ADDITION TO WEEKLY CALENDAR

UPDATED STUDY ON DUAL-CLASS STOCK PRICES IS RELEASED

Stock prices of 62 companies that issued shares with unequal voting rights after a New York Stock Exchange moratorium declined 0.89% after announcement, according to an updated study released today by the Office of the Chief Economist of the Securities and Exchange Commission. Stock prices of 89 companies that have issued such shares between 1976 and May 1987 declined an average of 0.93% from the day of announcement through the following day. (Press Release 87-44)

ADMINISTRATIVE PROCEEDINGS

PROCEEDING INSTITUTED AGAINST CARL DAVID HAMILTON AND GARRAN DEE BARKER

The Commission issued Orders Instituting Proceedings, Making Findings, and Imposing Remedial Sanctions against Carl David Hamilton and Garran Dee Barker, both of Little Rock, Arkansas. Both consented to the orders without admitting or denying any violation of the securities laws. The Orders bar Hamilton and Barker from association with any broker or dealer, with a right to apply for readmission to the securities industry as supervised persons after five and three years, respectively, and in any capacity after ten and five years, respectively.

Hamilton and Barker, along with Hamilton's wife, were convicted of bank fraud, wire fraud, and bank reporting violations in the U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Arkansas, and sentenced to 40, 15, and 50 months, respectively. The scheme involved the conversion or hypothecation of funds and government securities from a national bank, at which Hamilton's wife was employed as a securities trader, for use in an index options trading strategy. Hamilton and Barker were both employed as a broker-dealer with offices in Little Rock. (Rel. 34-24676-Barker; 34-24677-Hamilton)

CIVIL PROCEEDINGS

JAMES R. BRAMBLE ENJOINED

The Atlanta Regional and Miami Branch Offices announced that on June 26 the U.S. District Court for the Southern District of Florida entered a Final Judgment of Permanent Injunction and Other Relief against James R. Bramble, enjoining him from further violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the Securities Act of 1933 and the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934, and aiding and abetting violations of the broker-dealer registration provisions of the Exchange Act. The Final Judgment ordered Bramble to disgorge monies in an amount to be determined by the Court at a later hearing. Bramble consented to the Final Judgment without admitting or denying the allegations in the Commission's complaint.

The March 20 complaint against Bramble and Arthur R. Bucci alleged violations of the registration and antifraud provisions of the securities laws in the offer and sale of securities in the form of interests in stallion/broodmare syndications, and aiding and abetting violations of the broker-dealer registration provisions. The Commission sought injunctive relief against the defendants and disgorgement by Bramble. (SEC v. James R. Bramble and Arthur R. Bucci, Case No. 87-6203-CIV-ROETTGER). (LR-11486)

AIRNADO, INC. AND MARVIN D. SKELTON ENJOINED

The Chicago Regional Office announced that on July 2 Judge Stewart A. Newblatt, U.S. District Court for the Eastern District of Michigan, Southern Division, entered Final Judgments of Permanent Injunction against Airnado, Inc. and Marvin D. Skelton. Airnado is a corporation which has its principal place of business in Flint, Michigan. Its stock is listed by the National Quotations Bureau in the "pink sheets." Skelton, until recently a resident of Fenton, Michigan, has served as chairman of the board, president, and chief operating officer of Airnado since 1979. The Final Judgments enjoin the defendants from violating the antifraud provisions of the Securities Exchange Act of 1934. Both consented to the Final Judgments without admitting or denying the allegations of the Commission's complaint.

The June 5 complaint alleges that Airnado and Skelton made and caused to be made material misstatements and omissions concerning, among other things: the financial condition of Airnado; its operations; projections of its revenues; the valuation of Airnado's common stock; and the valuation of Airnado's assets. (SEC v. Airnado, Inc. and Marvin D. Skelton, Civil Action No. 87-40163, filed June 5, 1987). (LR-11487)

INVESTMENT COMPANY ACT RELEASES

THE EQUITABLE LIFE INSURANCE AND ANNUITY COMPANY

A notice has been issued giving interested persons until August 3 to request a hearing on an application filed by The Equitable Life Assurance Society of the United States (Equitable), Separate Account A of Equitable (SA-A), Separate Account C of Equitable (SA-C), Separate Account D of Equitable (SA-D), Separate Account E of Equitable (SA-E), Separate Account J of Equitable (SA-J), and Separate Account K of Equitable (SA-K) (collectively, the Separate Accounts), and The Equitable Trust (Trust) (collectively, Applicants). In addition Equitable and SA-A seek an order for exemptions from Sections 26(a)(2)(C) and 27(c)(2) of the Act to permit the deduction of certain mortality and expense risk charges and death benefit charges under certain variable annuity contracts.
