ORDER ISSUED UNDER SECTION 304(d) OF THE TRUST INDENTURE ACT

The Commission has issued an order under Section 304(d) of the Trust Indenture Act on an application by Coltec Industries, Inc. (Company), with respect to an indenture (Indenture) among the Company, certain guarantors, and Bankers Trust Company, as trustee, conditionally exempting specified provisions of the Indenture from the requirements of Section 314(d) of the Act. ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

COMMISSION BARS IRA BOSHNACK AND ANDREW FRIEDMAN, FORMER PRINCIPALS AT STRATTON OAKMONT, INC., AND DOUGLAS MILLER, A FORMER REGISTERED REPRESENTATIVE ASSOCIATED WITH STRATTON, AND ORDERS OTHER REMEDIAL RELIEF

On August 18, the Commission settled public administrative and cease and desist proceedings pursuant to Section 8A of the Securities Act of 1933 (Securities Act) and Sections 15(b), 19(h) and 21(C) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act), against Ira A. Boshnack and Andrew S. Friedman, former principals at Stratton Oakmont, Inc., the now defunct former registered broker-dealer, and Douglas C. Miller, a former registered representative at Stratton. Without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, Boshnack, Friedman, and Miller consented to the entry of an Order finding that they each participated in a scheme to fraudulently pass the Series 7 and/or Series 24 licensing exams administered by the NASD, and, as a result, they willfully aided and abetted and caused violations by Stratton of Section 15(b)(7) of the Exchange Act and Rule 15b7-1 thereunder. The Order further finds that Boshnack and Friedman willfully violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, by making baseless price predictions to customers and unauthorized trades in customer accounts. The Order bars Boshnack, Friedman and Miller from associating with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser or municipal securities dealer, directs them to

cease and desist from committing or causing any violations and future violations of the above provisions, and directs them to each pay disgorgement and interest: Boshnack, \$106,881.42; Friedman, \$10,928; and Miller, \$6,004. (Rel. 33-7564; 34-40332; File No. 3-9491)

COMMISSION BARS ERIC BLUMEN, JORDAN SHAMAH AND IRVING STITSKY, FORMER PRINCIPALS AT STRATTON OAKMONT, INC., AND ORDERS OTHER REMEDIAL RELIEF

On August 18, the Commission settled public administrative and cease and desist proceedings pursuant to Section 8A of the Securities Act of 1933 and Sections 15(b), 19(h) and 21(C) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act), against Eric S. Blumen, Jordan I. Shamah and Irving Stitsky, former principals at Stratton Oakmont, Inc., the now defunct former registered broker-dealer. Without admitting or denying the Commission's findings, Blumen, Shamah and Stitsky consented to the entry of an Order finding that Blumen, Shamah and Stitsky willfully violated Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 and Section 10(b) of the Exchange Act and Rule 10b-5 thereunder, by making unauthorized trades in customer accounts, and, as to Blumen, by also making baseless price predictions to customers. The Order further finds that Blumen participated in a scheme to fraudulently pass the Series 24 licensing exam administered by the NASD, and, as a result, Blumen willfully aided and abetted and caused violations by Stratton of Section 15(b)(7) of the Exchange Act and Rule 15b7-1 thereunder. The Order bars Blumen, Shamah and Stitsky from associating with any broker, dealer, investment company, investment adviser or municipal securities dealer, directs them to cease and desist from committing or causing any violations and future violations of the above provisions that they respectively violated or caused to be violated, directs Blumen and Shamah to each pay disgorgement and interest, but waives payment based on their demonstrated inability to pay, and directs Stitsky to pay disgorgement and interest in the total amount of \$22,716, and a civil penalty of \$18,500. COMMISSION OBTAINS TEMPORARY RESTRAINING ORDER, ASSET FREEZE AGAINST JAMES COGLEY AND THE OHIO ESTATE GROUP

On August 11, the Commission obtained an Order from the United States District Court in Columbus, Ohio today temporarily restraining James Michael Cogley (Cogley), and The Ohio Estate Group (OEG) from violating the antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws. The Court also froze all of the assets of Cogley and OEG. A preliminary injunction hearing is scheduled for August 18. On August 13, the Commission moved for a finding of contempt against Cogley alleging that Cogley, within a day of the Court entering the Order, violated two provisions of the Order that freeze his assets and prohibit him from receiving funds for investment. The Court issued a warning to Cogley during the hearing on the Commission's motion, but reserved ruling on the motion until the preliminary injunction hearing.

Since at least August 1997, Cogley and OEG have been engaged in a scheme to defraud primarily elderly and retired investors by misrepresenting facts relating to the use of invested funds, the safety of those funds, and the return on the investments. Moreover, Cogley and OEG failed to tell investors of Cogley's disciplinary and financial history and OEG's dire financial condition. The defendants received approximately \$2,400,000 from at least 44 investors. Investors were told that their funds would be invested in real estate or business development projects. In fact, less than 10% of the funds received were invested in any real estate projects. The majority of funds were actually used to pay Cogley's personal expenses, OEG's business expenses and principal and interest payments to earlier investors. [SEC v. SETTLED INSIDER TRADING CASE AGAINST ROY HANDOJO

The Commission announced today that the United States District Court for the Southern District of New York entered an Order of Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Equitable Relief against Roy Handojo, an Indonesian national and visiting analyst formerly employed in J.P. Morgan & Co., Inc.'s New York office, for engaging in flagrant insider trading in five companies. According to the Commission's amended complaint filed on October 20, 1997, Handojo, while working in J.P. Morgan's Financial Institutions Group, purchased the securities in five companies involved in four separate merger negotiations in which J.P. Morgan was participating as an adviser. From July through September 1997, in each of the merger transactions, Handojo purchased securities days before the companies announced that they had entered into definitive merger agreements. The Court's Order permanently restrained and enjoined Handojo from violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934.

According to the Commission's complaint, Handojo purchased the common stock of Signet Banking Corp., a J.P. Morgan client, less than a week before the July 21, 1997 announcement of Signet's acquisition by First Union Corp. As a result of that trade, Handojo realized \$90,728 in profits. Handojo also bought shares of ACC Consumer Finance Corp.'s common stock several days before the August 25, 1997 announcement that Household International Inc., another J.P. Morgan client, would acquire ACC by merger, thus realizing \$60,250 in profits. In addition, in the three days prior to the August 29, 1997 announcement of NationsBank Corporation's acquisition of Barnett Banks, Inc., a J.P. Morgan client, Handojo purchased the securities of Barnett and realized \$216,062 in profits. Handojo also engaged in insider trading with respect to his purchases of the securities of Great Financial Corporation two weeks prior to the September 15, 1997 announcement that another company would acquire Great Financial. At the time of Handojo's purchases of Great Financial's common stock, J.P. Morgan's Financial Institutions Group acted as an adviser to an Ohio-based bank holding company in its competing effort to acquire Great Financial. As a result of Handojo's Great Financial purchases, he realized \$261,012 in profits. Thus, Handojo's total profits from all of his illegal

trading is \$628,052.

Handojo, without admitting or denying the allegations contained in the Commission's amended complaint, consented to the entry of the Order. Handojo also agreed to disgorge the sum of \$628,052, representing his gains from the conduct alleged in the Commission's amended complaint, plus prejudgment interest thereon in the amount of \$36,571; however, based upon Handojo's demonstrated financial inability to pay, all but \$588,765.72 of such disgorgement and prejudgment interest was waived and a civil penalty was not imposed on Handojo. Previously, on November 6, 1997, Handojo pleaded guilty to a one-count information of securities fraud in the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of New York in connection with his illegal insider trading. On March 10, 1998, the Court sentenced Handojo to fifteen months of incarceration, followed by two years of supervised release. COMMISSION OBTAINS ORDER OF PRELIMINARY INJUNCTION, ACCOUNTING, ASSET FREEZE AND OTHER RELIEF AGAINST CLARENCE COOK, BRIAN CAUSEY, HAVEN QUEST AND CAYMAN SOUTH INTERNATIONAL, INC.

The Commission announced today Judge Jack T. Camp of the United States District Court for the Northern District of Georgia entered a Order of Preliminary Injunction and Other Relief against Clarence Wayne Cook (Cook), Brian E. Causey (Causey), Haven Quest and Cayman South International, Inc. (Cayman). The four defendants consented to the entry of the preliminary injunction without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint. The complaint alleges that Cook and Causey used their controlled entities Haven Quest and Cayman to orchestrate a prime bank offer and sale of investments in fraudulent international trading program using misrepresentations and omissions of fact to investors and agents.

The Commission's complaint alleges that Cook and Causey, individually and through Haven Quest and Cayman, effected the scheme by falsely promoting the purported trading programs as legitimate, virtually no-risk investments with projected returns of 900% in 20 weeks for the Cayman program and up to 500% over ten months for the Haven Quest program, when the programs touted were non-existent and they had no reasonable basis for such projections. Cook and Causey falsely represented that investor funds would be secured by bank certificates of deposit, and failed to disclose that Haven Quest would pay at least 20% of all investor funds directly to themselves as purported commissions pursuant to undisclosed agreements with Haven Quest. Cook and Causey also failed to disclose that \$430,000 of funds raised from Haven Quest investors would be used to refund monies to Cayman program investors when the Cayman program failed due to an unsuccessful "trade." The complaint further alleges that while continuing their scheme, the defendants conducted offerings by use of the mails and other channels in

interstate commerce to sell at least \$3 million in securities in the Cayman and Haven Quest programs to investors throughout the country.

The complaint seeks preliminary and permanent injunctions against the four defendants to prevent their future violations of Section 17(a) of the Securities Act of 1933 (Securities Act) and Section 10(b) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 (Exchange Act) and Rule 10b-5 thereunder. The complaint also seeks an accounting, disgorgement, prejudgment interest and civil penalties from the four defendants. [SEC v. Clarence Wayne Cook, Brian E. ACCELERATED APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Depository Trust Company filed a proposed rule change (SR-DTC-98-8) under Section 19(b)(1) of the Exchange Act that will increase the maximum net debit cap employed in DTC's settlement system by \$250 million and modify DTC's procedures for allocating the net debit cap of a participant having more than one account family. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of August 24. (Rel. 34-40330)
