
SIZE: 262, 290 square feet

FACILITIES: Ten training courtrooms, two 50-seat lecture halls, one 75-seat lecture hall, one 130-seat lecture hall, one 190-seat lecture hall, a 440-person conference room, a 150-seat dining hall with full kitchen, 264 sleeping rooms, one fully-equipped production studio



JTN: Justice Television Network broadcasts training to all 94 US Attorney's offices

ITEC Building: Located at 1600 Hampton Street, ITEC provides training in state of the art technology in 3 computer labs, a server lab, a computer enhanced courtroom, and two fully-equipped production studios.
