- TRAIL OR ROAD—Dashed lines represent randomly located, unverified trails. Dots or short dashes for some trails. Roads plotted from General Land Office (GLO) land office maps, aerial photographs, and small-scale maps and from original sources such as local place. Many non-through-going trails of the GLO land office are omitted here to avoid cluttering the map and to emphasize trails used by pack animals. Some can be acquired where the designation was not shown on original source. Trail data from 1880 to early 1900's.
 - TOWN OR OTHER CULTURAL FEATURE—Approximately located, showing approximate date of founding of a town or establishment of a cultural feature, not generally the date of its first appearance in documents. Other possible uses include state, county, and town boundaries, and rivers and lakes. Major cultural features are shown in brown, others in gray. Locations of towns shown are primarily published maps; city, state, and some location codes may be incomplete. The following abbreviations are used on the map: Co.—Colorado; Colo.—Colorado; P.O.—Post Office; Jct.—Junction.
 - TOPOGRAPHIC FEATURE, PHYSICAL LOCALITY, OR OTHER FEATURE
 - RAILROAD—Abandoned and demolished, graded but rails never laid, or surveyed and never graded. Those shown beginning at the time of separation. Operating railroads are shown as broken or faint lines. Locations of railroads are shown as broken or faint lines. For more details about railroads, see books cited separately listed in the "Sources of Information" in the preface.
