Sea Quest Diving Equipment

Dear Mr. Hargis:

By letter dated January 21, 1997, you appealed the decision of the Commission's Freedom of Information (FOI) Officer to withhold two internal memoranda and one page of staff notes responsive to your Freedom of Information Act (FOIA) request. Under the authority delegated to me by the Commission, 16 C.F.R. § 1015.7, I have reviewed your appeal and the responsive documents.

I affirm the decision of the FOI Officer to withhold the memoranda and notes responsive to your request, based on Exemptions 5 and 7(E) of the FOIA. 5 U.S.C. §§ 552(b)(5) and (b)(7)(E).

Exemption 5 provides for the withholding of certain inter-agency and intra-agency documents and incorporates the deliberative process privilege. The memoranda and staff notes withheld consist of staff recommendations containing both pre-decisional and deliberative discussions. The deliberative process privilege protects advice, recommendations, and opinions which are part of the agency's deliberative, consultative, and decision-making processes. Although this privilege applies only to the opinions or recommendations in a document and not to factual information, facts are withheld here because they are inextricably intertwined with the exempt portions. Release of these memoranda and notes would stifle open and frank communication within the agency.

I am also relying on Exemption 7(E) of the FOIA in withholding the same memoranda. Release of this information



SCUBA EQUIPMENT RECALLED

WASHINGTON, DC (Dec. 9) -- U.S. Divers Co., Santa Ana, California, in cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), today announced a voluntary recall of all of its scuba regulators sold after December 1, 1976. A very substantial number of regulators is involved. The regulators were distributed nationwide.

The recalled regulators may have a potentially defective clamp ring which may cause unseating of the second stage regulator diaphragm. The second stage is that portion of the regulator which the diver holds in his mouth. The unseating of this diaphragm could result in the regulator being flooded with water and the air flow to the diver being cut off.

The recalled scuba regulators were sold under the name of U.S. Divers and/or the following model names: Conshelf XII; Conshelf Supreme; Calypso J; Calypso IV; Aquarius; Octopus; and Hookah. The model name and/or U.S. Divers appears on the product on the purge button.

Consumers are warned to immediately stop using these regulators. Consumers should return them to an authorized U.S. Divers dealer for free replacement of the clamp ring.

SAFETY REPLACEMENT PROGRAM

WASHINGTON, D.C. (Dec. 27)-- The U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC) and Parkway Fabricators of South Amboy, N.J. today announce a voluntary part-replacement program of 2000 "Poseidon" brand "Cyklon 300" model regulators for SCUBA diving systems sold in 1974. The regulators manufactured in Sweden by Poseidon Industries AB, imported and distributed nationwide by Parkway Fabricators can be identified by the "Poseidon" brand name, the "Cyklon 300" model name and the following serial number ranges: 15024 through 16523 and 18050 through 18549. The brand name is embossed on the purge button and the serial number is located on the first stage of the regulator.

The intermediate air hose on these regulators may become disconnected from its fitting due to a defect in the hose material. If the fitting disconnects while the unit is submerged, air flow to the diver would be cut off.

Consumers are warned to immediately stop using these regulators. The company is providing free replacement hoses to all consumers who own one of the affected regulators. To obtain the replacement hose, consumers should write to Parkway Fabricators, # 1 Raritan Street, South Amboy, N.J., attn: Cyklon 300 Recall, and provide his or her name, address, telephone number and the serial number of the regulator. A replacement hose along with instructions for installation will

be mailed to each owner. In addition, Parkway has sent direct notification to the approximately 80% of the purchasers of the regulators who have filed warranty cards with the firm. Parkway is also notifying its dealers nationwide and is providing them with posters to warn customers not to use the regulator until a replacement hose is provided.

The firm is aware of approximately 20 instances when the intermediate air hose on the regulator has become disconnected from its fitting. However, no injuries have resulted to divers as a result of this problem. SCUBA REGULATORS RECALLED

WASHINGTON, D.C. (Oct. 1) -- Second-stage scuba regulators which may pose a drowning hazard to divers are being recalled by their manufacturer, Under Sea Industries, Inc., in Compton, California.

A second-stage regulator consists of the diver's mouthpiece and the "purge," which is a button used to clear water from the mouthpiece.

The recall is being conducted in cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission.

An integral exhaust valve, which enables the diver to exhale, may dislodge from its proper position if the purge is depressed and the diver's tongue is blocking the mouthpiece. This can cause the regulator to flood.

The unintentional application of silicon lubricant to the valve or valve seat during servicing is believed to cause the valve displacement.

Approximately 800 of these regulators have been sold in diving stores nationwide at retail prices ranging from \$90 to \$150. The company previously notified its dealers and some consumers about the recall, but poor response has prompted this additional bulletin.

CPSC, TRIDENT ANNOUNCE RECALL OF SCUBA DIVING TANK VALVE CAPS

WASHINGTON, D.C. - In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Trident Diving Equipment, of Chatsworth, Calif., is recalling approximately 500 screw-in DIN Tank Valve Caps. If tank pressure is 3000 psi or greater, the valve cap is not properly inserted, and the air valve is on, the valve caps may fracture and pop out of the air tank, causing injury.

Trident is aware of one incident of injury where a valve cap allegedly popped off a tank and struck the consumer in the hand.

The valve cap, Trident Model RP73, is intended for use on SCUBA diving compressed air tanks to prevent sand, dirt or dust from contaminating the area around the valve. The black plastic caps measure 1" in diameter and 1" thick. The hexagon-shaped caps can be tethered to tanks by a string attached to a plastic eyelet in the top of the cap.

The valve caps were sold between January and June 1995 through Trident's catalog and at dive shops nationwide. The caps cost between \$2.00 and \$4.00 and were packaged in unlabeled plastic bags.

Consumers who own model RP73 caps should call Trident at (800) 234-3483 for a free replacement cap.

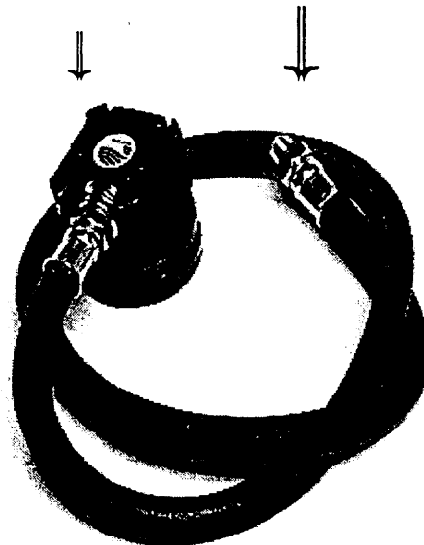
CPSC, TRELLEBORG VIKING ANNOUNCE RECALL OF AIR INLET HOSE

Washington, D.C. - In cooperation with the U.S. Consumer Product Safety Commission (CPSC), Trelleborg Viking, Inc., of Portsmouth, N.H., is announcing the voluntary recall of approximately 5,000 Viking Sport Dry Suit Air Inlet Hose Assemblies for use as scuba diving equipment. If the hose assembly is not properly seated in the air inlet valve on the diver's suit, a free-flow of air into the dry dive suit may occur. If this occurs during a dive, and a diver fails to take standard precautions, death or serious injury, including air embolism, may result.

This recall follows a jury verdict that awarded damages to the spouse of a diver from Anchorage, Alaska who died while using one of the recalled hose assemblies.

The recalled hose assemblies have identifying letters at the point of connection into a diver's first stage regulator. The markings consist of letters and numbers that begin with A, B, or C and end in letters A through L. Other, unmarked Viking hose assemblies sold between January 1, 1982 and March 31, 1988 are also included in this recall.

Dear Mr. DeMarco:

This communication is in response to your request for a status report concerning the above captioned matter.

As of this date Sea Quest has received responses from 518 consumers out of a possible 1421 Spectrum Regulators distributed in the U.S. This information is derived from credit memos issued to Authorized Sea Quest Retailers who have requested compensation for reworking regulators returned to their stores for service and from our internal records for service rendered directly to consumers. 121 of the 217 responses received since October 31, 1994 were from Authorized Retailers and 96 responses were made directly to Sea Quest.

It should be noted that the owners manual provided with each Spectrum Regulator calls for the regulator to be serviced annually and it is possible that some regulators have been reworked by virtue of routine service with no report made to Sea Quest.

Sea Quest has received no complaints of injuries or incidents that affects the scope, prevalence or seriousness of the defect identified in this voluntary recall.

In connection with quality control measures taken to eliminate problems with current and future production, a new seat material resistant to the adverse effects of LocTite is now used and the use of LocTite in the regulator assembly process has been discontinued since July 15, 1994.

Sea Quest continues its efforts to notify Authorized Retailers in connection with the voluntary recall through the periodic Regulator Service seminars conducted by Sea Quest personnel throughout the U.S. At least 120 independent regulator repair technicians received this information at the dive industry trade show (DEMA) in January 1995.

Further, two additional safety announcements have appeared in dive industry trade journals since the last report to the CPSC. Copies of these announcements are attached.

We trust this report provides the information requested.

Cush to Underwater USA

Cathie Cush, NAUI #9510, has been named Executive Editor of *Underwater USA*, America's first newspaper for divers.

Cush, who has contributed to the paper since its inception in 1984, will be responsible for the editorial content of *Underwater USA* and *Wreck Diver*, a monthly newsletter for shipwreck enthusiasts, as well as new project development.

She holds an instructor's rating from NAUI and has participated in expeditions to the wrecks of the *Andrea Doria* and the *U.S.S. Monitor*. She has traveled throughout the Caribbean and visited Fiji, Truk and Thailand.

Cush, holds a degree in English from Fairleigh Dickinson University in New Jersey. For the last 10 years, she has worked as a full-time free-lance writer and editor. Her work has appeared in newspapers and magazines, including *The Baltimore Sun*, *The Chicago Tribune*, *Sports Illustrated*, *Seventeen*, *Outside*, *Caribbean Travel & Life*, *Surfer* and most major dive publications.

Aluminum Alloy Cylinders DOT Advises Caution

The U. S. Department of Transportation has issued a safety advisory to alert owners of cylinders made of certain aluminum alloy to follow precautionary measures to avoid the risk of equipment failure and possible personal injury.

The announcement results from two cylinder ruptures and explosions that were reported to the department's Research and Special Programs Administration (RSPA). The first cylinder that ruptured was part of a SCBA unit manufactured in 1977. The second was part of a scuba unit manufactured in 1982. In both cases, a piece of the cylinder neck separated from the cylinder, causing an explosion. Both cylinders were made from aluminum alloy 6351-T6.

RSPA estimates that approximately seven million cylinders have been manufactured using aluminum alloy 6351-T6. Cylinders made of this alloy are known to be susceptible to sustained load cracking (SLC) in the neck and shoulder area of the cylinder. Extensive research, testing and analysis showed that a cylinder failing from SLC would leak, and not rupture; present data are inconclusive as to why

the two failed cylinders ruptured instead of merely leaking. RSPA is continuing to investigate.

While the agency is further investigating these cylinders, it is recommending the following precautionary measures for cylinders made from aluminum alloy 6351-T6:

- Do not fill a cylinder to greater than the marked service pressure, except during a hydrostatic test;
- Do not fill or use a cylinder if the required retest date has expired; and
- Whenever the cylinder valve is removed, users should visually inspect the interior of the cylinder neck and shoulder areas for cracks.

Any evidence of a crack or crack-like defect may require further evaluation. For guidance on inspecting Luxfer USA cylinders, contact Luxfer USA Limited, Customer Service Department, P. O. Box 5300, Riverside, CA 92517, telephone (909) 684-5110.

RSPA asks that anyone aware of a rupture of any other cylinder manufactured from aluminum alloy 6351-T6, whether the incident was domestic or foreign, should contact the agency at (202) 366-4545.

Urgent Safety Notice — Product Recall

Sea Quest, Inc., Carlsbad, CA, has announced the voluntary recall of all Spectrum Regulators.

A potentially hazardous problem may exist with the high-pressure seat in the first stage that may result in an uncontrolled free-flow of air. If this occurs during a dive, use of the product could be hazardous.

Consumers are warned not to dive with Sea Quest's Spectrum Regulator. Failure to heed

this warning may result in serious injury or death.

Instructors who come in contact with users of the Spectrum regulator are asked to advise them of this recall action.

Consumers are requested to return their regulators to their nearest Sea Quest Authorized Dealer for a free inspection and, as necessary, rework.

This communication is in response to your letter to Steven Meiers dated July 7, 1994, in which you advise Sea Quest of its continuing obligation to supplement or correct the "Full Report" as new information becomes known regarding the voluntary recall of the Spectrum Regulator.

As of this date Sea Quest has received responses from 301 consumers out of a possible 1421 Spectrum Regulators distributed in the U.S. This information is derived from credit memos issued to Authorized Sea Quest Retailers that have requested credit for reworking consumer's regulators returned to their stores for service. Retailers are required to submit the serial number of the regulator serviced in order to receive credit. 243 of the 301 responses were received from retailers and 58 responses were made directly to Sea Quest.

Sea Quest has received no complaints of injury or incidents that affects the scope , prevalence or seriousness of the defect identified.

Sea Quest has received confirmation that all planned advertisements for announcing the recall as disclosed in the "Full Report" have been published. Copies of these advertisements and copies of press releases from other print media are enclosed.

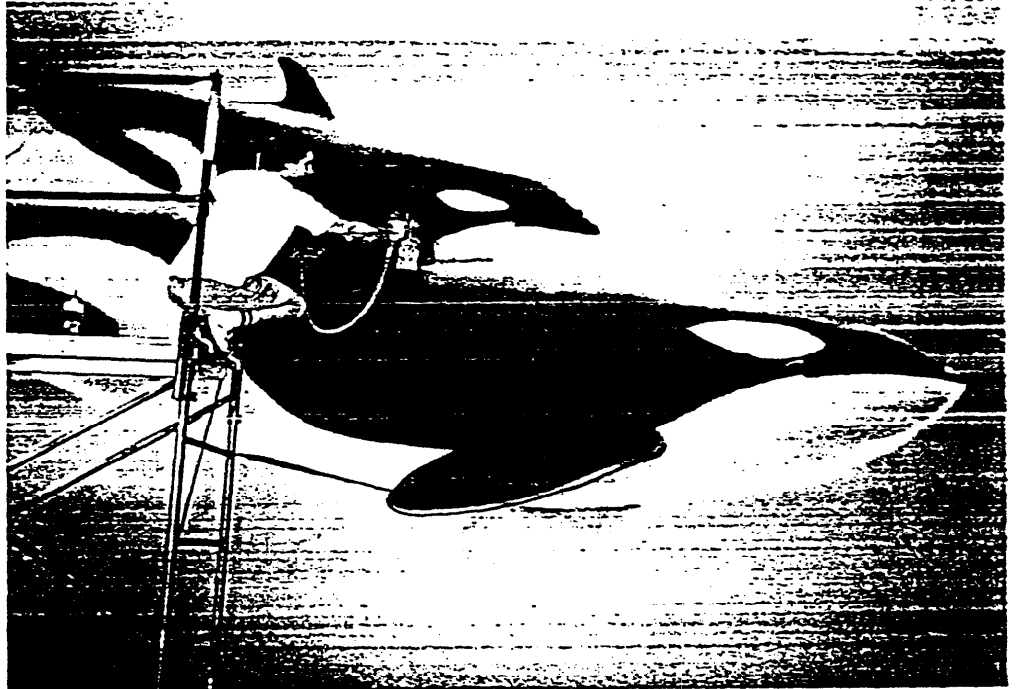
Eight Cities in Eight Weeks

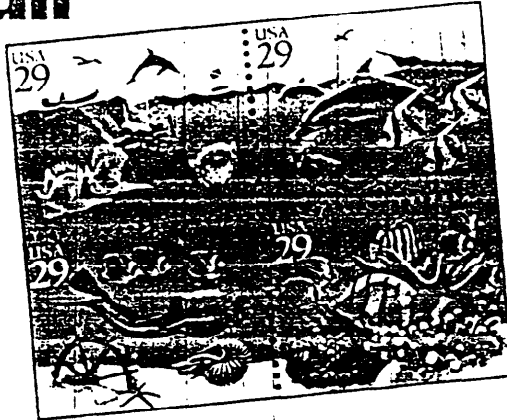
Gilliam elected Chairman of the Board of Directors at NAUI

U.S. Postal Service to issue commemorative scuba stamps

On Oct. 3, the United States Postal Service will unveil the "Wonders of the Seas" commemorative stamps. The four stamps work together to form an underwater seascape featuring scuba divers and marine life.

The U.S. Postal Service selected underwater scenes featuring scuba divers for a variety of reasons, according to Dick Rustin, who is coordinating the stamps' unveiling in Honolulu, Hi. Among them, promoting the beauty of scuba diving and the undersea world to the public.

Rustin believes that the Wonders of the Seas commemorative stamps will be the year's most popular issue. He said that the stamps' print run of 225 million is substantially greater than the typical commemorative run of 125-150 million.

The stamps will be officially circulated into service Oct. 3 during an underwater ceremony — 80 feet/24 meters under the ocean off Waikiki Beach. Reporters, representatives of the U.S. Postal Service and dignitaries will observe the festivities aboard an Atlantis submarine hovering near the site.

The Postal Service is working with PADI (Professional Association of Diving Instructors) on both the unveiling and the promotion of the stamps. Rustin explained "... it's a natural tie for us to work with them on this project. Certainly the best way to experience the wonders of the sea is to become a certified scuba diver and observe the ocean's beauty first-hand. That's what these stamps portray."

The "Wonders of the Seas" stamps will be available at post offices throughout the United States beginning Oct. 4.

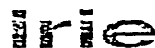


Pennsylvania Goes Jamaican

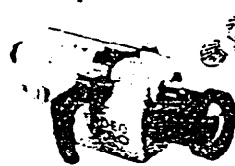

Storm Alberto Clouds Fla. Divers' Vision

Florida Panhandle divers felt the effects of Tropical Storm Alberto well into the summer. The July storm sent murky waters through Florida's bays and into the northern Gulf of Mexico. Some dive shops reported diminished visibility for weeks afterward.

By this month, turbidity should return to normal, said Bob Thompson of the state's Department of Environmental Protection. Sediment from runoff through Choctawhatchee Bay made Destin Pass look "like coffee," according to one dive shop report.

Shannon Grasley, of Fantasea Scuba Shop, said that under a layer of tainted fresh water seven to 10 feet deep, visibility was around 30 feet from two to five miles offshore two weeks after the storm. Inshore, divers saw sediment on the artificial reefs.

Brian McDonald of Gulf Breeze Pro Dive said the rain turned sites along Pensacola Bay "into a night dive" with two- to three-foot visibility.

Visibility improved with distance, ranging from a few feet at a mile offshore to 30 to 40 feet nine miles out. At sites four miles out, he reported a two-foot-thick "cloud" of fresh water under which visibility reached 30 to 40 feet.

Alberto may have done dive operations at Port St. Joe and Panama City a favor.

"Visibility at inshore wrecks has been excellent," said Steve Hord at Hydrospace in Panama City. "Two and a half miles out, we've had 75- to 100-foot visibility."

At Port St. Joe, east of Panama City, Brian Tebon of Captain Black's Dive Shop said although water in St. Joseph's had been "pretty bad," the fresh water was "just cruising up the coastline west toward Panama City."

The *Gatewood*, a wreck at 80 feet deep 10 miles from Port St. Joe, has been visible from the surface since Alberto.

"It's very seldom we see that," he said, adding that the storm likely pushed the cleaner water, and big fish, into the area.

■ Beluga Birth:

A female beluga whale was born at the Aquarium for Wildlife Conservation in Brooklyn in July. The calf, which is not yet named, is estimated to be four and one half feet

long and weigh about 145 pounds. The calf is being monitored around the clock by veterinary staff and will be on public view shortly with her mother Natasha. ■ DCS Research

Does the body's immune system detect and respond to nitrogen bubbles as if they were foreign invaders, triggering decompression sickness? A research team is currently testing the idea, according to an article in *Nor'Easter*, Magazine of the Northeast Sea Grant Programs. The team, led by Claes E.G. Lundgren, a prominent physiologist at the State University of New York (SUNY) at Buffalo and Gerald Logue, is also looking into whether the immune system weakens with age, increasing the risk of decompression sickness. Lundgren hopes the research will result in the ability to test divers to see if they are more susceptible to DCS.

Another study recently completed by Lundgren identifies several drugs that will enhance

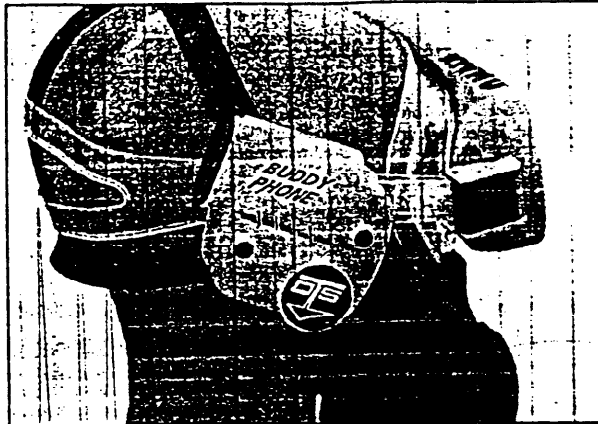

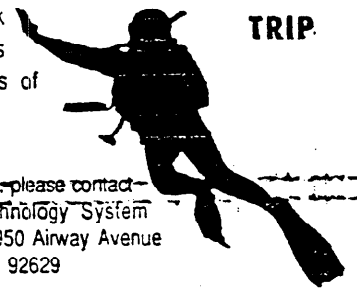

DOT Issues Warning Due to Tank Explosions

The U.S. Department of Transportation issued a safety advisory in July 1994 due to two cylinder ruptures and explosions that were reported to the department's Research and Special Programs Administration (RSPA). One of the SCUBA tanks that ruptured was manufactured in 1977, the other was manufactured in 1982. In both ruptures, a piece of the cylinder neck separated from the cylinder causing an explosion. Both cylinders were made from an aluminum alloy 6351-T6.

RSPA estimates that approximately seven million cylinders have been manufactured using aluminum alloy 351-T6. Cylinders made of this type aluminum are known to be susceptible to sustained load cracking (SLC) in the neck and shoulder area of the cylinder. Extensive research, testing and analysis showed that a cylinder failing from SLC would leak, and not rupture; present data are inconclusive as to why the two failed cylinders ruptured instead of merely leaking. RSPA is continuing to investigate the incidents. It is advised to use precautionary measures when filling or inspecting cylinders made from 6351-T6.

- Do not fill a cylinder greater than the marked service pressure, except during a hydrostatic test;
- Do not fill or use a cylinder if the required retest date has expired;
- Whenever the cylinder valve is removed, users should visually inspect the interior of the cylinder neck and shoulder areas for cracks.

Any evidence of a crack or crack-life defect may require further evaluation. For guidance on inspecting LUXFER USA cylinders, contact Luxfer USA Limited, Customer Service Department, P.O. Box 5300, Riverside, CA 92517. (909) 684-5110).

RSPA asks that any person who is aware of a rupture of this particular type cylinder, or any other cylinder manufactured from aluminum alloy 6351-T6, whether the incident was domestic or foreign, should contact the agency at (202) 366-4545.
