**Status of the Industry's Single Factor Rate Tariff** – A copy of the presentation by Scott Michael, American Moving and Storage Association, Alexandria, VA, is provided as **Attachment 2**.

**Transportation Management Services Solution (TMSS)** – Larry Tucker, GSA, Office of Transportation and Property Management, Washington, DC, explained the program, its objectives, and the ultimate goal of the TMSS project. A detailed description of the presentation is provided as **Attachment 3**.

**Operational Issues** – Brian Kellhofer, GSA, Heartland Region, Kansas City, MO, provided the responses indicated below to issues/questions submitted to GSA in advance of the meeting:

- Definition of unaccompanied baggage Clarification will be added to the RFO, stating: "Unaccompanied Air Baggage items must be packed in Tri-Wall containers measuring no more than 11.3 cube. A carrier must have written approval from the GBL certifying officer specifically authorizing any exception to use of the required Tri-Wall containers."
- 2. **Agency specific requirements for next RFO** Any agency having specific requirements for the next RFO must submit them in writing to the Kansas City office by June 15, 2001.
- 3. Carriers placed in temporary non-use status or removed from CHAMP It is GSA's intent to place carriers who fail to perform or comply with Household Goods Tender of Service provisions in temporary non-use status and to remove them from the program if they do not correct the failure within the appropriate time period.

**Issues raised by Stevens Worldwide Van Lines** – Mr. Kellhofer also addressed the following questions/issues:

- Must a carrier collect charges for which the transferee is responsible – The Government should pay any charges authorized by the GBL Issuing Officer and the Government should recoup payment directly from the employee.
- Requesting bids from individual carriers The ITMS cost comparison makes it unnecessary for agencies to have their employees seek individual carrier bids. The cost comparison provides

- all the information an agency needs to make an informed decision in selecting a carrier to handle a particular move.
- 3. When actual weight exceeds estimated weight by more than 15%, and third party billing for crating charges Neither of these is an issue among Federal agencies that are aware they may waive certain CHAMP provisions when a carrier provides proper justification. GSA recognizes that turnover in Federal agency personnel has resulted in a need to keep our customers informed about their rights and responsibilities under CHAMP.
