SUBJECT: August 2007 Civil Reserve Air Fleet (CRAF) Allocation

The June 2007 CRAF allocation issued June 21, 2007 is hereby amended. The distribution reflected in this letter, effective August 6, 2007, brings the CRAF allocations up-to-date. Total allocations by segment are listed in Enclosure 1. Enclosure 2 lists the current aircraft allocated to the CRAF Program by carrier and tail number.

The Alaska section consists of 4 cargo aircraft. The Domestic Services section consists of 37 aircraft. The Short-Range International section consists of 12 cargo and 270 passenger aircraft. The Aeromedical Evacuation segment consists of 50 aircraft. The Long-Range International section consists of 300 cargo and 690 passenger aircraft. Total CRAF aircraft is 1,363.

The above allocations are authorized in conformance with the Defense Production Act of 1950 (DPA), as amended (50 U.S.C., App. 2061, et seq.)
