#### Current Status -

The EPA signed the Preliminary Close Out Report (PCOR) for the State Marine Superfund Site
on June 22, 2007. The PCOR documents that construction activities have been completed for
the site. Since a Time Critical Removal Action was conducted for the State Marine site which
resulted in a no further action remedy, the site qualified for construction completion.

State Marine of Port Arthur

 On April 18, 2007, the EPA signed a No Further Action Necessary Record of Decision for the Site. The Texas Commission on Environmental Quality (TCEQ) concurred on the selected remedy.

#### Benefits -

- In August 2001, EPA Region 6 completed a Time Critical Removal Action to remove source materials from the site. Removal activities included waste removal, water treatment, oil/water separation, and sludge stabilization and off-site disposal.
- The site does not pose a risk to human health or the environment. Therefore, the site can be used for industrial/commercial purposes.

Location: The State Marine of Port Arthur Superfund Site is located in Port Arthur, Texas, on Old

Yacht Club Road on Pleasure Islet, a peninsula located approximately 0.5 mile southwest

of the mouth of the Neches River.

Population: Approximately 61,000 people live in the City of Port Arthur.


Setting: The owner is currently using the Site as an industrial property and land use surrounding

the Site is industrial.

Hydrology: The shallow ground water at the Site is not considered a potential drinking water source.

The shallow ground water resulted from the adjacent shipping channel dredge materials

that were used to build the island where the Site is located.



## Health Considerations —

Based on the Time Critical Removal Action and subsequent site investigations, the site does not pose a risk to human health or the environment. The site risk analysis was based on an industrial/commercial future land use scenario.
