The Alaska section consists of 4 cargo aircraft. The Domestic Services section consists of 37 aircraft. The Short-Range International section consists of 11 cargo and 284 passenger aircraft. The Aeromedical Evacuation segment consists of 50 aircraft. The Long-Range International section consists of 299 cargo and 683 passenger aircraft. Total CRAF aircraft is 1,368.
