## GPO And Nation's Printers Team Up For Multi-Million Dollar Joint Venture

### New York, California, Ohio Make GPO's Top 10 States

WASHINGTON—From the West to the East Coast, private sector printers in virtually every part of the country are successfully doing business with the U.S. Government Printing Office. The GPO has released the list of the top 10 states that generated the most revenue from working with the Federal Government agency in the first half of 2005, with Maryland, Pennsylvania and California in the top three.

“Since GPO’s headquarters are located in Washington, DC, you might expect area printers in Maryland and Virginia to produce much of our printing needs, when actually the GPO’s competitive procurement program makes it easy for printers all over the country to get the same shot at the millions of dollars we procure in business every year,” said Jim Bradley, Managing Director of Customer Services. “The mix of printers found in the top 10 list from the first six months of the year is a good indication that the GPO’s relationship with private sector printers from every corner of the country is as strong as ever.”

The GPO produces key Congressional and security and intelligent documents in-house, and contracts out the majority of other printing and publishing requirements to private sector printers across the country. This long-standing partnership with the nation’s printers allows the GPO to meet the government’s information and printing needs in a cost-effective manner for the taxpayers.
