

Rankings & Recognition


- KU is ranked as one of the top 50 public US universities - U.S. News and World Report, America's Best Colleges 2007.




A KU Vietnamese student's thoughts on KU




What are some good things about studying at KU?






International Student Admission

- KU Applied English Center **Intensive English Program** (non-degree or degree seeking)
- Undergraduate (BA, BS, BGS)
- Graduate (MA, MS, MEd, PhD, etc.)





KU Applied English Center




•Five levels of instruction, from basic to advanced

•Opportunities for advanced-level students to take University of Kansas courses

•Experienced, professional faculty & staff

- Established in 1964 as an official program of the University of Kansas Lawrence campus
- Accredited by Commission on English Language Program Accreditation (CEA) & member of UCIEP
- Programs prepare students linguistically, academically, and culturally for university life







KU Applied English Center

- Students may apply for admission to the AEC as a non-degree student
- Students may apply for admission to the University of Kansas as undergraduate or graduate degreeseeking students and also study at the Applied English Center to improve their language skills.
- English proficiency testing or proof of proficiency is required of all students upon arrival. Before enrollment, testing is required of undergraduates who do not present TOEFL or IELTS scores meeting KU proficiency requirements when they apply for admission.

Non-degree Admission:

- High School Graduation
- Application
- Fee
- Financial Support Statement

Many students begin studies at the AEC & later apply to KU for academic programs.






English Proficiency for Admission & Enrollment

Graduate admission requires specific TOEFL or IELTS scores (determined by each graduate program).

Undergraduates may be admitted to academic programs with any level of English proficiency. However TOEFL, IELTS or onsite testing must confirm that student meets KU English proficiency requirement before enrollment in university courses.





Score requirements for waiver of test or full-time enrollment in KU courses

- •iBT 23 or higher for each section score
- •CBT 23 or higher for each section score & 4.5 or higher on the essay
- TOEFL 57 or higher for each section score & 4.5 or higher on Test of Written English (TWE)
- •IELTS, academic format 6.0 or higher for each part & a total score of 6.5





Undergraduate Admission Requirements

Requirements Vary by Major and Level of Study



Freshman & Transfer General Admission for most programs in the KU College of Liberal Arts & Sciences

- 2.5 GPA minimum on 4.0 scale
- High school graduation with college preparatory curriculum
- Application
- \$75 Application Fee
- Evidence of Financial Support for one academic year

No SAT or ACT

•No TOEFL required for admission. However TOEFL, IELTS or onsite testing must confirm that student meets KU English proficiency requirement before enrollment in university courses.



Undergraduate Admission Requirements

Requirements Vary by Major and Level of Study

Freshman Selective Admission (Schools of Architecture, Engineering, Fine Arts)

- 3.0 GPA minimum or higher
- High School graduation with college preparatory curriculum and completion of specific required courses
- SAT or ACT with specific minimum math scores
- Application
- \$75 Application Fee
- Evidence of Financial Support for one academic year
- No TOEFL required for admission. However TOEFL, IELTS or onsite testing must confirm that student meets KU English proficiency requirement before enrollment in university courses.








Graduate Admission

Admission Requirements *determined by each academic program:*

- GPA (3.0 minimum) as indicated on official transcripts (2 copies)
- TOEFL or IELTS (required)
- GRE (for most, but not all programs)
- Other standardized tests
- References
- Personal Statement
- Application (required)
- Fee (required)





Cost Estimate

Graduate Students

Tuition and Fees for 9 credit hours per semester: Estimated \$11,878-\$25,718/year

Applied English Center & Undergraduate Students

Tuition and Fees for 15 credit hours/semester: Estimated \$18,958-\$21,985/year

\$21,215 - \$37,553

Estimated TOTAL: \$29,532 – \$32,559

Undergraduate Scholarships

ISSS Undergraduate Scholarships Deadline - January 15

- Admitted to KU
- Minimum GPA 3.5 cumulative
- College preparatory curriculum
- TOEFL or IELTS scores
- ACT or SAT Scores
- Letters of Reference
- Activities Summary
- Scholarship Essay





Deadlines Vary based on Academic Program

For graduate programs, check with academic department.


For undergraduate programs, check with ISSS Admissions Office. Selective programs have earlier deadlines.
