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## RULES AND RELATED MATTERS

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### OBLIGATION TO FILE FORM N-27D-2 RESCINDED

The Commission previously announced the withdrawal of Form N-27D-2 under the Investment Company Act of 1940. The Commission has now rescinded the obligation to file Form N-27D-2 under the Act. (Rel. 33-6591B)

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## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

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### TEMPORARY SUSPENSION OF REGULATION A EXEMPTION OF TELETEST CORPORATION

The Commission ordered that the Regulation A exemption of Teletest Corporation, a Delaware corporation with offices located in New York City, be temporarily suspended.

The Order results from Teletest's filing of a Notification and Offering Circular on November 30, 1984, later amended, relating to a proposed offering of 450,000 units consisting of common stock and warrants for a total amount of \$1,800,000.

The Order alleges that Teletest's Offering Circular contains untrue statements of material facts and material omissions including, but not limited to: an overstatement of approximately \$279,600, at December 31, 1984, and \$139,250, at March 31, 1985, of Teletest's stated assets of \$280,700 and \$140,350, respectively; and failure to disclose that Teletest's financial statements were not prepared in accordance with generally accepted accounting principles. The Order also alleges that Teletest failed to comply with Regulation A in that it failed to file required exhibits and, as amended, the offering exceeded the Regulation A ceiling; and that, if made, the offering would be in violation of Section 17 of the Securities Act of 1933. 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## CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

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### COMPLAINT NAMES RCH INTERNATIONAL, INC. AND ROGER C. HESTERMAN

The New York Regional Office filed a complaint on July 16 in the U.S. District Court for the District of New Jersey against RCH International, Inc., a Short Hills, New Jersey company, and Roger C. Hesterman, its president and sole director.

The complaint alleges that the defendants offered and sold unregistered RCH securities using false and misleading prospectuses in violation of the antifraud and registration provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Among other things, the prospectuses falsely inflated the value of the assets owned by RCH and misled investors as to the prospects for a public offering of RCH stock.

Simultaneously with the filing of the complaint, the defendants, without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations, consented to: (1) permanent injunctions prohibiting further violations of the securities laws described above; (2) disgorge all proceeds received from the sale of RCH securities; and (3) account for and file a repayment plan of said proceeds. (SEC v. RCH International, Inc., USDC DNJ, Civ. 85-3492F). (LR-10828)

## PERMANENT INJUNCTION ENTERED AGAINST KEVIN HASTY

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on July 18 Judge Clyde Cahill, U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Missouri, entered an Order of Permanent Injunction against Kevin Hasty, enjoining him from violations of the antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Hasty consented to the Order without admitting or denying the complaint's allegations.

The July 17 complaint alleged that from about May 1983 to about Spring 1985, Hasty offered and sold securities in the form of United States Treasury Bills and units in a mutual fund that invested in United States government securities options to approximately 33 investors and raised at least \$700,000. No securities, however, were ever purchased. The complaint further alleged that Hasty made material misrepresentations and omissions to investors regarding: the use of investors' money; the safety, security and liquidity of the investment; the use of and existence of entities through which purchases of the securities would be made; and Hasty's previous sanctions by regulatory agencies. (SEC v. Kevin Hasty, EDMO, Civil Action No. 85-1620 C [4], filed July 17, 1985). (LR-10829)

Orders have been issued declaring that Holdings of U.S. Government Securities, Inc., Holding Trust, Fundpack, Inc. and Eaton & Howard Balanced Fund have ceased to be investment companies. (Rel. IC-14642; IC-14643; IC-14644; IC-14645 - July 23)

SBD LEASE FUNDING CORPORATION

An order has been issued exempting SBD Lease Funding Corporation from all provisions of the Investment Company Act. (Rel. IC-14646 - July 23)

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## HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES

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JERSEY CENTRAL POWER & LIGHT COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 16 to request a hearing on a proposal by Jersey Central Power & Light Company, Metropolitan Edison Company and Pennsylvania Electric Company, subsidiaries of General Public Utilities Corporation, to amend a credit agreement to reimburse the banks for the increased cost incurred in making, funding or maintaining DMM-Bid Rate borrowings under the credit agreement which result from any change in law or governmental regulation or the compliance therewith by any bank. MIDDLE SOUTH UTILITIES, INC.

A supplemental order has been issued regarding the financing of pollution control facilities at the Grand Gulf Nuclear Electric Generating Station by Middle South Energy, Inc., subsidiary of Middle South Utilities, Inc., through the issuance and sale by Claiborne County, Mississippi, of \$44 million in pollution control revenue bonds. (Rel. 35-23770 - July 23)

WEST TEXAS UTILITIES COMPANY

An order has been issued authorizing West Texas Utilities Company, subsidiary of Central and South West Corporation, to repurchase for cash a substantial portion of its first mortgage bonds, Series J, 15-1/4% due November 15, 2011, and 16-1/8% debentures, Series 1982, due June 1, 2012 (collectively Securities), through a tender offer to the holders of the Securities. West Texas also proposes to issue up to \$55 million aggregate principal amount of first mortgage bonds in order to fund the purchase of the tendered Securities. (Rel. 35-23771 - July 23)

Persons eligible to use the short form (Schedule 13G) may in lieu of filing a Schedule 13D file a Schedule 13G within 45 days after the end of the calendar year in which the person became subject to Section 13(d)(1). Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
