Services at a Distance: e-Entrepreneurs

The trend toward outsourcing and "off-shoring" has finally begun to create opportunities for those with professional-level backgrounds. Consultants, teachers, writereditors and information technology specialists are among the many areas of expertise now provided at a distance.

A spouse in Mexico City, featured in last summer's *Global Employment Connections*, offers a good example of the "virtual services" trend. With the support of the SNAP Local Employment Advisor, she used her experience as a financial advisor in the U.S. to offer financial services to a pool that eventually included clients both inside and outside the U.S.

The virtual services movement has also created some more unusual opportunities. For example, a media company recently advertised for writers to create scripts for cellphone tours of well-known cities http://www.talkingstreet.com/jobs/. Similarly, though more conventionally, an American law firm recently sought a home-based arbitration contention writer, to handle disputes between insurance firms

FAQs

Q. What is an "e-Entrepreneur"?

An e-Entrepreneur is someone who provides professional services to his or her clients remotely, via the Internet, email, phone, fax, courier, etc.

Q. When did e-Entrepreneurs begin to appear?

The concept probably first took hold in Silicon Valley in the 1990s, when experienced CEOs and other sought-after managers began to advise startup companies from a distance. The growth of the e-Entrepreneur industry over the past decade has also fueled the trend.

Q. What types of services are e-Entrepreneurs offering?

They run the gamut, from corporate consulting to insurance case screening to litiga-

tion support.

Q. What kind of licensing restrictions apply to e-Entrepreneurs?

This would depend on a variety of factors, including the professional's area of expertise, host country restrictions, the location of clients, etc. An American database manager assigned to Denmark and providing services to Canadian clients, for example, would be subject to different restrictions (if any) than a French lawyer assigned to Bangkok who offers litigation support to Parisian law firms. Foreign Service spouses who are considering offering professional services should consult a legal and accounting advisor as well as their post's administrative officer before undertaking any professional business initiative.

Q. What other considerations might apply?

Since e-Entrepreneurs are operating homebased businesses, potential work permit, housing, zoning or similar restrictions should be taken into account, as well as

e- Entrepreneur Pilot Training Program



The Family Liaison Office (FLO) is pleased to announce a new professional training and support program for spouses of Foreign Service direct-hire employees of the Foreign Affairs agencies (Department of State, Agency for International Development, the Foreign Commercial Service, and the Foreign Agriculture Service).

The new pilot program, e-Entrepreneur, provides training and support in setting-up and developing a "portable" home-based virtual business. FLO has partnered with the Staff-Centrix Company to provide and implement the e-Entrepreneur training program.

As a result of the enormous number of applications, two additional sessions have been added for June and July 2005, and will be held in Washington, DC. The e-Entrepreneur workshop and following support services are at no cost for the participants, but the candidate is responsible for her/his own travel, meal and lodging expenses.

In cooperation with the Family Liaison Office, StaffCentrix professionals will review the applications and select the candidates. Applications will be accepted until the program workshops are full, or until a week before the training starts.

Again, Foreign Service spouses who are considering offering professional services should consult a legal and accounting advisor as well as their post's administrative officer before undertaking any professional activity.

Q. What type of training is being offered to Foreign Service spouses?

The two and a half-day training program is aimed at training Foreign Service spouses in how to create a portable, home-based business via the Internet, thus overcoming career obstacles inherent with frequent moves and service at isolated posts. Virtual outsourcing is an option that has proven itself in the new "knowledge economy" and is forecasted to show tremendous growth in the future workplace.

Q. Who is eligible to apply?

Applicants must be the spouse of a foreign affairs agency direct-hire employee and may apply on-line at-
