### CHANGE IN THE MEETING: CANCELLATION

The following open meeting scheduled for Thursday, April 9, 1987, at 10:00 a.m. has been cancelled.

Consideration of whether to issue a release proposing an amendment to Rule 3a12-8 under the Securities Exchange Act of 1934 that would designate as an exempted security, solely for purposes of futures trading thereon, foreign government debt (a) issued by any country the sovereign debt of which is rated in one of the two highest rating categories of two nationally recognized rating agencies, or (b) issued by the governments of Australia, France and New Zealand. ## ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

---

### REGULATION A CONDITIONAL EXEMPTION OF COLORADO ISSUER TEMPORARILY SUSPENDED

The Commission ordered that the conditional exemption from registration provided by Regulation A claimed by a Colorado issuer be temporarily suspended under Rule 261(a) of Regulation A. Newsearch, Inc., now known as Newsearch Restaurants, Inc., a Colorado corporation headquartered in Omaha, Nebraska, had claimed the exemption for sale of common stock in a blank check offering under Section 3(b) of the Securities Act of 1933.

The order of suspension alleged that the offering circular failed to disclose the identity of a person who held the controlling shares of Newsearch; the existence of a prearranged agreement for Newsearch to acquire all of the outstanding common stock of Stemo, Inc., a privately-held Arkansas corporation; and the intended use of offering proceeds in connection with the payment of certain offering expenses.

The order further provides that interested persons may file with the Commission Secretary written request for a hearing within 30 days after entry of the order. If such request is received, the Commission will set a hearing to determine whether the suspension should be made permanent. If no hearing is requested, the order will become permanent the thirtieth day after entry. (Rel. 33-6694)

## CRIMINAL PROCEEDINGS

---

### GARY DONALD EDER INDICTED

The New York Regional Office and Rudolph W. Giuliani, U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York, announced that on March 12 Gary Donald Eder, former vice-president and registered representative of Paine, Webber, Jackson and Curtis, Inc., was indicted by a federal grand jury in connection with a money laundering scheme. The two-count indictment charged Eder with conspiracy and the creation of false books and records.

According to the indictment, Eder conspired with other Paine, Webber employees to prevent the creation of Currency Transaction Reports (CTR's) for filing with the Internal Revenue Service; to create false records disguising the receipt of cash from Paine, Webber customers; and to destroy Paine, Webber records.

The indictment alleges that Eder received cash from individual customers in amounts up to \$70,000 at one time, but avoided the creation of CTR's by purchasing bank checks in amounts just under \$10,000 and by depositing the cash in amounts just under \$10,000 on several different days. Altogether, Eder and co-conspirators deposited over \$700,000 into customers' accounts without creating CTR's.

If convicted, Eder faces maximum penalties of ten years imprisonment and a \$260,000 fine. (U.S. v. Gary Donald Eder, 87 Cr. 196, USDC SDNY). (LR-11379)

#### **CHAIM SEGALL INDICTED**

The New York Regional Office and Rudolph W. Giuliani, U.S. Attorney for the Southern District of New York, announced that on March 12 a federal grand jury indicted Chaim Segall on a charge of mail fraud arising out of a pattern of "free riding" -- that is, purchasing securities without intending to pay for them.

The indictment charges that, from October 1984 through October 1986, Segall opened nine accounts at seven different securities broker-dealers, often with a false name and false social security number. According to the indictment, Segall used these accounts to place orders for the purchase of securities, but failed to make payment. He then induced the broker-dealers to spend their own funds for the securities without any financial risk to himself. The indictment further charges that, as a result of Segall's "free riding" scheme, the broker-dealers lost a total of approximately \$18,257 and, before liquidating his accounts, were exposed to potential losses totaling approximately \$470,148.

If convicted, Segall faces maximum penalties of five years imprisonment and a \$250,000 fine. (U.S. v. Chaim Segall, 87 Cr. 199, USDC SDNY). (LR-11380)

## **INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

### **BANKERS SECURITY LIFE INSURANCE SOCIETY**

An order has been issued granting Bankers Security Life Insurance Society, Bankers Security Variable Annuity Funds M, P, and Q, and Oppenheimer Fund Management, Inc. exemptions from the provisions of Sections 26(a) and 27(c)(2) of the Investment Company Act to permit the deduction of mortality and expense risk charges in connection with the issuance of individual flexible purchase payment variable annuity contracts. ## **HOLDING COMPANY ACT RELEASES**

### **NORTHEAST UTILITIES**

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until April 12 to request a hearing on a proposal by the following company filed under Release 35-24351, dated March 19: Northeast Utilities (NU) - a registered holding company, and its subsidiary, Northeast Utilities Service Company (NUSCO), whereby NU would invest up to \$10,001,000 in securities of Executive Risk Incorporated (ERI), a nonassociated Delaware company, in order for NUSCO to obtain directors' and officers' (D & O) insurance for the NU system companies.

ERI is a company organized to own a company dedicated to reinsuring The Aetna Casualty and Surety Company for D & O coverage to be written through an underwriting manager. NU proposes to acquire 150,000 shares of ERI Class A common stock for an aggregate purchase price of \$1.5 million, 85,000 shares of the 7-1/2% cumulative convertible preferred stock for an aggregate purchase price of \$8.5 million, and 100,000 warrants to purchase up to 100,000 shares of common stock at an exercise price of \$10 per share for an aggregate purchase price of \$1,000. Initially, NU would hold 9.68% of the outstanding common stock, 8.54% of the outstanding preferred stock, and 9.1% of the warrants.

Companies and individuals making a tender offer must have on file at the time the tender offer commences a Schedule 14D-1.
