

Working Group on the Impact of Proposal and Award Management Mechanisms



- Will identify best practices to improve NSF program announcement and solicitation processes in ways that achieve appropriate balances between proposal success rates, award sizes and award duration in the various types of awards that comprise the total NSF portfolio
 - Flexibility for each Directorate to respond to specific opportunities and needs
 - Emphasis on individual, investigator-initiated grants




Working Group on the Impact of Proposal and Award Management Mechanisms

- Obtain and analyze current data
- I dentify reasons for declines in success rates
- Assess impacts of initial/limited strategies and practices that have attempted to address these issues
- I dentify anticipated impacts of changing success rates, award amounts and/or award durations, balance between standard vs. continuing grants, etc.
 - on NSF (program officers, business ops.)
 - on the S&E community
