<u>Waterfowl Activity</u>: An increase in coot were observed. These birds were likely moving up from the south, as large numbers of these birds had not been observed in prior surveys. A small flock of waterfowl were observed flying high and moving North, as well. Also, a flock of 90 – 100 sandhill crains flew over the refuge on 2/13/08.

<u>Hunting Pressure and Success</u>: No activity to report.

<u>Weather</u>: The morning low was 35°F and the afternoon high was 54°F. The winds were blowing from the south – southwest.

<u>Habitat</u>: Waterfowl were observed in both open waters and flooded timber.
