

ACTION ITEMS
ENERGY STAR QUALIFIED IMAGING EQUIPMENT
SPECIFICATION REVISION STAKEHOLDER MEETING
Friday, October 14, 2005
Washington DC

OVERARCHING:

- Partners to provide EPA with additional comments on draft specification and key issues discussed on 10/14 no later than 11/1. Key issues include: labeling and unit shipment data; digital front-ends; recovery time; differentiating ink jet products; standby for OM products; and remanufacturing.
- EPA will strive to provide decisions on all of the above key issues via an e-mail to all stakeholders on 11/18/05.
- EPA will distribute revised terminology to stakeholders for review by November 1.
- EPA will publish Draft 2 of the Imaging Specification in December 2005.
- EPA will invite industry to a stakeholder meeting in January/February, 2006 to discuss Draft 2.
- EPA will finalize the Imaging Equipment specification in March of 2006.

DATA:

- Partners will share TEC and OM data with EPA by November 1.
- EPA will distribute current TEC and OM data ASAP and will distribute data received by November 1 soon after (will post on web and distribute via e-mail).
- EPA will review 11/1 TEC data and determine what is reasonable for unit accuracy.
- EPA, with international counterparts, will develop methodology for collecting unit shipment data, including global data, expected timing: mid 2008.
- DFEs: EPA will speak with Carol Tosaya, EFI, re: member data, and review TEC data after 11/1 to assess use/power correlation.
- Functional Adders: Partners will send comments on additional adders and data on power for the additional functionality by 11/1.
- EPA will look at TEC data to ensure that high-functionality products are not disadvantaged (after 11/1 deadline for data).
- Partners to comment on products that cannot meet one-watt in Standby mode.
 - Partners to suggest appropriate watt levels for any products in Standby that cannot meet one watt.

SPEED:

- Jim Booth, Lexmark, will send a description of alternate speed approach (spits/second) to EPA to share with larger stakeholder group.
 - Ken Salaets, ITI, will convene a group of Canon, Lexmark, Samsung, Ricoh, HP, and others to discuss the issue and will share thoughts with EPA.

REMANUFACTURING:

- EPA to schedule two conference calls prior to 11/18 to fully discuss options.
 - EPA will, on a parallel track, share information and engage with international counterparts.

DRAFT 2:

- EPA to research duplexing and send options with Draft 2.
- EPA will clarify partner web requirements in Draft 2.

COORDINATION:

- EPA will contact EC counterparts re: harmonization with EUP.
- EPA to contact Taiwan re: reducing 115V testing to one weight/size paper.
- EPA to talk with ENERGY STAR teammates re: implications of changing logo/use mid-Partnership Agreement.
