> Request for Extension of Time to Comment on Petition No. CP 03-2

Dear Mr. Stevenson:

On July 9, the Commission published for public comment a notice in The FEDERAL REGISTER announcing that it had docketed a petition, Petition No. CP 03-2, requesting that the Commission establish performance standards to reduce or prevent injuries from contact with the blade of a table saw. Comments are due by September 8, 2003. For the following reasons, we request that the Commission extend the date for submitting comments sixty days until November 7, 2003.

Our initial review of the petition shows that it contains a great deal of detailed description about the "SawStop" technology that forms the basis for the petition. However, most of the arguments advanced in support of granting the petition consist of conclusory statements that either are without factual support or are misleading. We believe that the interests of the Commission would best be served by the receipt of as full a preliminary record as possible upon which it can base a decision whether to go forward. Among the issues that would benefit from fuller development are: the anticipated costs to consumers and industry associated with granting the petition; statistics on injuries associated with table saws; the potential of the "SawStop" technology to reduce such injuries, limitations on the performance of that technology and corresponding increases in risks of injury; and unique issues relating to the current and future availability of the SawStop technology and lack of alternatives.

Inasmuch as the petition lacks many salient facts upon which to base meaningful comment, we will have to collect and develop relevant information to present to the Commission. Our best estimate is that the process will require two months, with an additional month to prepare and submit comments. We also believe that many disparate trade associations, manufacturers and retailers may have an interest in commenting on the petition and the issues raised above. At this time, we are initiating contact with potentially interested parties. However, with summer



vacations, it will be difficult to complete those contacts in sufficient time to meet the current September 8 date, let alone for those parties to provide substantive comment.

For the foregoing reasons, we request that Commission extend the time for receiving comments on the petition to November 7, a period of sixty (60) days from the current September 8 date. Granting the extension will permit all interested parties to review fully the merits of the petition and to provide the Commission with substantive comments that will assist it in its consideration of whether to grant the petition.

AGENCY: Consumer Product Safety Commission.

ACTION: Notice of Extension of Comment Period.

SUMMARY: By notice in the Federal Register of July 9, 2003, 68 FR 40912, the Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC or Commission) invited comment on Petition No. CP 03-2, Petition Requesting Performance Standards for a System to Reduce or Prevent Injuries from Contact with the Blade of a Table Saw. In response to a request by the Power Tool Institute, Inc. to extend the comment period on the petition by 60 days, the Commission is extending it through Friday, November 7, 2003.

DATES: The Office of the Secretary must receive any comments on the petition not later than November 7, 2003.
