During the 2005–2006 school year, a sample of students across the country, including some of your twelfth-grade students, will participate in the National Assessment of Educational Progress (NAEP). The current assessment focuses on achievement in U.S. history, civics, economics, writing, and mathematics. To investigate the relationship between students' achievement and various school, teacher, and home factors, NAEP is also collecting information from schools and teachers.

This questionnaire collects information about teachers' backgrounds and instructional practices as they relate to students selected for the assessment. Since you teach economics to one or more students selected for the assessment, you are being asked to answer questions about these students' classes.
