SUMMARY: In accordance with section 113(g) of the Clean Air Ac t (``Act''), notice is hereby given of proposed settlements in the e following cases: American Petroleum Institute v. U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, No. 94-1273 (D.C. Cir.), and Institute of Makers of Explosi ves v. U.S. Environmental Protection Agency, No. 94-1276 (D.C. Cir.).

These cases involve challenges to the final rule, entitle d `List of Regulated Substances and Thresholds for Accidenta l Release Prevention; Requirements for Petitions Under Section 112(r) of the Clean Air Act as Amended,'' which, inter alia, established a list of substances to be subject to regulation under the a ccident prevention provisions of the A ct and threshold quantities for such substances. 59 Fed. Reg. 4478 (Jan. 31, 1994). Under the terms of the proposed settlements, the Environmental Protection Agenc y (EPA) would conduct a rulemaking concerning amendment of the above-mentioned final rule to delist certain chemicals and to modify certain other provisions.

For a period of thirty (30) days following the date o publication of this notice, EPA will receive written comment relating to the settlements from persons who were not named a s parties to the litigation in question. The Agency or the Dep of Justice may withhold or withdraw consent to the propose d settle ments if the comments disclose facts or circumstances tha indicate that such consent is inappropriate, improper, inadequate, or inconsistent with the requirements of the Act.
