INTELLIGENCE COMMUNITY POLICY MEMORANDUM

Subject: Authorities, Roles, and Responsibilities of the Deputy Director of National Intelligence for Customer Outcomes

Authority: The National Security Act of 1947, as amended; the Intelligence Reform and Terrorism Prevention Act of 2004; Executive Order 12333, as amended; and other applicable provisions of law.

1. The Deputy Director of National Intelligence for Customer Outcomes (DDNI/CO) is charged with the implementation of the responsibilities of the Director of National Intelligence (DNI) relative to understanding the needs of the customers of national intelligence, determining the extent to which the Intelligence Community is working to address those needs, gauging customer satisfaction throughout, and providing regular reports to the DNI on these responsibilities.

2. The DDNI/CO is supported by the Principal Assistant Deputy Director for Customer Outcomes and the following Assistant Deputy Directors and such other Assistant Deputy Directors as may be appointed by the DDNI/CO, with the responsibility for the management of their respective subject areas, under the direction of the DDNI/CO:

- Assistant Deputy Director for the National Intelligence Priority Framework
- Assistant Deputy Director for Military Support
- Assistant Deputy Director for Homeland Security and Law Enforcement Support
- Assistant Deputy Director for Policy and Diplomatic Support
- Assistant Deputy Director for Foreign Relations
- Assistant Deputy Director for Intelligence Capability Requirements

3. The DDNI/CO is delegated the following authorities and responsibilities of the DNI set forth in the National Security Act of 1947, as amended, and other applicable provisions of law, unless otherwise prohibited by statute, Executive order, or this Memorandum:

- a. All authorities and responsibilities of the DNI with respect to ascertaining the intelligence needs of military, homeland security, policy, diplomatic, and law enforcement consumers.
- b. All authorities and responsibilities of the DNI with respect to determining priorities, in concert with the Deputy Directors of National Intelligence for Analysis and Collection (DDNI/A and DDNI/C), for collection, analysis, and production of national intelligence

by elements of the Intelligence Community, including the authority and responsibility for developing the National Intelligence Priority Framework;

c. The responsibility to validate intelligence needs and requirements for future national intelligence capabilities and systems. The DDNI/CO will coordinate with the DDNI/A and the DDNI/C in exercising this responsibility and will support the DDNI for Management (DDNI/M) in carrying out the DDNI/M's resource and acquisition responsibilities with respect to future capabilities and systems. The DDNI/CO is also responsible for developing recommendations on future intelligence requirements funded outside the National Intelligence Program;

d. All authorities and responsibilities of the DNI to oversee the coordination of the relationships between elements of the Intelligence Community and the intelligence or security services of foreign governments or international organizations on all matters involving intelligence related to the national security or involving intelligence acquired through clandestine means, including providing direction to the Director of the Central Intelligence Agency (D/CIA) in carrying out the D/CIA's responsibilities with respect to coordination with foreign governments; with respect to collection and analytic relationships, the DDNI/CO will exercise this authority in concert with the DDNI/C and the DDNI/A respectively;

e. In coordination with the DDNI/M, the authority and responsibility for providing training and education to the intelligence customer regarding the Intelligence Community;

f. The responsibility to support the DDNI/M in establishing competency, qualification, training, career development, and performance standards and requirements to meet the present and future requirements of the Intelligence Community with respect to the responsibilities and authorities enumerated in the subparagraphs above; and

g. In coordination with the DDNI/M, the responsibility and authority to coordinate the performance of services of common concern to the Intelligence Community with respect to the responsibilities and authorities enumerated in the subparagraphs above.

4. To the extent authorized by law, the DDNI/CO may further delegate to any other officer or official of the ODNI the authorities identified in paragraph 3 above.

5. This Policy Memorandum is effective immediately, and the relevant contents shall be incorporated into an Intelligence Community Directive.
