- 1. GRANTEE: Allied-Signal Aerospace Company, Kansas City, MO
- 2. PURPOSE AND LIMITATIONS:

This exemption authorizes the manufacture, marking and sale of a non-DOT specification cylinder to be used for the transportation in commerce of Division 2.2 materials. This exemption provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated herein.

- 3. REGULATORY SYSTEM AFFECTED: 49 CFR Parts 106, 107 and 171-180.
- 4. REGULATIONS FROM WHICH EXEMPTED: 49 CFR Sections 173.304(a) in that the prescribed packaging is not listed as an authorized packaging, 178.65-11(b) and (c), and 178.65-14(b) as specified herein.
- 5. <u>BASIS</u>: This exemption is based on the application of Allied-Signal Aerospace Company dated November 28, 1995, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.105 and the public proceeding thereon.
- 6. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (49 CFR 172.101):

## 7. PACKAGING(S) and SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES:

a. <u>PACKAGING</u> - Packagings prescribed are 3 inch and 6 inch diameter welded cylinders which conform with the DOT Specification 39 (49 CFR 178.65) except as follows:

178,65-11 Pressure tests.

- (a) \* \* \* .
- (b) Two cylinders, one cylinder taken from the beginning of one year's production volume, and one taken from the end, must be hydrostatically tested to destruction. The entire year's production volume must be rejected if (see Section 178.65-13):

(c) A "lot" is defined as the quantity of cylinders (not to exceed 100 cylinders) produced in a one year period having identical size, design, construction, material, heat treatment, finish, and quality.

## 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS:

a. Offerors for transportation of the hazardous materials, specified in this exemption may use the packaging described in this exemption for the transportation of such hazardous materials so long as no modifications or changes are made to the packages, all terms of this exemption are complied with, and a copy of the current exemption is maintained at each facility from which such offering occurs.

- b. Each packaging manufactured under the authority of this exemption must be either (1) marked with the name of the manufacturer and location (city and state) of the facility at which it is manufactured or (2) marked with a registration symbol designated by the Office of Hazardous Materials Exemptions and Approvals Program for a specific manufacturing facility.
- c. A copy of this exemption, in its current status, must be maintained at each manufacturing facility at which this packaging is manufactured and must be made available to a DOT representative upon request.
- d. Shippers using the packaging covered by this exemption must comply with all provisions of this exemption, and all other applicable requirements contained in 49 CFR Parts 171-180.
- 9. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED: Motor vehicle.
- 10. MODAL REQUIREMENTS: None as a requirement of this exemption.
- 11. <u>COMPLIANCE</u>: Failure by a person to comply with any of the following may result in suspension or revocation of this exemption and penalties prescribed by the Federal hazardous materials transportation law, 49 U.S.C. Section 5101 <u>et\_seq</u>:
  - o All terms and conditions prescribed in this exemption and the Hazardous Materials Regulations, Parts 171-180.
  - o Registration required by 49 CFR 107.601 et seg., when applicable.

No person may use or apply this exemption, including display of its number, when the exemption has expired or is otherwise no longer in effect.

12. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS: The carrier is required to report any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety (AAHMS) as soon as practicable. (49 CFR 171.15 and 171.16 apply to any activity undertaken under the authority of this exemption.) In addition, the holder(s) of this exemption must also inform the AAHMS, in writing, as soon as practicable of any incidents involving the package and shipments made under this exemption.
