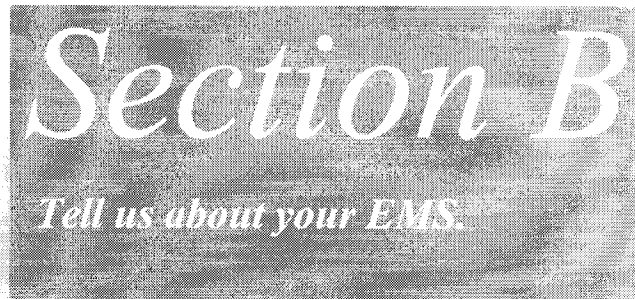
Johnson & Johnson has made tremendous achievements under its Pollution Prevention Goals (PPG) program that was implemented in 1991. By 1999, one year before the end of its PPG goal period, J&J worldwide achieved 21% reduction in energy usage, 25% reduction in packaging usage, 19% reduction in hazardous waste generation, 68% reduction in solid waste disposal, and 61% reduction in office paper usage. These results are published in the J&J 1999 EH&S Report, accessible on our website http://www.jnj.com/who_is_jnj/1999_enviro/1999_Environmental_Report.html. In 2000, J&J introduced the Next Generation Goals that will further reduce the corporation's environmental footprint. The Next Generation Goals are even more ambitious than the PPG. Although the goals are identified, J&J has not yet established specific targets for all of the goals. All targets will be established by First Quarter 2001 using Year 2000 as the base year.

We have maintained this philosophy through two Tylenol tragedies, and continue to uphold these principles today.
