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AES Mandatory Filing

As a result of Public Law (P. L.) 106-113, "Proliferation Prevention Enhancement Act of 1999" the Census Bureau is planning revisions to the Automated Export System (AES) to meet the requirements of the law. P. L. 106-113 authorizes the Census Bureau to require by regulation the mandatory filing of export information through AES for the export of items identified on the Department of Commerce's Commerce Control List (CCL) and the Department of States' U.S. Munitions List (USML) that currently require an SED. The Department of State has requested to have additional data items incorporated into the AES in order to accommodate the requirements of the International Traffic and Arms Regulations (ITAR), Title 22, CFR 120 - 130. 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On December 28, 2001, the Census Bureau published a Pre-submission Notice in the Federal Register summarizing our plans to request clearance from the Office of Management and Budget (OMB) to incorporate eight (8) additional data items in AES as required by the Department of State's Office of Defense Trade Controls. The collection of these eight items will affect only those AES transactions subject to the ITAR. Also, the incorporation of these additional items will eliminate the requirement for exporters to submit the paper SED to the Department of State.

To fully implement mandatory filing we must complete the following actions:

- Prepare and submit the Notice of Proposed Rulemaking (NPRM) - allow for a 60-day comment period.
- Respond to the comments from the NPRM.
- Submit Final Rule (FR) to the Federal Register.
- Allow 90 days for the trade to implement the FR.

We anticipate that all of these actions will be completed in a timeframe that will allow for the implementation of P. L. 106-113 in the fall of 2002.◆



AESDirect Users

The logon procedure for www.aesdirect.gov will change; the anticipated change date is April 1, 2002. Instructional letters are being mailed to all AESDirect registrants. Companies will be required to change their password every 180 days thus providing a more secure network filing capability. This change is the result of Public Law 106-113.

We need your assistance in ensuring a successful change process. An administrator and administrator code will now be required for each company as detailed in the letter of instruction. CUSTOMS' CORNER

- "AES allows filing of DSP-94 shipments" AES will begin allowing the filing of Department of State DSP-94 license shipments beginning March 31, 2002.
- The AES Downtime Policy has been updated on the AES Website: http://www.customsgov/download/aes/downpoln.pdf. Please note that the AES Downtime Guidelines dated November 2001 completely replaces the December 1999 version.
- Export Port Code changes Effective January 1, 2002, the Schedule D will no longer accept codes 1003 - 1081. Please refer to AES Broadcast 2001021 dated October 12, 2001 for details.
- AES allows the reporting of both Commodity (Shipper's Export Declaration) and Transportation Data (Manifest). Effective June 1, 2001, AES released the AES Vessel Transportation Module which was the first mode of transportation in AES to allow the submission of Transportation data. Future planned Transportation Modules include an Enhancement for both Air and Rail.
- U.S. Customs has experienced problems with the reporting of the AES External
 Transaction Number (XTN). Problems include XTN's in error, Option 2 filings not
 being submitted to AES prior to exportation and non-approved filers claiming Option 4
 filing privileges. Shipments with problem XTN's may result in these shipments being
 held or detained until the appropriate information is reported. Fraudulent Option 4
 claims will be referred to the Customs Office of Investigations.
- When problems arise with export shipments (penalties or seizures), the exporter should contact the Fines, Penalties, and Forfeitures (FP&F) office at the local Customs ports from were the action was taken. Once a seizure or penalty has been issued, the filer must work with the local FP&F office to submit a petition and resolve the problem. Contacting Customs Headquarters will not expedite the release of the shipment.
- "Operation Shield America" Customs steps up its efforts to prevent terrorist organizations from acquiring sensitive U.S. technology, weapons and equipment. "Operation Shield America" is aimed at partnering with U.S. manufacturers or distributors to deny terrorists access to these materials. Customs field offices will identify specific U.S. firms in the areas of manufacturing or distribution and visit them. The Customs visits will provide knowledge and solicit these firms to notify Customs if they are approached by customers looking to acquire and export their products illegally. ◆

COMMON REPORTING PROBLEM

SCAC and IATA Codes

When reporting a SCAC code, the operating carrier's code is required. AES matches the SED data reported by USPPIs and forwarders to the exporting carrier data via the SCAC and booking number. We have also seen AES filers reporting their internal Census air carrier codes and misusing the UNKNOWN code. In addition, AES will no longer accept unknown in the booking number field. AES Advantage- Export Commodity Information Filing Options

An advantage of using AES to report export commodity (Shipper's Export Declaration-SED) information is that filers have two options for specifying commodity details. They may choose to summarize or not to summarize their shipment data by commodity number. On paper SEDs, filers must, by law, summarize their shipment data by commodity number (that is, add all value together for each individual Schedule B or HTS Number). This can be quite tedious, especially if the source data contained on commercial invoices or other shipping documents or records are not summarized.

Hundreds of AES filers have already chosen the option not to summarize shipment data by commodity number. Filers doing so must follow two simple rules. First, they must report all export transactions, regardless of value, including values of \$2,500 or less. Hypothetical example: The Schedule B is 3405 10 0000, Shoe Polish. The commercial invoice display 21kg @ \$1500; 15kg @ \$1000; 10 kg @ \$500 and 40 kg @ \$3000. In this example, using AES, each line of data is entered as an individual commodity line item, without the tedious task of summarizing all value.

We both benefit when all commodity values for each individual HTS or Schedule B Number is reported. For you, it eliminates the time consuming process of summarizing commodity data from commercial invoices or other shipping documents. For us, the process allows the ability to capture more accurate commodity information for statistical purposes.

Note: the \$2,500 filing exemption only applies to shipment data summarized by individual commodity number.

The second rule is to report consistently. In other words, filers choosing not to summarize their shipment data by commodity number must report this way for all their shipments. They cannot choose to report both ways. Authorized agents of U.S. principal parties in interest (USPPIs) reporting export commodity information on AES must file consistently for each separate USPPI. •
