This support can be used to engage your community at all levels.

Someone involved in how the buildings are operated: Energy Manager Facilities Manager Environmental Manager Sustainability Coordinator	An energy manager, facilities manager, environmental manager, or sustainability coordinator can be key in helping improve the energy performance of the buildings in your community. They can help set internal policies and practices that will help reduce energy consumption, and they can be the ones to track the progress of these efforts. These individuals can also help train members within the community on tools and resources available to help improve energy performance. They can host in-person events for different parts of the community (e.g. hospitals, schools, corporations), Web conferences on different subjects related to energy management, and gather support from other groups that have similar energy and environmental goals.
