## DOT-E 10518 (FIRST REVISION)

- 1. Caribbean Refrescos, Inc., Cidra, PR is hereby granted an emergency exemption from certain provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations to offer packages prescribed herein of a corrosive or flammable liquid for transportation in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes a one-time shipment of approximately 800 DOT Specification 34 containers of 5 gallon capacity inadvertently marked to indicate 4 gallon capacity and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
- 2. <u>BASIS</u>. This exemption is based on Caribbean Refrescos, Inc.'s application dated November 8, 1990, December 8, 1990 and February 5, 1991, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.113 and a determination that it is necessary to preclude serious economic loss.
- 3. <u>HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class)</u>. Corrosive liquid, n.o.s.; Phosphoric acid; classed as corrosive materials and Extract, liquid flavoring, classed as flammable liquid.
- 4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Corrosive liquid, n.o.s.; Phosphoric acid; or Extract, liquid flavoring, as appropriate.
- 5. REGULATION(S) AFFECTED. 49 CFR Part 107, Appendix B(1); 178.19-6(a)(1).
- 6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Motor vehicle and cargo vessel.
- 7. <u>SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES.</u> Packagings prescribed are approximately 800 DOT Specification 34 five gallon capacity containers, inadvertently marked to indicate four gallon capacity.

## 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS.

- a. The containers shipped under the terms of this exemption must be destroyed after being emptied.
- b. The provision of Part 107 Appendix B(1) are waived, however, the provision of Appendix B(2) are applicable.

- c. A copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each cargo vessel and motor vehicle used to transport the containers authorized by this exemption.
- 9. <u>REPORTING REQUIREMENTS:</u> Any incident involving loss of packaging contents or packaging failure must be reported to the Associate Administrator for Hazardous Materials Safety as soon as practicable.
- 10. EXPIRATION DATE. April 30, 1991, or upon depletion of stock, whichever occurs earlier.
