<u>2930 Eisenhower Avenue - Alexandria, Virginia</u> Best Building Mid Rise (4 – 7 stories): Award of Excellence

This built-to-suit project is seven stories tall and provides 75,000 SF of office space and 109,000 SF of parking on four levels. A key building feature is the use of a Geothermal HVAC system and its seamless integration into a "Class A" office building. The project is the first building to utilize geothermal heating and cooling in the city of Alexandria. 2930 Eisenhower Avenue also provides a ground floor fitness center and expansive fourth floor terrace. The façade combines modern materials such as Low E insulating glass, precast concrete, glazed aluminum curtain wall, and punched aluminum windows to create a clean and contemporary appearance.

<u>One & Two Potomac Yard - Arlington, Virginia</u> Best Building, Environmentally Responsible – Green Construction: Award of Merit

This speculative office building provides 654,000 SF of space and six levels of parking.
