OUTFITTING THE ARMY

TACOM is one of the U.S. Army's largest weapon systems research, development, and sustainment organizations. This is an organization used to large-scale operations, managing an enormous database of details. However, when it came down to renovating 42,000 square-feet of office space at TACOM, they turned to UNICOR to outfit the individual offices.
