SUBJECT: June 2008 Civil Reserve Air Fleet (CRAF) Allocation

The April 2008 CRAF allocation issued April 17, 2008 is hereby amended. The distribution reflected in this letter, effective June 1, 2008, brings the CRAF allocations up-to-date. The Alaska section consists of 4 cargo aircraft. The Domestic Services section consists of 36 aircraft. The Short-Range International section consists of 11 cargo and 245 passenger aircraft. The Aeromedical Evacuation segment consists of 50 aircraft. The Long-Range International section consists of 312 cargo and 582 passenger aircraft. Total CRAF aircraft is 1,240.
