*Conversion Formula:*

Step 1      $Capacity (A) \times Capacity Factor (B) \times Annual Hours (C) = Annual Electricity Generation (D)$

Step 2      $Annual Electricity Generation (D) \times Competing Heat Rate (E) = Annual Output (F)$

Step 3      $Annual Output (F) \times Emissions Coefficient (G) = Annual Emissions Displaced (H)$
