DOT-E 8519

- 1. Atlantic Container Line, Elizabeth, New Jersey, is hereby granted an exemption from those provisions of this Department's Hazardous Materials Regulations specified in paragraph 5 below to transport certain packages of hazardous materials on "roll-on-roll-off" cargo vessels in commerce subject to the limitations and special requirements specified herein. This exemption authorizes the stowage of gasoline powered motor vehicles in the same hold or compartment with certain packages of hazardous materials specified in paragraph 7 and provides no relief from any regulation other than as specifically stated.
- 2. BASIS. This exemption is based on Atlantic Container Lines' application dated October 9, 1980, submitted in accordance with 49 CFR 107.103 and the public proceeding thereon.
- 3. HAZARDOUS MATERIALS (Descriptor and class). Motor vehicle, ORM-C.
- 4. PROPER SHIPPING NAME (49 CFR 172.101). Motor vehicle.
- 5. REGULATION AFFECTED. 49 CFR 176.905(L).
- 6. MODES OF TRANSPORTATION AUTHORIZED. Cargo vessel.
- 7. SAFETY CONTROL MEASURES.
 - a. Motor vehicles and freight containers or highway vehicles containing hazardous materials of the following hazard classes:

Explosive C
Flammable Gas
Non-Flammable Gas
Flammable Liquid
Combustible Liquid
Flammable Solid
Oxidizer
Poison B
Radioactive Material
Corrosive Material
Irritating Material
ORM-A
ORM-B
ORM-C
ORM-E

may be stowed in the same hold or compartment on "roll-on-roll-off" cargo vessels provided the following separation is maintained between the motor vehicle and the freight container or highway vehicle containing the hazardous materials:



A fore and aft separation of at least 20 feet must be provided or an athwarthships separation of at least 16 feet must be provided.

- b. The terms of paragraph 7(a) may also be applied to portable tanks and cargo tanks provided compliance with 176.76(g) is maintained.
- 8. SPECIAL PROVISIONS. A copy of this exemption must be carried aboard each vessel used to transport packages covered by this exemption.
- 9. REPORTING REQUIREMENTS. Any incident involving loss of contents of the package must be reported to the Office of Hazardous Materials Regulation as soon as practicable.
- 10. EXPIRATION DATE. February 5, 1983.
