ENFORCEMENT PROCEEDINGS

SECURITIES AND EXCHANGE COMMISSION SEEKS TO COMPEL SAFETECH INDUSTRIES, INC. TO FILE DELINQUENT PERIODIC REPORTS

On September 18, the Commission filed a complaint in the United

States District Court for the District of Columbia against Safetech Industries, Inc. (Safetech Industries). The complaint alleges that Safetech Industries, a company that manufactures and markets hurricane protection products and whose securities are quoted in the pink sheets, failed to make available to the investing public current and accurate information about its financial condition and results of operation through the filing of periodic reports with the Commission as required by the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Specifically, the complaint alleges that Safetech Industries has not filed its Annual Report on Form 10-K for the fiscal year ended March 31, 1998, its Quarterly Reports on Form 10-Q for the fiscal quarters ended December 31, 1997 and June 30, 1998 and nine Notifications of Late Filing with respect to its delinquent reports. The Commission seeks to compel Safetech Industries to file its delinquent periodic reports and enjoin Safetech Industries from further violations of Section 13(a) of the Exchange Act of 1934 and Rules 12b-25, 13a-1 and 13a-13 thereunder. NEW YORK PROMOTER SETTLES SEC CHARGES AND PLEADS GUILTY; SIXTH TO PLEAD IN SYSTEMS OF EXCELLENCE MICROCAP PUMP AND DUMP SCHEME

The Commission filed a complaint on September 18 against Michelle Sotnikow (Sotnikow), a New York stock promoter, for her role in the manipulation of the market for the stock of Systems of Excellence, Inc. (SOE) in 1995 and 1996. Simultaneously with the Commission filing the complaint, Sotnikow, without admitting or denying the Commission's allegations, settled the action by consenting to the entry of a permanent injunction from violations of the securities registration and antifraud provisions of the federal securities laws, and an order requiring her to disgorge her illegal profits of \$474,308, provided that upon her transfer of \$110,000 in cash and certain other non-cash assets to the Court-appointed Receiver in the action, collection of the remaining disgorgement will be waived in light of Sotnikow's demonstrated inability to pay based on her sworn representations in her statement of financial condition. Sotnikow also agreed to a Commission order barring her from participating in an offering of penny stock.

In a parallel criminal action, Sotnikow pled guilty and was sentenced to three years of supervised probation and other special conditions including being barred from participation in the securities industry. Sotnikow was sentenced pursuant to a criminal information charging her with one count of conspiracy to commit securities fraud and defeat the lawful function of the Internal Revenue Service. Sotnikow's guilty plea was the sixth related to the SOE pump and dump scheme. [Securities and Exchange Commission v. Michelle Sotnikow, 98-CV-2227, GK, D.D.C.; U.S. v. COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST SANJAY SAXENA AND MUMTAZ SAXENA

On September 18, the Commission filed a complaint against Sanjay Saxena, a former registered investment adviser previously enjoined

from violations of the antifraud and registration provisions and barred by the Commission in 1995, and his wife, Mumtaz Saxena. The complaint alleges that Saxena's role in an investment adviser and two investment companies violated the bar order, that Saxena used his wife as a front to create the appearance that he had not violated the order, and that both Saxenas violated the antifraud and registration provisions.

The Saxenas made material misrepresentations in the unregistered public offerings of interests in two investment companies, which raised approximately \$3.4 million. The Saxenas received approximately \$280,000 in management fees from the funds. Saxena also violated the bar order by acting as an investment adviser for accounts at a broker-dealer, for which he collected approximately \$27,000 in advisory fees. The complaint seeks an order commanding Saxena to comply with the bar order, permanent injunctions, disgorgement, prejudgment interest, and civil monetary penalties.

In the prior court action, Saxena consented to a permanent injunction after the Commission obtained a temporary restraining order based on allegations that Saxena misappropriated over \$600,000 from investors. COMPLAINT FILED AGAINST COMMERCIAL EXPRESS, LLC, PROGRESSIVE FINANCIAL, INC. AND OTHERS

On September 17, the Commission filed a complaint in the U.S. District Court for the District of Colorado against the perpetrators a \$15 million telemarketing Ponzi scheme. Named as defendants in the action are Commercial Express, LLC and Progressive Financial, Inc., of Santa Monica, California, as well as eighteen other individuals and entities. The defendants raised funds from investors to purportedly purchase air time on television stations for infomercials.

The defendants have raised at least \$15 million from approximately 500 investors nationwide through sales of media units and equity participations offering quarterly returns ranging from 8% to 26%. Investors were solicited through a boiler room operation at the Santa Monica offices and through independent sales offices throughout the United States. The complaint alleges that more than \$4.5 million was transferred to the principals of Commercial Express and Progressive Financial and that only \$1.4 million was spent on product development and television advertising time.

The complaint alleges that the defendants have defrauded investors by conducting a Ponzi scheme; failed to disclose excessive commissions of approximately 60%; failed to disclose that the companies have no business operations to generate revenue for future distributions; and misrepresented that the companies have significant contracts with third parties. The court denied the Commission's motion for a temporary restraining order and set a hearing on the Commission's motion for a preliminary injunction for September 28, 1998. [SEC v. SELF-REGULATORY ORGANIZATIONS

PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The National Association of Securities Dealers has filed a proposed rule change (SR-NASD-98-67) under Rule 19b-4 of the Exchange Act to clarify the NASD's intent that it will be responsible to ensure that Amex LLC will fulfill its self-regulatory obligations and will have the resources necessary to do so. The proposed rule change also is intended to ensure sufficient non-Industry representation on the Board of Governors of Amex LLC. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of September 21. (Rel. 34-40443)

IMMEDIATE EFFECTIVENESS OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGES

A proposed rule change (SR-PCX-98-46) filed by the Pacific Exchange relating to guidelines for consolidation of specialist posts has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of September 21. (Rel. 34-40449)

A proposed rule change (SR-PCX-98-43) filed by the Pacific Exchange relating to OptiMark pricing has become effective under Section 19(b)(3)(A) of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Publication of the proposal is expected in the Federal Register during the week of September 21. (Rel. 34-40442)

APPROVAL OF PROPOSED RULE CHANGE

The Commission granted accelerated approval of a proposed rule change and Amendment No. 1 thereto submitted by the American Stock Exchange (SR-Amex-98-27) relating to a change in the methodology of calculating settlement values for the Eurotop 100 Index. Publication of the order is expected to appear in the Federal Register during the week of September 21. (Rel. 34-40448; International Series Release No. 1158)
