SUBJECT: Revocation of Sleepwear Amendments; Request for Oral Proceeding

BALLOT VOTE DUE FEB 19 1999

By the attached letter, the National Fire Protection Association (NFPA) requests the opportunity to make an oral presentation on the statutorily-required (Pub. L. 105-276) proposed revocation of amendments to the sleepwear standards that was published in the Federal Register on January 19, 1999 (64 FR 2867). NFPA requests a date that is after the close of the comment period (March 22, 1999), and after the General Accounting Office report is completed (due April 1, 1999). The Commission is required to issue a final rule by July 1, 1999 that revokes, maintains, or modifies the amendments to the sleepwear standards.

Under section 4(d) of the Flammable Fabrics Act, the Commission, in promulgating standards and amendments to standards, is required to give an opportunity for oral presentations in addition to the opportunity to make written submissions. 15 U.S.C § 1193(d). However, Pub. L. 105-276, which controls this proceeding, provides that the rulemaking conducted with respect to this matter is not subject to the Flammable Fabrics Act. Thus, The Commission is not required to provide an opportunity for oral presentations, and any decision to do so is discretionary. The Office of Hazard Identification and Reduction recommends providing an opportunity for oral presentations of views. If the request is granted, the Commission would publish a Federal Register notice affording the opportunity for oral presentations of views to all interested persons.
