price changes since 1959 were not paralleled by comparable changes in the poverty thresholds.

The differences between changes in the cost of the economy food budget and the overall cost of living led to the adoption of the CPI as the basis for annual revisions in the income cutoffs. Although the CPI is not designed to measure the changing market conditions faced solely by low-income families, it does reflect the fact that prices of food and nonfood commodities do not always advance at the same rate. Employing the CPI to adjust the low-income thresholds annually has another advantage over the earlier adjustment technique. Although the economy food plan is repriced annually, the data are not published regularly but are available only on request. The CPI, on the other hand, is regularly published and is a generally accepted measure of changes in the "cost of living." Table A-1 shows the changes in the CPI between 1959 and 1972 and the corresponding average thresholds for a nonfarm family of four.

Change in the farm-nonfarm relationship. Under the old definition, the poverty thresholds for farm families were adjusted for the average value of food consumed by these families which they had grown themselves. Based on a 1961 study of household consumption which indicated that the value of food produced by farm families for home use amounted to about 30 percent of their total food budget, the poverty cutoffs for farm families were established at 70 percent of the nonfarm levels.

Up to the present time, no entirely satisfactory means of determining the income required for equivalent levels of living for farm and nonfarm families has been provided by studies on this subject. Further research is needed to analyze the differences in the costs between farm and nonfarm families. Although it is not yet possible to quantify exactly all the factors contributing to cost of living differences between farm and nonfarm families, research already completed suggests that the differences are not as great as provided for by the 70 percent differential. After weighing the available evidence, the Review Committee agreed that narrowing the farm-nonfarm differential to 85 percent more nearly reflects the overall cost of living differences between farm and nonfarm families than the previously used differential.

Alternate levels. Because the low-income level currently in use by the Federal Government does not meet all the needs of the analysts of the data, two variations of the poverty definition were introduced at the same time that modifications were made to the SSA poverty index--one is set at 75 percent of the official government standard and the other at 125 percent of this standard. The alternate cutoffs are obtained by multiplying the income cutoffs at the low-income level by 0.75 and 1.25. Thus, the income cutoffs for a nonfarm family of four at 75 percent and 125 percent of the low-income level are \$3,206 and \$5,344, respectively. Table 2 of this report presents selected data on persons below 125 percent of low-income level. Also, all the data presented in detailed tables 7, 21, 22, 24, 26-33, and 43 of this report have been tabulated for these additional levels and are available upon request for the years 1959 through 1972. Requests for these unpublished data, giving a specific description of the figures desired, may be made in writing to the Director, Bureau of the Census, Washington, D.C. 20233.

Weighted average thresholds at the low-income level. The low-income cutoffs used by the Bureau of the Census to determine the low-income status of families and unrelated individuals consist of a set of 124 thresholds arranged in a four-dimensional matrix consisting of family size (from one person, i.e., unrelated individuals, to seven or more person families) cross-classified by presence and number of family members under 18 years old (from no children present to six or more children present), sex of head, and farm-nonfarm residence. Unrelated individuals and two-person families are further differentiated by age of head (under 65 years and 65 years and over). The total family income of each family in the sample is tested against the appropriate dollar threshold to determine the low-income status of that family. If the family's total income is less than its corresponding cutoff, the family is classified as below the low-income level. The average thresholds shown in table A-2 were weighted by the presence and number of children. For example, for a given size of family, sex of head, and residence category, the weighted average threshold for that group is obtained by multiplying the threshold for each presence and number of children category within the given family size by the number of families in that category. These products are then aggregated across the entire range of presence and number of children categories, and the total aggregate is divided by the total number of families in the group to yield the weighted average threshold at the low-income level for that size family.

Because family composition varies by farm-nonfarm residence, the weighted average thresholds at the low-income level for farm families, as shown in table A-2 will not be exactly 85 percent of the nonfarm levels. Moreover, since family composition does not remain constant from year to year, the weighted average thresholds for 1972 will not reflect, identically, the change in the CPI between 1972 and earlier years.

Since the basic thresholds used to determine the low-income status of families and unrelated individuals are applied to all families and unrelated individuals, the weighted low-income thresholds are derived using all families and unrelated individuals rather than just those families and unrelated individuals classified as below the low-income level. To obtain the weighted low-income thresholds for families and unrelated individuals below 75 percent and below 125 percent of the low-income level, the weighted thresholds shown in table A-2 may be multiplied directly by 0.75 and 1.25, respectively.

Income deficit. Income deficit is the difference between the total income of families and unrelated individuals below the low-income level, and their respective income thresholds. In computing the income deficit, families reporting a net income loss are assigned zero dollars and for such cases the deficit is equal to the low-income threshold. This measure provides an estimate of the amount which would be required to raise the incomes of all low-income families and unrelated individuals to their respective low-income thresholds. The income deficit is thus a measure of the degree of impoverishment of a family or unrelated individual. However, caution must be exercised in comparing the average deficit of families of different racial groups. Since the low-income thresholds used in this report are based on family size and composition, apparent differences in the average income deficits of racial groups may, to some extent, be a function of the differences in these characteristics. It must also be remembered that the thresholds in this report vary according to the sex of the family head. Thus, differences in the average deficit between families with a male or female head may be in part attributable to both differences in thresholds and to differences in family size and composition.

Median income deficit. The median income deficit is the amount which divides the distribution into two equal groups, one having an income deficit above the median and the other having an income deficit below the median.

Mean income deficit. The mean income deficit is the amount obtained by dividing the total income deficit of a group below the low-income level by the number of families or unrelated individuals (as appropriate) in that group.

Deficit per family member. The deficit per family member is the average amount of money necessary to raise every man, woman, and child in a family out of poverty. The deficit per family member is derived by dividing the total family income deficit of a group by the number of family members in the same group.

Family. The term "family," as used in this report, refers to a group of two or more persons related by blood, marriage, or adoption and residing together; all such persons are considered as members of the same family. Thus, if the son of the head of the household and the son's wife are in the household, they are treated as part of the head's family. On the other hand, a lodger and his wife not related to the head of the household or an unrelated servant and his wife are considered as additional families, and not a part of the household head's family.

Head of family. One person in each family was designated as the head. The head of a family is usually the person regarded as the head by members of the family. Women are not classified as heads if their husbands are resident members of the family at the time of the survey. Married

couples related to the head of a family are included in the head's family and are not classified as separate families.

Subfamily. A subfamily is a married couple with or without children, or one parent with one or more own single children under 18 years old, living in a household and related to, but not including, the head of the household or his wife. The most common example of a sub-family is a young married couple sharing the home of the husband's or wife's parents. Members of a subfamily are also members of a primary family. The number of subfamilies, therefore, is not included in the number of families.

Marital status. The marital status classification refers to the status at the time of enumeration. "Separated" is regarded as a subdivision of the category "married" and includes persons with legal separations, those living apart with intentions of obtaining a divorce, and other persons permanently or temporarily separated because of marital discord.

Size of family. The term "size of family" refers to the number of persons who are living together and are related to each other by blood, marriage, or adoption.

Unrelated individual. The term "unrelated individuals," as used in this report, refers to persons 14 years old and over (other than inmates of institutions) who are not living with any relatives. An unrelated individual may constitute a one-person household by himself, or he may be part of a household including one or more other families or unrelated individuals, or he may reside in group quarters such as a rooming house. Thus, a widow living by herself or with one or more other persons not related to her, a lodger not related to the head of the household or to anyone else in the household, and a servant living in an employer's household with no relatives are examples of unrelated individuals.

Own children and related children. "Own" children in a family are sons and daughters, including stepchildren and adopted children, of the family head. "Related" children in a family include own children and all other children in the household who are related to the family head by blood, marriage, or adoption.

Number of earners. This number includes all persons in the family with \$1 or more in wages and salaries, or \$1 or more or a loss in net income from farm or nonfarm self-employment.

Age. The age classification is based on the age of the person at his last birthday.

Race. The population is divided into three groups on the basis of race: white, Negro, and "other races." The last category includes Indians, Japanese, Chinese, and any other race except white and Negro. "Other races" are usually shown in combination with the Negro population.

Origin or descent. Data on ethnic origin or descent were derived from responses to the question, "What is (this person's) origin or descent?" No attempt was made to define the terms but a flashcard was shown or a list was read, illustrative of types of ethnic origin. Some respondents having a diverse ethnic background or having several generations of residence in the United States may have reported the ethnic association they felt most strongly. For more detail, see Current Population Reports, Series P-20, No. 249, "Characteristics of the Population By Ethnic Origin: March 1972 and 1971."

The estimates of levels of the various ethnic origin groups in March 1973 are not strictly comparable with data from earlier current population surveys conducted in November 1969, March 1971, and March 1972. In 1969, origin was asked of persons of all ages. In subsequent years, the origin of children under 14 years of age was not asked but was assigned. In 1971 and 1972, the child was assigned the same origin classification as the head of the household, if known, or of the wife of the household head if the head's origin was not known.

In 1973, the origin of both the head and the wife were determined before assigning the child's origin. If the head and wife were of the same origin the child was assigned that origin; if they were of different origins the child was assigned to the "other" origin category. An exception was that if either the head or wife was of Spanish origin, the child was assigned Spanish origin.

The result of this difference in allocation procedures was to reduce the level of most of the specific categories in 1973 and to increase the residual "other" category, since rather substantial numbers of children live in households in which the head and wife are of different origins. Nevertheless, relative comparisons of one origin group to another in their social and economic characteristics are still valid.

Spanish origin. To reduce the sampling variability and thereby increase the reliability of the data for persons of Spanish origin, the number of "Spanish households" in the March 1973 CPS was doubled compared to earlier years. This was accomplished by interviewing in March 1973, in addition to the "regular" sample, the households

from the October 1972 sample containing at least one person of Spanish origin. Because of changes in sample design, question wording, and allocation procedures to assign origin to persons under 14 years of age, the overall count of persons of Spanish origin in the March 1973 CPS is not strictly comparable with data for earlier years. Comparability of Spanish origin data from the March 1973 CPS with those for earlier years will be more fully discussed in the forthcoming Series P-20 report on persons of Spanish origin.

Years of school completed. Data on years of school completed in this report were derived from the combination of answers to questions concerning the highest grade of school attended by the person and whether or not that grade was finished. The questions on educational attainment apply only to progress in "regular" schools. Such schools include graded public, private, and parochial elementary and high schools (both junior and senior high), colleges, universities, and professional schools, whether day schools or night schools. Thus, regular schooling is that which may advance a person toward an elementary school certificate or a high school diploma, or a college, university, or professional school degree. Schooling in other than regular schools was counted only if the credits obtained were regarded as transferable to a school in the regular school system.

The median years of school completed is defined as the value which divides the distribution into two equal groups, one having completed more schooling and one having completed less schooling than the median. These medians are expressed in terms of a continuous series of numbers representing years of school completed. For example, a median of 9.0 represents the completion of the first year of high school and a median of 13.0 means completion of the first year of college.

Labor force and employment status. The definitions of labor force and employment status in this report relate to family heads and unrelated individuals 14 years old and over.

Employed. Employed persons comprise (1) all civilians who, during the specified week, did any work at all as paid employees or in their own business or profession, or on their own farm, or who worked 15 hours or more as unpaid workers on a farm or in a business operated by a member of the family, and (2) all those who were not working but who had jobs or businesses from which they were temporarily absent because of illness, bad weather, vacation, or labor-management dispute, or because they were taking time off for personal reasons, whether or

not they were paid by their employers for time off, and whether or not they were seeking other jobs. Excluded from the employed group are persons whose only activity consisted of work around the house (such as own home housework, painting or repairing own home, etc.) or volunteer work for religious, charitable, and similar organizations.

Unemployed. Unemployed persons are those civilians who, during the survey week, had no employment but were available for work and (1) had engaged in any specific jobseeking activity within the past 4 weeks, such as registering at a public or private employment office, meeting with prospective employers, checking with friends or relatives, placing or answering advertisements, writing letters of application, or being on a union or professional register; (2) were waiting to be called back to a job from which they had been laid off; or (3) were waiting to report to a new wage or salary job within 30 days.

Labor force. Persons are classified as in the labor force if they were employed as civilians, unemployed, or in the Armed Forces during the survey week. The "civilian labor force" is comprised of all civilians classified as employed or unemployed.

Not in the labor force. All civilians 14 years old and over who are not classified as employed or unemployed are defined as "not in the labor force." This group who are neither employed nor seeking work includes persons engaged only in own home housework, attending school, or unable to work because of long-term physical or mental illness; persons who are retired or too old to work; seasonal workers for whom the survey week fell in an off season; and the voluntarily idle. Persons doing only unpaid family work (less than 15 hours) are also classified as not in the labor force.

Major activity in survey week. Persons are classified by major activity in survey week based on the response to the question, "What were you doing most of last week?" In this report, the only categories of major activity shown are "Going to school" and "Other."

Occupation of longest job. Persons are classified according to the civilian job held longest during the year. Persons who held two jobs or more were reported in the job at which they worked the greatest number of weeks.

The occupation and industry groupings included in this report were based on the classification system used in the 1970 census, as were the data included in the report on the low-income population in 1970, Series P-60, No. 81 and No. 86,

although the group titles may be worded somewhat differently. The earlier low-income reports utilized the 1960 census classification systems. A detailed comparison of the 1970 classification systems to those used during the 1960's may be found in the Bureau of the Census Technical Paper 26, 1970 Occupation and Industry Classification Systems in Terms of Their 1960 Occupation and Industry Elements. Additional information may be obtained from a paper "Changes Between 1960 and 1970 Census of Population" by Stanley Greene and John Priebe presented at the August 1972 American Statistical meetings held in Montreal, Canada. Also see "Revisions in Occupational Classifications for 1971" by John E. Bregger in Employment and Earnings, Volume 17, No. 8, page 5, published by the Bureau of Labor Statistics, United States Department of Labor.

In addition to the change in occupational titles between the March 1972 and the March 1971 surveys which did not affect the comparability of the data, a supplemental question, "What were your most important activities or duties?" was added which provided additional information for classifying persons by occupation. In general, the major impact of this supplemental question was to reclassify some persons from the "managers" classification into other types of occupations (primarily into the major occupation group of "craftsmen").

Work experience. A person with work experience is one who, during the preceding calendar year, did any civilian work for pay or profit or worked without pay on a family-operated farm or business at any time during the year, on a part-time or full-time basis.

Weeks worked in the income year. Persons are classified according to the number of different weeks during the preceding calendar year in which they did any civilian work for pay or profit (including paid vacations and sick leave) or worked without pay on a family-operated farm or business.

Part-time or full-time jobs. A person is classified as having worked at part-time jobs during the preceding calendar year if he worked at civilian jobs which provided less than 35 hours of work per week in a majority of the weeks in which he worked during the year. He is classified as having worked at full-time jobs if he worked 35 hours or more per week during a majority of the weeks in which he worked.

Year-round full-time worker. A year-round full-time worker is one who worked primarily at full-time civilian jobs (35 hours or more per week) for 50 weeks or more during the preceding calendar year.

Nonworker. A nonworker is one who did not do any civilian work in the calendar year preceding the survey.

Main reason for working part year. For persons who worked 1 to 49 weeks during the year, the main reason for working part year is based on the response to the question "What were you doing most of the remaining weeks?"

Main reason for not working. For persons who reported that they did not work at a civilian job for pay or profit or on a family-operated farm or business during the year, the main reason for not working is derived from the response to the question "What were you doing most of last year?"

Rounding. Percentages are rounded to the nearest tenth of a percent; therefore, the percentages in a distribution do not always add to exactly 100.0 percent. The totals, however, are always shown as 100.0. Moreover, individual figures are rounded to the nearest thousand without being adjusted to group totals, which are independently rounded; percentages are based on the unrounded numbers.

Base figures. An estimate of the size of the base (number of persons and families, etc.) of each percent is shown in most of the tables of this report. The 1972, 1971, and revised 1970 and 1969 base figures shown in this report were prepared by inflating weighted sample results to agree with independent estimates of the population based on statistics updated from the 1970 census. The base figures for the years 1961 to 1969 were inflated to estimates derived from the 1960 census. The data for the years prior to 1961 were based on the 1950 census.

The major effects resulting from the introduction of population controls and estimation procedures based on the 1970 census were to raise the number of families from 51.2 million to 51.6 million in the March 1970 CPS and to lower the number of related children under 18 from 69.8 to 68.7 million. However, the number of poor families and the number of related children below the low-income level remained about the same--5 million and about 9.5 million, respectively.

Comparability of Estimates From March 1973 CPS With Estimates for Previous Years

The data for 1972 and 1971 are in some instances not entirely comparable to figures for earlier years because of revisions in the Current Population Survey. Starting in January 1972,

1970 census-based population controls, metropolitan residence definitions, and other materials were introduced into the sample and estimation procedures. The major item affecting comparability at the overall national level is the introduction of population controls based on the 1970 census. Figures for previous years are tied in with 1960 census-based population controls. In a number of instances, data from the March 1970 and 1971 CPS's were revised to take account of 1970 census-based population controls, thus providing some measure of the impact of the change (see table 3). Basically, these changes should have no substantial impact on summary measures, such as medians and means, and on proportional measures, such as percent distributions and low-income or poverty rates. However, the changes may have more impact on the population levels in different subgroupings such as the total number of persons or families either overall, within some particular income interval, or below the low-income level. A detailed description of these changes appears in the Bureau of Labor Statistics report, "Employment and Earnings," Vol. 18, No. 8, February 1972.

The figures shown in this report for metropolitan areas (SMSA's) are based on the SMSA's as defined on the basis of the 1970 census; those published in earlier years referred to SMSA's as defined on the basis of the 1960 census. There are significant differences in the population classified as metropolitan from each of these definitions. For the 1970 definition of SMSA's, see U.S. Census of Population: 1970, NUMBER OF INHABITANTS, PC(1)-A1, United States Summary.

Another change in the Current Population Survey, which affects occupational data only, is the inclusion of a supplemental question, "What were your most important activities or duties?", which provided additional information for classifying persons by occupation. In general, the impact of this supplemental question was to reclassify some persons from the "managers" classification into other types of occupations (primarily into the major occupation group of "craftsmen").

Nonresponses and Allocations

In the March 1973 CPS, no information was recorded for approximately 5 percent of the 47,000 households because no interview could be obtained during the week in which the enumeration was conducted. In order to account for these households, the weights assigned to other sample households of similar characteristics residing in the same sample areas were increased accordingly. In addition, complete income information was not reported for about 17 percent of

all families and 12 percent of unrelated individuals 14 years old or over. Overall, about 12 percent of all persons 14 years old and over in households that were interviewed did not report complete income information.

For more detailed information on the characteristics of nonrespondents, see "Characteristics of Income Nonrespondents in the Current Population Survey," by Emmett Spiers, John Coder, and Mitsuo Ono, American Statistical Association Proceedings of the Social Statistics Section, 1971.

In order that the maximum amount of information can be utilized, missing income items are imputed or allocated by values which are obtained from active respondents with similar economic and demographic characteristics. Beginning with the March 1962 survey, when a respondent did not answer one or more of the income items, all of his income data were imputed.

Beginning with the March 1966 survey, however, in the event a respondent did not answer one or more of the income questions, the missing income data for this person were imputed for only those income items which were not answered. Each of the earnings items was handled individually, whereas income items other than earnings were handled as a group. Characteristics used in this imputation are age, family status, race, residence, weeks worked, and major occupation group. The income amount assigned to a nonrespondent is that observed for another person with similar demographic and economic characteristics who did respond and who has been selected systematically in the order in which individual records are processed.

In the tabulation of income from surveys prior to 1962, the distributions by income levels had been based only on those cases which reported complete income information. The assumption implicit in this method was that persons who do not provide income information have the same income distribution as those who do provide such information. Using income data for 1958, a comparison was made of the income distributions obtained before and after the assignment of income to nonrespondents on the basis of known demographic and economic characteristics. This comparison indicated that the procedure for making individual assignments of income to nonrespondents resulted in slightly higher estimates of the proportion of families and individuals in the upper income classes than those obtained from the distributions based solely on those reporting on income. (See Current Population Reports, Series P-60, No. 33, tables F and G.)

Beginning with the 1967 CPS, the Bureau of the Census introduced improved income edit and allocation procedures. The main feature of the new procedures is a more refined method for imputing missing income data which expands the use of information already known about that person. Among the major improvements made affecting the income data are the following: (1) an expanded set of social and economic characteristics within which the imputations are made; in addition to age, race, occupation, and weeks worked, the new procedures include sex and type of family member as major variables within which the missing income items are imputed; (2) the elimination of inconsistent reporting which resulted in having workers with no earnings and earners with no weeks worked; and (3) the new imputation procedure assigns missing earnings entries first and then utilizes the earnings information to assign missing sources of income other than earnings.

However, because of coding errors in the processing of the 1968 CPS data, in that year alone it was not possible to apply all the aforementioned improvements to the editing and allocation procedures. Since these errors produced an underestimate of income, they had the effect of overstating the number of poor.

In addition, it was discovered that the computer procedures for editing certain incorrect income codes caused an upward bias in the income data for some respondents and therefore would tend to produce an underestimate of the number of poor. It is estimated that the net impact of these errors had the effect of overestimating the number of poor families by about 120 thousand. Due to these errors affecting the income data for 1967, data for that year are not strictly comparable with those shown for 1966, and 1968 to 1972.

Comparison of 1966 poverty data according to original and revised editing and allocation procedures. In order to evaluate the impact of the new procedures, the poverty data from the March 1967 CPS were rerun, thus providing a bridge for the 1966 income year showing the results of both the earlier and the new procedures. Both series of data are shown in table 1. The general impact of the new allocation procedure was to shift the income distribution slightly upward, thus decreasing by 416,000 the number of poor families. A more detailed description of the new computer editing and allocation procedures may be found in Current Population Reports, Series P-60, No. 59, "Income in 1967 of Families in the United States," pages 17 to 19.

Modifications in collecting income data in the March-April 1969 CPS. Several modifications were introduced in the collection of income data in the March and April CPS supplements. These include (1) extension of the interview period of the six rotation groups for which income questions were asked in March and the use of followup forms in these six groups to accommodate household respondents who needed more time to obtain the required income information (it is estimated that some members of approximately 4,400 households, or 9 percent of the total relevant households, made use of these followup forms); (2) modification of the design and content of the questionnaire to allow for more detailed questioning of certain income items; thus, boxes for gross receipts, business expense, and net income have been added to the self-employment income questions to help the interviewer and respondent determine net income, and "yes-no" circles were added to the questions on income other than earnings in order to ascertain whether the respondent received or did not receive income; (3) field office editing procedures were extended to a 100 percent income edit of the CPS schedules; (4) training instructions were strengthened by including more detailed explanations and more examples; and (5) the interview group training session was shifted from February to March.

Modifications in collecting income data in the March 1970 Current Population Survey. The Bureau introduced modifications in the collection of income data for the March 1970 CPS supplement. These were: (1) An advance letter informing households about the collection of income data was mailed to all households except those in the first and fifth months. The latter households received special letters which explained the need for collecting both CPS and census data; (2) information on work experience and income was collected simultaneously for the full sample (in previous years, work experience information was collected separately from income data); (3) the interview period was extended one week for three-fourths of the sample (using followup calls and separate questionnaires). In addition, modified procedures which were incorporated in the March 1969 CPS supplement were also implemented in the March 1970 CPS. Overall, data indicate that the use of these procedures has resulted in some improvement in the collection of income data. The family income nonresponse rate has not only dropped by 5 percentage points (from 19 to 14 percent) but also it appears that the proportion of aggregate income amounts collected in the March 1970 CPS relative to benchmark totals has increased slightly in the March 1970 CPS supplement as compared with the proportion collected in the March 1969 CPS supplement.

Modifications in collecting income data in the March 1971 Current Population Survey. The Bureau continued to use the improved procedures which were incorporated in the March 1970 CPS. Procedural changes that were instituted in the March 1971 CPS, among others, were:

1. The interview period was extended one week for all households in the sample (using follow-up calls and separate questionnaires). In the previous year's survey, the interview period was extended for only three-fourths of the sample.

2. Income from net royalties was included in the question covering estates, trusts, or dividends, interest on savings accounts or bonds, and net rental income. In previous surveys, income from net royalties was included in the question covering private pensions, annuities, alimony, regular contributions from persons not living in this household, and anything else.

3. An additional regional office follow-up was made by telephone to obtain income amounts for all follow-up cases containing one or more persons who were not interviewed during the original follow-up period, except for refusal.

Overall, the family income nonresponse rate in March 1973 was 16.5 percent as compared to 13.7 percent in March 1972. The proportion of aggregate income amounts collected in the March 1973 CPS relative to benchmark totals was about the same as for the March 1972 CPS.

Although nonresponse rates for families by low-income status are not available, it is known that families in the lower income intervals tend to have lower nonresponse rates than those in the middle and upper income intervals. This is due in part to the fact that lower income families have less complicated financial arrangements than those in other income groups. For a more detailed discussion of this topic see paper by Mitsuo Ono and Herman P. Miller, "Income Nonresponses in the Current Population Survey," published in Proceedings of the Social Statistics Section, American Statistical Association, 1969.

Other Limitations of the Data

It is known that income data are usually under-reported in household surveys, such as the Current Population Survey (CPS), when compared with aggregate benchmark estimates derived from administrative records.

As noted previously, overall aggregate money income compiled in the CPS was about 90 percent of benchmark estimates in 1972. The proportion

of aggregate income compiled in the CPS ranged from a low of 45 percent for property income to a high of 98 percent for wage and salary income. The proportion picked up for Social Security and railroad retirement payments was 92 percent while the comparable rate for public assistance was 74 percent. These rates were 99 and 69 percent for nonfarm and farm self-employment income, respectively. Benchmark estimates are compiled from data provided by the Bureau of Economic Analysis, Social Security Administration, Veterans' Administration, etc. For more details regarding the procedures to develop benchmark data, see the following: (1) "Appraisal of Basic Data Available for Constructing Income Size Distributions" by Selma F. Goldsmith, published in Studies in Income and Wealth, Volume 13, National Bureau of Economic Research, 1951 and (2) "Size Distribution of Family Personal Income: Methodology and Estimates for 1964," by Edward C. Budd, Daniel B. Radner, and John C. Hinrichs, Bureau of Economic Analysis, BEA-SP 73-21, June 1973.

Although every effort is made to reduce the errors of underreporting, nonreporting or mis-reporting of income data in the Current Population Survey, they still occur because of various reasons. Some of these are (1) overlooking income received, especially small amounts of income types not regularly received, e.g., contributions from nonhousehold members, (2) reluctance to reveal certain types of income, e.g., public assistance, (3) rounding estimates, (4) misunderstanding the question, (5) lack of information, especially covering family members not present at the time of interview, (6) interviewers' errors, (7) processing errors, etc. For more details on this topic of income underreporting in censuses and surveys, see (1) Income Distribution in the United States (a 1960 Census Monograph), by Herman P. Miller, Bureau of the Census, 1966, (2) The Structure of Income, by Irving B. Kravis, University of Pennsylvania, 1962, and (3) "Size Distribution of Family Personal Income: Methodology and Estimates for 1964" cited earlier in this section.

Source and Reliability of the Estimates

Source of data. The estimates for 1970, 1971, and 1972 are based on data obtained in March 1971, March 1972, and March 1973, respectively, in the Current Population Survey (CPS) of the Bureau of the Census. In March 1973 the sample was spread over 461 areas comprising 923 counties and independent cities with coverage in each of the 50 States and the District of Columbia. As of July 1971 approximately 47,000 occupied households have been eligible for interview each month. Of this number 2,000 occupied units, on

the average, were visited but interviews were not obtained because the occupants were not found at home after repeated calls or were unavailable for some other reason. In addition to the 47,000, there were also about 8,000 sample units in an average month which were visited but were found to be vacant or otherwise not to be interviewed. From January 1967 through July 1972 the sample was spread over 449 areas, and from January 1967 through June 1971 approximately 50,000 occupied housing units were eligible for interview each month. For data collected in years prior to 1967, the sample was spread over fewer areas with fewer interview households. Prior to the March 1966 survey, income data were collected from only 75 percent of the households included in the CPS. See Current Population Reports, Series P-23, No. 22, "Concepts and Methods Used in Manpower Statistics from the Current Population Survey," June 1967, pp. 7-10, for more information about the sample design.

The estimating procedure used for the March 1970-1973 data involved the inflation of the weighted sample results to independent estimates of the civilian noninstitutional population of the United States by age, race, and sex. These independent estimates were based on statistics from the 1970 Census of Population; statistics of births, deaths, immigration and emigration; and statistics on the strength of the Armed Forces. To these totals were added the population in the Armed Forces living off post or with their families on post. (Report No. 81 in this series showed somewhat different figures for 1970 since the data in that report were inflated to independent estimates of the population based on 1960 Census data.)

For data collected in the Current Population Surveys in the years 1960-69, the independent estimates used were based on statistics from the 1960 Census of Population. To show comparable poverty data for 1969 and 1959 by detailed type of residence, it was necessary to use data from the 1960 census for 1959 estimates rather than from the 1960 CPS. In table 3, 1959 data based on 1960 census data are identified as such; other tables for 1959 are based on 1960 CPS data. The type of residence classification used in the 1960 CPS was based on data from the 1950 Census. Therefore to achieve comparability with March 1970 CPS data, special tabulations of poverty data from the 53,000 households in the 1-in-1,000 sample of 1960 census data were prepared. The 1972, 1971, and 1969 revised data by residence are based on the 1970 census residence definition; therefore, they are not strictly comparable to data for earlier years which are based on 1960 census metropolitan area definition.

Reliability of the estimates. Since the estimates in this report are based on a sample, they differ somewhat from the figures that would have been obtained from a complete census, using the same schedules, instructions, and enumerators. Particular care should be exercised in the interpretation of figures based on a relatively small number of cases as well as small differences between figures. As in any survey work, the results are subject to errors of response and non-reporting as well as being subject to sampling variability.

In most cases, the schedule entries for income are based on memory rather than on records, and, in the majority of cases, on the memory or knowledge of one person, usually the wife of the family head. The memory factor in data derived from field surveys of income produces underestimates because the tendency is to forget minor or irregular sources of income. These errors of reporting are due to misrepresentation or to misunderstanding as to the scope of the income concept.

The standard error is primarily a measure of sampling variability, that is, of the variations that occur by chance because a sample rather than the whole of the population is surveyed. As calculated for this report, the standard error also partially measures the effect of response and enumeration errors, but it does not measure, as such, any systematic biases in the data. The chances are about 68 out of 100 that an estimate from the sample would differ from a complete census figure by less than the standard error. The chances are about 90 out of 100 that this difference would be less than 1.6 times the standard error, and the chances are about 95 out of 100 that the difference would be less than twice the standard error.

All statements of comparison appearing in the text are significant at a 1.6 standard error level or better. Most are significant at a level of more than 2.0 standard errors. Thus, for most differences cited in the text, the estimated difference is greater than twice the standard error of the difference. Statements of comparison qualified in some way (e.g., by use of the phrase "some evidence") have a level of significance between 1.6 and 2.0 standard errors.

The figures presented in tables A-3 through A-8 are approximations to the standard errors of various estimates shown in this report. In order to derive standard errors that would be applicable to a wide variety of items and could be prepared at a moderate cost, a number of

approximations were required. As a result, the tables of standard errors provided are an indication of the order of magnitude rather than the precise standard error for any specific item.

Tables A-3 and A-5 contain the standard errors of estimates of the number of persons for the years 1966-1972. Tables A-4 and A-6 contain the standard errors of estimates of the number of families for the years 1966-1972. Tables A-4 and A-6 also should be used for items which can typically appear only once in a given family, e.g., "Number of male heads of families." Standard errors for unrelated individuals are also found in these two tables.

The reliability of an estimated percentage, computed by using sample data for both numerator and denominator, depends upon both the size of the percentage and the size of the total upon which the percentage is based. Estimated percentages are relatively more reliable than the corresponding absolute estimates of the numerator of the percentage, particularly if the percent is 50 percent or more.

Table A-7 shows the standard errors of estimated percentages of persons for the years 1966-1972. Table A-8 shows the standard errors of estimated percentages of families for the years 1966-1972. The guidelines used to decide whether tables A-3, A-4, A-5, or A-6 are appropriate for a particular item should also be used for deciding between the use of tables A-7 and A-8.

Note when using small estimates. Percentage distributions are shown in this report only when the base of the percentage is greater than 75,000. Because of the large standard errors involved, there is little chance that percentages would reveal useful information when computed on a smaller base. Estimated totals are shown, however, even though the relative standard errors of these totals are larger than those for the corresponding percentages. These smaller estimates are provided primarily to permit such combinations of the categories as serve each user's needs.

Data obtained from the Current Population Survey and 1-in-1000 sample of the 1960 Census are not entirely comparable. This is due in large part to differences in interviewer training and experience and in the differing survey processes. This is an additional component of error not reflected in the standard error tables. Therefore, caution should be used in comparing results between these different sources.

Standard errors for CPS data for 1959-1965 can be approximated by multiplying the appropriate 1972 table entry by 1.4. Standard errors for the 1960 1-in-1,000 sample data can be approximated by multiplying the appropriate 1972 table entry by .6. Standard errors for CPS data for 1972 which involve persons of Spanish origin can be approximated by multiplying the table entry in tables A-3, A-5 and A-7 by 1.7. The appropriate factor for families (tables A-4, A-6 and A-8) is 1.2.

Illustration of the use of tables of standard errors. Table H of this report shows that in 1972 there were 2,158,000 total female headed families below the low-income level. Table A-4 shows the standard error on an estimate of this size to be approximately 44,000. The chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimate would have been a figure differing from a complete census figure by less than 44,000. The chances are 95 out of 100 that the estimate would have differed from a complete census figure by less than 88,000 (twice the standard error).

Of these 2,158,000 total female headed families below the low-income level, 1,135,000 or 52.6 percent were white female headed families below the low-income level. Table A-8 shows the standard error of 52.6 percent on a base of 2,158,000 to be approximately 1.1. Consequently, chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimated 52.6 percent would be within 1.1 percentage points of a complete census figure, and chances are 95 out of 100 that the estimate would be within 2.2 percentage points of a complete census figure; i.e. this 95 percent confidence interval would be from 50.4 to 54.8 percent.

Differences. For a difference between two sample estimates, the standard error is approximately equal to the square root of the sum of the squares of the standard errors of each estimate considered separately. This formula will represent the actual standard error quite accurately for the difference between two estimates of the same characteristic in two different areas, or for the difference between separate and uncorrelated characteristics in the same area. If, however, there is a high positive correlation between the two characteristics, the formula will overstate the true standard error.

Illustration of the computation of the standard error of a difference. Table H of this report shows that there are 2,917,000 total male headed families below the low-income level. Thus, the apparent difference between the female heads below the low-income level and male heads below the low-income level is 759,000. The standard error of 2,158,000 total female headed families below the low-income level for 1972 is 44,000 as shown above. Table A-4 shows the standard error on an estimate of 2,917,000 to be approximately 51,000. The standard error of the estimated difference of 759,000 is about

$67,000 = \sqrt{(44,000)^2 + (51,000)^2}$. This means the chances are 68 out of 100 that the estimated difference based on the samples would differ from the difference derived using complete census figures by less than 67,000. The 68 percent confidence interval around the 759,000 difference is from 692,000 to 826,000, i.e., $759,000 \pm 67,000$. A conclusion that the average estimate of the difference derived from all possible samples lies within a range computed in this way would be correct for roughly 68 percent of all possible samples. The 95 percent confidence interval is 625,000 to 893,000 and thus we can conclude with 95 percent confidence that the number of total male headed families below the low-income level in 1972 is actually greater than the total female headed families below the low-income level in 1972.

Computation of the standard error of a mean. To get a rough estimate of the standard error of a mean, the following formula can be used:

$$\sigma_{\bar{x}}^2 = \hat{R} \left[\frac{\sum_{i=1}^c p_i x_i^2}{n} - \bar{x}^2 \right]$$

where n is the weighted total number of cases in all c classes. p_i is the percentage of total cases in the i^{th} class.

x_i is the midpoint of the i^{th} class.

\bar{x} is the mean value of the distribution $\sum_{i=1}^c p_i x_i$.

 $\hat{R} = 5600$ for persons

R is a constant which depends on the sample size, the sample design, and the estimation procedure. In this report, $\hat{R} = f_i R$ where $R = 1400$ and f_i ($i=1,2$) is a correction factor which attempts to compensate for the underestimate of variance obtained from the above formula. To obtain an estimated standard error for a mean value, find $\sigma_{\bar{x}}^2$ and take the square root.

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
