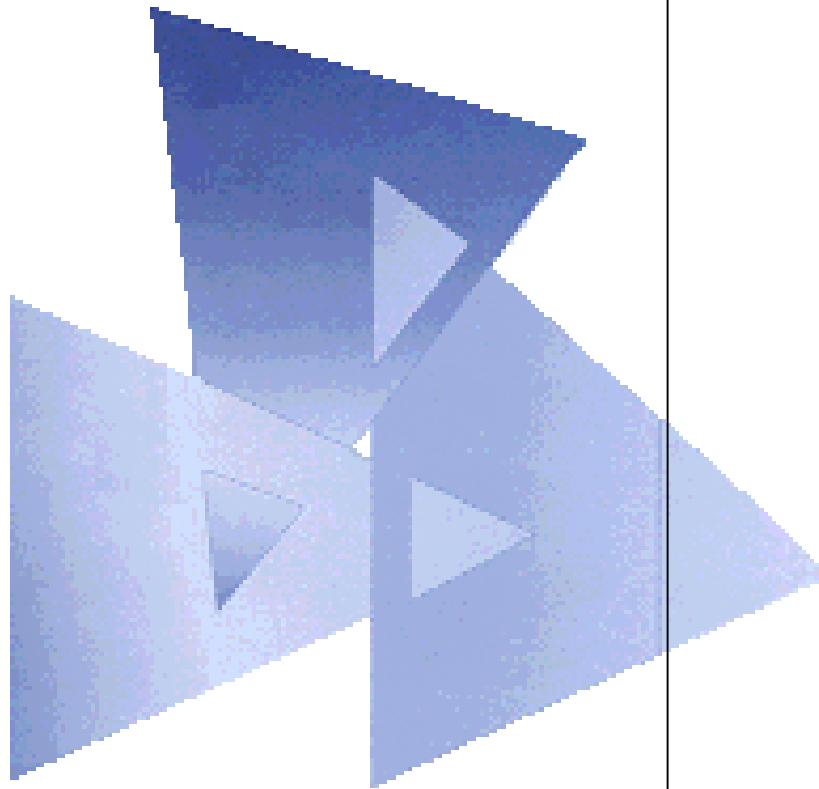

INTRODUCTION

The United States Census Bureau conducts an Annual Survey of Government Employment, as authorized by law under Title 13, United States Code, Section 182. Alternatively, every five years, in years ending in a '2' or '7', a Census of Governments, including an Employment portion, is conducted under Title 13, Section 161. For both the Census and this 2000 annual survey, the employment detail is equivalent.

The tables contained here provide a summary of the annual survey findings for state and local governments for 2000. The tables contain detail of full-time, part-time and full-time equivalent employment and payroll by type of government and function, as well as employment, payroll, and average earnings in selected individual counties, municipalities, townships, special districts, and school systems. SCOPE OF COVERAGE

The basic reporting unit of Census Bureau statistics on public employment is the individual government, including the federal government. Although not displayed in this summary publication, federal government employment and payroll data can be found at the Governments Division website at www.census.gov/govs/www/apesfed.html.

Governments include not only the central government but also those agencies, institutions, and authorities which are connected to it. To determine which of the many organizations with governmental or quasi-governmental character should be included in its statistics on the public sector, the Bureau has created the set of criteria below.

Types of Government Entities

Government services are provided through a complex structure made up of numerous public bodies and agencies. The Census Bureau identified 87,504 governments during the 1997 Census of Governments. The frame of the 2000 survey also includes births and deaths identified between 1997 and 2000. In addition to the Federal Government and the 50 state governments, the Bureau recognizes five basic types of local governments, as follows (per 1997 Census):

- County Governments* (3,043), which exist in all states except Connecticut, Rhode Island, and the District of Columbia, are created to provide general government activities in specified geographic areas. They include entities called boroughs in Alaska, parishes in Louisiana, and counties in all other states.
- Municipal Governments* (19,372), which are established to provide general local government services for a specific population concentration in a defined area. They include cities, boroughs (except in Alaska), towns (except in the six New

England states, Minnesota, New York and Wisconsin), and villages (ranked by size). Composite city-county governments are treated as municipal governments for Census Bureau purposes.

- *Township Governments* (16,629), which are established to provide general local government services for areas without regard to population concentrations. They include towns in the six New England states, Minnesota, New York and Wisconsin, and townships in eleven other states.
- *Special District Governments* (34,683), which are established to provide only one or a limited number of designated functions and have sufficient administrative and fiscal autonomy to qualify as independent governments.
- *School District Governments* (13,726), which are created to provide public elementary, secondary, and/or higher education and have sufficient administrative and fiscal autonomy to qualify as independent governments. They exclude school systems that are "dependent" on a county, municipal, township, or state government.

Definition of a Government Entity

In summary, a government entity is defined for Census Bureau reporting as follows:

A government is an organized entity, which, in addition to having governmental character, has sufficient discretion in the management of its own affairs to distinguish it as separate from the administrative structure of any other governmental unit.

Thus, to be regarded as a government for Census Bureau purposes, an entity must possess all three of these critical attributes: existence as an organized entity, governmental character, and substantial autonomy.

GENERAL CONCEPTS

This report uses a number of terms that, in other contexts, might have different meanings. Further, some of the tabular presentations contain concepts that are not commonly used or easily understood. If the following does not provide sufficient information, please write to the Chief, Governments Division, United States Census Bureau.

Current Dollars

The statistics in these tables are in terms of current dollar amounts. They have not been adjusted for price or wage level changes occurring through the years.

Employment and employees

Employment, as used in this report, refers to all persons gainfully employed by and performing services for a government. Employees include all persons paid for personal services performed, including persons paid from federally funded programs, paid elected officials, persons in paid leave status, and persons paid on a per meeting, annual, semiannual, or quarterly basis. Unpaid officials, pensioners, persons whose work is performed on a fee basis, and contractors and their employees are excluded from the count of employees. *Full-time employees* are defined to include those persons whose hours of work represent full-time employment in their employer government; *part-time employees* are those persons who work less than the standard number of hours for full-time work in their employer government.

Full-time equivalent employment

The term "full-time equivalent employment" refers to a computed statistic representing the number of full-time employees that could have been employed if the reported number of hours worked by part-time employees had been worked by full-time employees. This statistic is calculated separately for each function of a government by dividing the "part-time hours paid" by the standard number of hours for full-time employees in the particular government and then adding the resulting quotient to the number of full-time employees.

March payroll

Payroll amounts shown in this report represent gross payrolls for the 1-month period of March 2000. The gross payroll includes all salaries, wages, fees, or commissions paid to employees during the pay period which included the date of March 12, 2000. Payroll amounts reported for a period other than 1 month were converted to represent an amount for the month of March.

Average March earnings

Average March earnings shown are for full-time employees only and represent the quotient of full-time employee payroll divided by the number of full-time employees.

COLLECTION OF DATA

The data collection phase for the annual survey made use of two methods to obtain data: mail canvass and central collection. Federal government data were compiled by Census Bureau staff from records of the U.S. Office of Personnel Management. In 32 states and 59 large local governments and school systems, all or part of the data were obtained from cooperative arrangements between the Census Bureau and the government. These usually involved a data collection effort carried out to meet the needs of both agencies -- the government for purposes of audit, oversight, or information, and the Census Bureau for statistical purposes.

Data for the balance of state and local governments in this annual survey were obtained via mail questionnaires sent directly to state, county, municipal, township and special district governments. Mail canvass questionnaires, tailored to each type of local government, requested information on:

- The number of full-time and part-time employees paid for the pay interval that included the date of March 12, 2000,
- Full-time employees' and part-time employees' gross pay for the pay interval that included the date of March 12, 2000,
- The number of paid hours of work for part-time employees during the reported pay interval,
- The length of reported pay interval, and
- The standard number of weekly hours of work for the majority of your full-time employees.

Questionnaires for county, municipal, and township governments requested data on employment, pay, and part-time employee hours paid by government function; school system questionnaires requested data on instructional and noninstructional employment, pay, and part-time employee hours paid for elementary/secondary level education and for college level education; single function special districts (except fire protection districts) reported on a questionnaire that requested employment, pay, and part-time employee hours paid; questionnaires for fire protection districts and multifunctional special districts requested data on employment, pay, and part-time employee hours paid by function. Each type of questionnaire contained descriptions and instructions for each requested data category.

In Florida, North Carolina, North Dakota, and Washington, data for elementary and secondary school systems were supplied by officials of the State education agency rather than by local school officials on mail canvass questionnaires.

Information supplied by respondents was electronically recorded and edited for consistency and reasonableness. Incomplete replies and responses containing information that failed consistency and/or reasonableness tests were referred to trained Census Bureau personnel for review and possible follow up. Additional or corrected information obtained in the review of these 'failed edit' cases were then entered into the electronic data records.

Data collection began with a late March mail out, and the final file was released on the Internet on July 25, 2001.

SAMPLE DESIGN

The survey was based on a national probability sample of state and local governments. The sample design objective was to produce state by type-of-government estimates with a relative standard error of 3 percent or less for full-time equivalent and total payroll. The non-certainty governments were selected for the sample based on a probability proportional to the size, as determined by full-time equivalent and total payroll of the unit.

Regression estimates were used to obtain most of the estimates of population values from the sample data and to estimate the reliability of these population estimates.

LIMITATIONS OF DATA

Reporting of government employment by the Census Bureau involves presentation of data in terms of uniform categories. This uniformity helps ensure comparable measures among the many governments covered in the survey, and also enables data to be aggregated by state area and nationally. Each category is defined using established criteria. Each state and local government item is analyzed and assigned to a classification category in accordance with the standard definition and criteria. While often similar to, or identical to, the classification used by the state or local government, there could be instances where a significant difference exists between the name of a state or local item and the final category to which it is assigned by the Census Bureau.

Nonresponse

Some local governments did not provide data requested in the survey and no secondary sources of data were available on these units. For such cases, either one of the two things was done:

1. If a non-responding governmental unit existed in the prior year, then its missing values were replaced with its prior year values, adjusted by the mean growth rates within a group of like units of similar size in the same state;
2. If the unit is a newly emerging unit, then a donor was randomly selected among respondents in the group of like units, with a per capita adjustment applied to the donor's values.

For this publication, we did not publish the imputations for the individual governments. The data are marked NA.

Reporting Errors

Extensive measures were taken to reduce reporting errors for this census. The mail canvass questionnaires contained detailed definitions and reporting instructions to assist local government officials in their preparation of replies and to facilitate uniform

interpretation and reporting procedures. Each questionnaire also contained a Census Bureau telephone number that local officials could call to obtain additional clarification and assistance from subject matter specialists. However, human and mechanical errors occur in any mass statistical operation, including omissions, misinterpretations, errors in reporting, errors in the electronic recording of data, errors in the clerical review and adjustment of electronically identified problem data, and at other stages of data processing. Procedures were applied at each stage of processing this phase of the survey to keep human and mechanical errors at an acceptable low level.

Individual Governments and Geographic Area Data

Data in this report relate only to individual governments and their dependent agencies and do not include amounts for other local governments in the same geographic location. For example, county, municipal or township government expenditure figures for education do not include spending by separate school districts that administer public schools within many areas. Variations in the assignment of governmental responsibility—especially important in the areas of public welfare, health, hospitals, and public housing—also have an important effect upon reported amounts of individual government employment and payroll data.

Interstate comparisons should also take the allocation of governmental responsibilities into account. Refer to the section on “Individual State Descriptions,” in Volume 1, No. 1, *Government Organization* (1997 Census of Governments) for a State-by-State explanation of the legal structure of local government.

A number of municipalities differ from the overwhelming majority in that they operate, either specifically by law or in effect, as composite city-county governments. This group includes New York City, Philadelphia, and several other of the most populous cities in the Nation. One of these cities—Washington, DC—is unique in that it has no overlying State government and thus provides certain services commonly provided by States, as well as various county-type services.

STATISTICAL RELIABILITY

The local government statistics in this survey were developed from a sample survey. Therefore, the local totals, as well as state and local aggregates, are considered estimated amounts subject to sampling error.

The statistics in this report that are based wholly or partly on data from the sample are apt to differ somewhat from the results of a survey covering all governments, but otherwise conducted using the same schedules and procedures. Estimates based on a sample survey are subject to sampling variability. The particular sample used is one of a large number of all possible samples of the same size that could have been selected using the same sample design. Each of the possible samples would yield somewhat different results.

The standard error is a measure of the variation among the estimates from all possible samples and thus is a measure of the precision with which an estimate from a particular sample approximates the average results of all possible samples. In this report, table 2 contains the coefficients of variation that have been computed for the summary estimates (columns 1 and 3) shown in table 1. The coefficient of variation is the estimated standard error expressed as a percent of the estimated total or proportion.

State government finance data are not subject to sampling. Consequently, State-local aggregates shown here for individual States are more reliable (on a relative standard error basis) than the local government estimates they include. Estimates of major United States totals for local governments are subject to a computed sampling variability of less than one-half of 1 percent. State and local government totals are generally subject to sampling variability of less than 3 percent.

The estimates are also subject to inaccuracies in classification, response, and processing. Efforts were made at all phases of collection, processing, and tabulation to minimize errors. However, the data are still subject to errors from estimating for missing data, errors from misreported data, errors from miscoding, and difficulties in identifying every unit that should be included in the report. Every effort was made to keep such errors to a minimum through care in examining, editing, and tabulating the data reported by government officials.

Response to the sample survey is an important consideration in evaluating the quality of the estimates. For the 2000 annual survey, usable responses were available from approximately 84 percent of the state and local governments.

Appendix A.

Definition of Selected Terms

An understanding of the terms used in this report is necessary to interpret the statistical findings properly. These terms are grouped in the following categories: Government Units and Types of Governments and Government Functions.

GOVERNMENT UNITS AND TYPES OF GOVERNMENTS

Government Units--A government is an organized entity whose governmental character is evidenced by popular election of the officials or their appointment by public officials, a high degree of public accountability, and the power to raise revenue to provide authorized services. In addition, a governmental unit must have sufficient discretion in the management of its own affairs to distinguish it from the administrative structure of any other government unit.¹

TYPES OF GOVERNMENTS

State Governments--Refers to the governments of the 50 States which constitute the United States

Local Governments--The Census Bureau recognizes five basic types of local governments. Of these five types, three are general purpose governments--county and subcounty general purpose (municipal and township) governments. Municipal and township governments are distinguished primarily by the historical circumstances surrounding their incorporation. The other two types are special purpose governments--school district governments and special district governments. These types of governments are briefly described as follows:

1. County governments--Organized local governments authorized in State constitutions and statutes and established to provide general government; includes those governments designated as boroughs in Alaska, as parishes in Louisiana, and as counties in other States.
2. Municipal governments--Organized local governments authorized in State constitutions and statutes and established to provide general government for a defined area; includes those governments designated as cities, boroughs (except in Alaska), towns (except in the six New England States, Minnesota, New York, and Wisconsin), and villages. This concept corresponds generally to the "incorporated places" that are recognized in Census Bureau reporting of population and housing statistics, subject to an important qualification--the count of municipal governments in this report excludes places that are currently governmentally inactive.
3. Township governments--Organized local governments authorized in State constitutions and statutes and established to provide general government for a defined area; includes those governments designated as towns in Connecticut, Maine (including organized

plantations), Massachusetts, Minnesota, New Hampshire (including organized locations), New York, Rhode Island, Vermont, and Wisconsin, and townships in other States.

4. School district governments--Organized local entities providing public elementary, secondary, and/or higher education which, under State law, have sufficient administrative and fiscal autonomy to qualify as separate governments. Excludes "dependent public school systems" of county, municipal, township, or State governments.

5. Special district governments--All organized local entities other than the four categories listed above, authorized by State law to provide only one or a limited number of designated functions, and with sufficient administrative and fiscal autonomy to qualify as separate governments; known by a variety of titles, including districts, authorities, boards, commissions, etc., as specified in the enabling State legislation.

Government Functions

Employment and payrolls of governments are classified according to the major function or activity of the agency, office, or other organizational entity in which the individual is employed. Following is a brief description of each functional category used in this report:

Air transportation--Operation and support of publicly operated airport facilities.

All other and unallocable--The use of this classification varies from table to table in this report; in each tabulation, however, this classification represents all activities not individually specified.

Correction--Activities pertaining to the confinement and correction of adults and minors convicted of criminal offenses. Pardon, probation, and parole activities are also included here.

Electric power--Activities associated with the production or acquisition and distribution of electric power.

Elementary and secondary education--All activities associated with the operation of public elementary and secondary schools and locally operated vocational-technical schools. Special education programs operated by elementary and secondary school systems are also included as are all ancillary services associated with the operation of schools, such as pupil transportation and food service. *Instructional employees* includes not only classroom teachers, but also principals, supervisors of instruction, librarians, teacher aides, library aides, and guidance and psychological personnel. *Other employees* includes all persons not included as instructional employees (e.g., school superintendents and other administrative personnel, clerical and secretarial staffs, plant operation and maintenance personnel, health and recreation employees, transportation and food service personnel, and any student employees).

Financial administration--Includes activities concerned with tax assessment and collection, custody and disbursement of funds, debt management, administration of trust funds, budgeting, and other government wide financial management activities. This function is not applied to school district or special district governments.

Fire protection--Applies to local government fire protection and prevention activities plus any ambulance, rescue, or other auxiliary services provided by a fire protection agency. Volunteer firefighters, if remunerated for their services on a "per fire" or some other basis, are included as part-time employees. The subcategory of firefighters shown in this report includes personnel trained and/or engaged in fire suppression and prevention.

Full-time equivalent employment--A computed statistic representing the number of full-time employees that could have been employed if the reported number of hours worked by part-time employees had been worked by full-time employees. This statistic is calculated separately for each function of a government by dividing the "part-time hours paid" by the standard number of hours for full-time employees in the particular government and then adding the resulting quotient to the number of full-time employees.

Gas supply--Local government activities associated with the acquisition of gas supplies and distribution to individual consumers.

Health--Administration of public health programs, community and visiting nurse services, immunization programs, drug abuse rehabilitation programs, health and food inspection activities, operation of outpatient clinics, and environmental pollution control activities are included in this classification.

Higher education--Includes local government degree granting institutions which provide academic training above grade 12. *Instructional employees* includes persons engaged in teaching and related academic research.

Highways--Activities associated with the maintenance and operation of streets, roads, sidewalks, bridges, tunnels, toll roads, and ferries are included at this function. Snow and ice removal, street lighting, and highway and traffic engineering activities are also included here.

Hospitals--Includes only government operated medical care facilities which provide inpatient care. Employees and payrolls of private corporations which lease and operate government-owned hospital facilities are excluded.

Housing and community development--The operation of housing and redevelopment projects and other activities to promote or aid housing and community development.

Judicial and legal--Includes all court and court related activities (except probation and parole activities which are included at the "Correction" function), court activities of sheriff's offices, prosecuting attorneys' and public defender's offices, legal departments, and attorneys providing government-wide legal service.

Libraries--Applies only to libraries operated by local governments for use by the general public. School and law libraries are included in the "Elementary and secondary education" or "Higher education," and "Judicial and legal" categories respectively.

National defense and international relations--Includes activities of the Federal Government associated with national defense and international relations, including primarily the Departments of Army, Navy, and Air Force; Department of State; U.S. Information Agency; and the Defense Logistics Agency. Defense related activities of State and local governments, including National Guard and civil defense, are classified at the "All other and unallocable" category.

Natural resources-- Activities primarily concerned with the conservation and development of natural resources--forest fire prevention and control, flood control, irrigation, drainage, land and forest reclamation, fish and game preservation and control, soil conservation, forestry, agricultural aids and research, agricultural development and inspection, and mineral resources activities.

Other education--State government activities relating to the supervision and regulation of public and private elementary and secondary schools; programs and institutions for training of blind, deaf, and other handicapped persons; and vocational rehabilitation programs.

Other government administration--Applies to the legislative and government-wide administrative agencies of governments. Included here are overall planning and zoning activities, and central personnel and administrative activities. This function is not applied to school district or special district governments.

Parks and recreation--Government activities that include the operation and maintenance of parks, playgrounds, swimming pools, public beaches, auditoriums, public golf courses, museums, marinas, botanical gardens, and zoological parks.

Police protection--All activities concerned, with the enforcement of law and order, including coroner's offices, police training academies, investigation bureaus, and local jails, "lockups," or other detention facilities not intended to serve as correctional facilities. The subcategory of police officers includes only persons with the power of arrest.

Postal service--The United States Postal Service.

Public welfare--Included in this category are such activities as the administration of various public assistance programs for the needy, operation of homes for the elderly, indigent care institutions, and programs which provide payments for medical care and other services for the needy. Health care and hospital services provided directly by a government, however, are included in the "Health" and "Hospital" functions rather than here.

Sewerage--The provision, maintenance, and operation of sanitary and storm sewer systems and sewage disposal and treatment facilities.

Social insurance administration--The administration and conduct of social insurance programs. For State governments, these activities include unemployment compensation and worker compensation programs, work/study programs, and determination of eligibility for Federal Old Age, Survivors, Disability, and Health Insurance (Social Security). Federal activities in this category are primarily those performed by the Social Security Administration and the Pension Benefit Guarantee Corporation.

Solid waste management--Refuse collection and disposal, operation of sanitary landfills, and street cleaning activities.

Space research and technology--Federal space activities are primarily programs of the National Aeronautics and Space Administration.

State liquor stores--The administration and operation of liquor stores by State governments.

Transit--Activities relating to the operation and maintenance of public mass transit systems (e.g., bus, subway, surface rail, and street railroad systems). Elementary and secondary school transportation systems are included in the "Elementary and secondary education" function.

Water supply--Local government activities associated with the production or acquisition of water and distribution to the public.

Water transport and terminals--Activities which are connected with the operation and support of canals and other waterways, harbors, docks, wharves, and other related marine terminal facilities.
