Proposed Deletion from National Priorities List Mid-America Tanning Company, Sergeant Bluff, Iowa

INTRODUCTION

The Environmental Protection Agency (EPA) is proposing to delete the Mid-America Tanning Company Superfund site from the National Priorities List. The site was added to the National Priorities List, or NPL, in 1989. The NPL is a list of hazardous waste sites in the country. The lowa Department of Natural Resources (IDNR) concurs with this action. The Notice of Deletion was published on July 26, 2004. A 30-day comment period follows. EPA is asking the public for comments on the deletion.

BACKGROUND

The Mid-America Tanning Company site, located south of Sergeant Bluff, lowa, covers approximately 100 acres and processed hides under several names between 1969 and 1989. In 1979, the Mid-America Tanning Company disposed of an estimated 1,300 cubic yards of tannery sludges containing chromium into two unlined trenches on the property.

U.S. Tanning acquired the operation in 1985. Wastes were treated on site. Solids were settled out in concrete-lined basins and unlined impoundments, while liquids were chemically treated and then discharged into an oxbow lake. Impoundment sludges were thought to emit dangerous levels of hydrogen sulfide gas if disturbed.

The site is in the Missouri River flood plain. Approximately 85 people live within a 1-mile radius of the site, and 850 people live within 3 miles.

SITE ACTIVITIES

The site has been addressed through Federal, State, and potentially responsible parties' actions. These actions included the following:

EPA excavated approximately 1,300 cubic yards of contaminated soil and sludge from on-site burial pits.

- The material was immobilized and capped as part of the final cleanup remedy.
- EPA removed any raw materials found on site and recycled them.
- A PRP completed the removal of drum wastes, cleaned two buildings, and secured other buildings on the site.
- EPA amended the original remedy to address the threat of a potential release of unacceptable levels of hydrogen sulfide gas.
- IDNR has assumed responsibility over the operation and maintenance of the remedial action.

DELETION ACTION

EPA and IDNR have determined that all appropriate actions under Superfund have been completed. The clean-up actions at the site were successful in removing chromium, arsenic, barium, and lead that exceeded a health-based level. This was accomplished by excavating and capping buried sludges and soils, and by treating contaminated water on the site.

Since hazardous substances were left on the site, five year reviews will be conducted. The first five year review was conducted in 2003, and showed that the remedy was protective of human health and the environment.
