Chile Eligible to Export Meat Products

FSIS is adding Chile to the list of countries eligible to export meat and meat products to the United States.

After a thorough review of the country's meat slaughter and processing inspection system, FSIS concluded that Chile's meat inspection laws, regulations, and other written materials demonstrate that the country's requirements are equivalent to relevant requirements in the Federal Meat Inspection Act (FMIA).

FSIS also determined that Chile's implementation of meat inspection standards and procedures is equivalent to that of the United States.

Meat and meat products slaughtered and processed in certified Chilean establishments may be exported to the United States. All such products will be subject to re-inspection by FSIS inspectors at U.S. ports-of-entry, as required by law.

The country will be eligible to export meat and meat products to the United States beginning December 21.

System (PBIS) 5.1.3, which is an updated and enhanced version of the PBIS 5.1 system that provides for the inclusion of more information and improved security

features. Changes include a modified means of preparing Noncompliance Records (NRs) which involves use of an expanded list of relevant regulations in creating the NR. Changes also involve the inclusion of Profile Extensions that the Agency will use to gather information about establishment activities that are not already found in the Plant Profile. This would include gathering information about exported product and the establishment's Food Defense Plan.

PBIS 5.1.3 has been updated to

facilitate the Agency's ability to do a search of NRs. In previous PBIS versions, when documenting NRs, inspection program personnel selected applicable Sanitation Performance Standards (SPS), Sanitation SOP, and Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point regulations from a pick list and if necessary, manually entered additional regulations specific to a product.

FSIS Issues Notice 80-05 on Beef Products

FSIS issued Notice 80-05 on December 5. The notice instructs inspection program personnel to update their establishment profiles under the new Performance Based Inspection System (PBIS) version 5.1.3 to identify the production of raw ground or comminuted beef meeting the standard of identity mentioned in 9 CFR 319.15 a, b, or c, which are subject to *Escherichia coli* (*E.coli*) O157:H7 testing under the MT03 project code.

Fresh or frozen beef or ground beef, hamburger, beef patties, veal patties and patty mix are products subject to the MT03 project sampling.

Raw ground beef which contains beef products from the advanced meat recovery (AMR) system are also subject to the MT03 project sampling. The following products are not subject to the MT03 project sampling: beef steaks, veal steaks, partially defatted beef fatty tissue, any beef mixed with other species (pork or poultry), fresh beef sausage, Italian sausage, any raw beef sausage products and raw beef meatballs.

Inspection program personnel at the establishments will be able to update the establishment profiles in the PBIS 5.1.3 version by checking the "new" box that identifies raw ground products produced under the Hazard Analysis and Critical Control Point processing category.

However, this will only occur when the establishments meet the standard of identity found in the 9 CFR 319.15 articles, subject to the MT03 project sampling.

Form 10,240-1 Soon Available Online

Beginning in early 2006, FSIS will provide online a revised Form 10,240-1, *Production on Post-Lethality Exposed Ready-to-Eat Products*.

Information about this form is provided in FSIS Notice 81-05. The notice instructs inspection program personnel to inform establishments that they may postpone the 2005 annual submission until the revised form is made available online.

This postponement is only possible if the establishments have made no changes to the information provided since the previous submission of the form. Any establishment required to complete the form will be able to complete and submit the form entirely online when it becomes available.

In addition to making the form available online, FSIS is revising the content of the form. The revisions are still under development.
